### SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in:
  - 1.1.1. The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
  - 1.1.2. The current PHRF regulations, as administered by YRA of Long Island Sound (YRALIS) including non-spinnaker regulations for PHRF classes.
  - 1.1.3. YRA of LIS PHRF weight limitations will not apply for this event, nor will credits or penalties for crew weight be applied to the boat's base ratings.
  - 1.1.4. US SAFETY EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS (SER), Nearshore Category.
  - 1.1.5. Competitors are expected to abide by state and local health guidelines.
  - 1.1.6. The COVID-19 Pandemic brings special considerations to yacht racing. It is the responsibility of each skipper to interpret, follow and enforce governmental guidelines regarding the Pandemic on their boat.
  - 1.1.7. RRS Appendix V Sections 1 & 2.
  - 1.1.8. RUNNING LIGHTS MUST BE DISPLAYED WHILE RACING.

#### 2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1. The regatta is open to boats of PHRF classes.
- 2.2. Entry is done using the Lloyd Harbor Yacht Club's online registration at [www.lhyc.org](http://www.lhyc.org), following the link to the Race Information page. The deadline for registration is 1800 hrs on the day of the race.
- 2.3. This is a Non-Spinnaker event. No spinnakers of any variety may be used.
- 2.4. There will be two divisions, Cruising and Racing. Boats which generally do not race and use "cruising canvas" will race in the cruising division. All other boats will race in the Racing Class.
- 2.5. Boats may use whisker poles in accordance with their PHRF rating.

#### 3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 3.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the LHYC web site (<http://www.lhyc.org/>) no later than 1200 hrs. on the day when the change takes effect.

#### **4. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 4.1.** Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on LHYC web site no later than 1200 hrs. on the day of the race on which it takes effect, and be made by email.

#### **5. SCHEDULE OF RACES**

- 5.1.** Racing is scheduled for September 4, 2020.
- 5.2.** The scheduled time for the slowest rated boat is 1900 hrs.

#### **6. MARKS**

- 6.1.** Start/Finish is between Nun "2" at the entrance to Lloyd Harbor
- 6.2.** Flasher "1" off Sand City
- 6.3.** Bell "8", Target Rock

#### **7. COURSE**

- 7.1.** There will be a fixed 3.4 nm course for this event. Boats may sail clockwise or counter clockwise at their discretion, but are reminded to follow right of way rules when rounding a mark. If sailing clockwise all marks will be left to starboard, if sailing counter clockwise all marks will be left to port.

#### **8. THE START**

- 8.1.** The starting line is between Nun "2" at the entrance to Lloyd Harbor and the staff displaying the orange flag on the signal boat.
- 8.2.** This will be a pursuit-style race. Slower boats start first, faster boats start later. Each boat will start at the time noted on the attached time sheet which corresponds to their PHRF rating. Time used will be current local GPS time. See Attachment 1 for details.

#### **9. THE FINISH**

- 9.1.** The finish line will be between Nun "2" at the entrance to Lloyd Harbor and the staff displaying a blue flag on the signal boat unless the course is shortened in accordance with RRS 32.2
- 9.2.** Skippers shall record and her finishing time (GPS time), and her position in relation to nearby boats to the scorer at the first reasonable opportunity by email to [results@lhyc.org](mailto:results@lhyc.org).

#### **10. TIME LIMIT**

- 10.1.** The time limit will be 21:10. Any boat not finishing by the time limit will be scored "Did Not Finish" (DNF), which in accordance with RRS A9, shall be scored as the number of boats started plus one. This changes RRS rules 35, and A4.2.

#### **11. PENALTY SYSTEM**

- 11.1.** Penalties at the Time of the Incident  
The One-Turn Penalty as described in RRS V1 is in effect. This modifies RRS 44.1.
- 11.2.** Post-Race Penalties  
The Post-Race Penalty as defined in RRS V2 may be taken prior to the earlier of; the opening of a protest hearing, or the warning signal of her class on the next day of racing.

## 12. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 12.1. A boat initiating a protest shall immediately after finishing, notify the race committee over VHF channel 72 of its intent to lodge a protest and the identity of the boat(s) being protested until acknowledged by the race committee. This changes RRS 61.1(a).
- 12.2. Notice of Protest(s) by the RC will be made via VHF channel 72 to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 12.3. Protests shall be written on US Sailing protest forms or equivalent and shall be delivered to the Protest Committee Chairman as described as described in "Contacts", Section 23.2. Protests shall be delivered in person or via email to [protest@lhyc.org](mailto:protest@lhyc.org) no later than 2200 hours the day following the race.
- 12.4. Protest hearings will be scheduled accordingly, and posted on the event website notice board to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.

## 13. SCORING

- 13.1. PHRF Time on Distance will be worked into the start time for each vessel. First across the finish line is the winner for each division. Each class will be scored separately in each race.

## 14. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 14.1. All boats are cautioned to observe the Navigation Rules of the Road and to extend the right-of-way to commercial vessels, especially those restricted in their ability to manoeuvre, making passage through the racing area. Any boat observed to impede such traffic may be protested by the RC.
- 14.2. A boat withdrawing before the start or retiring from a race for any reason is requested to notify the fleet by VHF Channel 72 at the earliest possible opportunity.

## 15. RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 15.1. Each boat shall carry a VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on Channel 72.
- 15.2. Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## 16. PRIZES

- 16.1. First, Second and Third prizes will be awarded at the annual LHYC Awards Dinner.

## 17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 17.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 17.2. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
