Notice of Race

The Castaways Sailing, Inc. invites you to participate in the *16th Annual Castaways Cup Regatta*: A two-day multi race regatta off shore of Palm Beach dedicated to fun and friendly racing!

Rules:

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by U.S. Sailing prescriptions of the 2017-2020 Racing Rules of Sailing. [http:// www.ussailing.org/race-officials/rules/rulebook/](http://www.ussailing.org/race-officials/rules/rulebook/)

Eligibility:

The regatta is open to all sailing yachts “ready for sea” in all aspects. It is up to the Skipper to insure suitability of the Yacht for racing. Safety gear and proper preparation cannot be overstated in offshore racing.

Classes:

There will be a PHRF class, a JAM (jib and main) class, a Multi-hull class, and a “Gunkhole” Class. The boats without a US-PHRF rating will be assigned a handicap based on the manufacturers model number. PHRF and JAM class will sail under the PHRF handicap system. Multi-hulls will be handicapped using a formula of boat attributes and comparative race results from previous races. A valid PHRF rating from US-PHRF-SEF must be submitted for all mono-hulls. If you do not have a current certificate PHRF-SEF can turn around your application quickly. (See notes on PHRF ratings) Now is a good time to apply and avoid any last minute issues.



Scoring:

The rules of racing Appendix A4.1 “Low Point System” will be utilized in the Castaways Cup which is sponsored by the Castaways Sailing Club, with the exception to the scoring of the boat that finishes first in a race. The boat that finishes first will be awarded ½ point. Second place 2 points; third place, 3 points and so on. Ties will be handled In Accordance With the Rules of Racing Appendix A. There will be no “throw out” races. Each race will count for the final results.

Sail Numbers:

Entrants without sail numbers will not be allowed to protest any finish line time.

Skippers Meeting:

A skipper’s meeting is planned for Friday, October 9, 2017 at 6:30 pm. The meeting will be held using ZOOM. After registration you will be provided with the instructions for how to join the ZOOM session. Sailing Instructions will be posted on www.regattanetwork.com under the Castaways Cup Regatta event. The information will be posted no later than 9:00 p.m. Thursday, Oct 8 and an email sent to all skippers registered before that time. The purpose of the meeting is to provide any last minute instructions and answer any questions.

Last minute Race cancellation due to weather or unforeseen circumstances will be sent by e-mail to the address on file, or by the phone number on the application, by 6pm Friday evening. All communication the day of the race will be on **Channel 72**.

PHRF & Multi-hull Ratings

Participation in The Castaways Cup requires a current PHRF or assigned multihull rating. If you do not have a current rating certification, ratings will be assigned by race committee using the U.S. Sailing National handicap averages.



Saturday, October 10th:

The race on Saturday is designed to emulate our traditional long course and will be approximately 25 miles in length. The start will be a PURSUIT START beginning approximately one mile South of the Lake Worth/Palm Beach Inlet. The first start will be at 11:00 AM, using the Committee Boat G.P.S. time. All auxiliary engines must be shut off no later than 5 minutes before your starting time and remain off until your finish. Any boat seen by race committee running its engine WITHIN FIVE MINUTES OF THEIR START time will be protested and a 720 degree penalty shall be imposed on the offending boat to be completed while under sail after starting by sailing off the course as soon as possible and performing the maneuver. The Sailing instructions will provide your boat's specific start time. Boats not performing the 720 maneuver will be penalize three finishing positions.

There will be a starting line between the committee boat and a floating red ball mark. The goal is to have all boats finish the race at reasonably the same time.

In the unusual case of lack of wind, the race committee may delay the start until the breeze arrives. The race committee will announce new times over the VHF radio channel 72 to all competitors. After waiting a reasonable time for the wind to pick up the race committee may elect to move the turning mark north to shorten the course and attempt a start. In this case the race will be a normal fleet start by class and **not a pursuit start**. The starting sequence and flags will be the same as we will use for the Sunday start. Announcements will be made via VHF radio channel 72. Please note that the use of Channel 72 is a convenience and you should come close astern of the Committee Boat for official instructions and checking in.

Course: Saturday's race will go from a starting line approx. 1 mile north of Palm Beach/Lake Worth Inlet to turning mark approximately 12 to 13 nautical miles south and then returning to the start/finish line.

