

### NOTICE OF RACE

(August 31, 2020)

Jack and Jill Race Saturday, September 5, 2020 Monterey Peninsula Yacht Club, Monterey, CA

#### 1. BACKGROUND

The Jack and Jill is a double-handed buoy race that must be sailed by one man and one woman. Either person can skipper the boat at any time.

### 2. RULES

The race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

### 3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The race is open to boats owned by MPYC members.
- 3.2 Entries shall be made online through the MPYC Regatta Network portal at <a href="https://www.mpyc.org/index.php/activities/racing">https://www.mpyc.org/index.php/activities/racing</a>

#### 4. FEES

Entry fees are specified in the MPYC Regatta Network race registration portal. There are no additional fees for boats that have already paid for MPYC Specialty races.

#### 5. **BOATS**

- 5.1 The race will be sailed in the Shields and Santana 22 classes and the MPYC PHRF A and PHRF B divisions.
- 5.2 PHRF boats that are not registered in either of the PHRF divisions must have a valid PHRF rating issued by the Monterey Bay PHRF Committee.

### 6. SCHEDULE

The race will start at 13:00 hours.

# 7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The 2020 Monterey Peninsula Yacht Club Sailing Instructions will apply.

### 8. **VENUE**

- 8.1 Racing will occur in southern Monterey Bay, near Monterey, CA.
- 8.2 The starting area will be in the vicinity of G buoy.

# 9. **COURSES**

The courses are described in the 2020 MPYC Sailing Instructions and will be posted on the race committee boat

# 10. **SCORING**

Scoring of all MPYC races will be in accordance with the 2020 MPYC Sailing Instructions.

### 11. PRIZES

Depending on the number of entries, the winners of each fleet will receive appropriate prizes, and their names will be engraved on the MPYC Jack and Jill perpetual trophy.

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