Finish: The finish line will be between the RC Boat and pin end buoy. There is a time limit for the race. If no boats finish before 1800 the race is abandoned. Any boat finishing in its class makes it a race for that particular class. ***Please announce your boat name, and sail numbers or assigned Yacht Number on Channel 72 as you approach the finish in order to insure proper vessel identification***. The race committee will remain on station till 1800 hours. Boats finishing after that time should note their finish time and submit the time to the race committee after arriving on shore. Announcements will be made via VHF radio Channel 72.

Sunday, October 11th:

There will be two shorter around the buoy races on Sunday.

Sunday/ Start: The first class start will be at 11:00a.m. with 5 minute rolling starts for subsequent classes. The second race will begin 20 minutes after the finish of the last boat in the first race but no later than three hours after the start of the first race. The Starting line will be approximately 1 mile south of the Palm Beach/Lakeworth Inlet Channel around ½ mile offshore. The start will be a traditional Class Start in accordance with RRS 26. Class flags and starting sequences will be announced at the Skippers Meeting October 9th. The first signal marking the beginning of the race will be a five (5) minute sequence at 1100 hours by the committee boat's G.P.S. time.

Course: A sample layout of the course will be provided in the sailing instructions. The specific course directions will be announced by the race committee starting approximately 45 minutes before the first race and repeated every 15 minutes before the start. The course for the second race will be provided by the race committee 20 minutes prior to the start of that race.

All auxiliary engines must be shut off five (5) minute prior to your class start or else you will be protested and risk a 720 degree penalty turn after the start of your class. Failing to make the 720 maneuver, you will be assessed 10 minutes on your corrected finish time. The starting time and location may be changed due to weather. Announcements will be made from the committee boat on Channel 72 the morning of the race. The intended starting order by class will be: JAM, PHRF, JAM, Multi-hull, and "Gunkhole".

Boats not in their start sequence shall remain 200 yards, or greater, clear of the start line box.

Awards:

Prizes will be awarded to the top finishers in each class for each day depending on the number of entrants: 1st for 3 entrants; 1st and 2nd for 5 entrants; 1st, 2nd and 3rd for 7 entrants; 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th for 10 or more entrants. Classes may be split by handicap if we have over 14 entrants in a class. The coveted Castaways Cup Award will be presented to the best overall combined finishes. Any ties will be broken by combining the corrected times of all races. The yacht with the best combined time will be declared the winner.

Saturday and Sunday's racing awards will be presented at the CASTAWAYS CUP Awards Virtual Banquet on Saturday, October 17th beginning at 6:00 pm via ZOOM. Have your food and drinks ready at the place you intend to participate. We will have time to share experiences of the race weekend and announce the awards. Trophies will be available for pick-up the following week.

Our trophies are, distinct and tasteful, and have received many compliments, so come and give it a go!

In the event of breach of conduct, sportsmanship, destruction of property, or failure to comply with the request of any race officer, committee member, or agent of the Castaways Sailing Club, Inc. the skipper/owner will be held responsible and his/her yacht shall be subject to protest and disqualification.



As a condition of participating, my crew and I acknowledge the following: That sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury associated with it. We have read 2013-2016 “The Racing Rules of Sailing Part 1, 4” Decision to Race, and hereby acknowledge and agree that we are participating in this event entirely at our own risk.

We further acknowledge and agree that neither the organizing authority, nor the race committee, nor their members, will be responsible for (a) any damage to the entered yacht or my other property, or (b) any injury to myself or my crew, including death, sustained as a result of the participation of myself, my crew, and the yacht in this event. I hereby waive any rights I may have to sue the race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) with respect to personal injury or property damage suffered by myself or my crew as a result of our participation in this event, including any claims arising as a result of the negligence of the race organizers, and hereby release the race organizers from any liability for such injury or damage to the fullest extent permitted by law. I have taken all necessary steps to ensure that myself and my crew, and the entered yacht are adequately prepared for all possible contingencies, including appropriate safety equipment as may be required by law or that a prudent seaman would consider advisable.

The undersigned, individually and for the entire yacht crew, specifically release and forever discharge the Castaways Sailing Club, Inc., its members, officers and directors and all persons connected directly or indirectly with the operation of the race from any liability for liable, slander, loss, damage, negligence, harm, injury or death suffered by any of us which may occur during or as a result of participation in the race.

I grant Castaways Sailing, Inc. or its agent the unconditional and perpetual right to publish and broadcast the names and images of the skipper, crew and yacht prior to, during and after any of the races in these series.
