

## 1. RULES:

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), except US Sailing Prescriptions to Rules 63.2 and 63.4 will not apply.
- 1.2 Appendix V: Alternative Penalties, will <u>NOT</u> apply.
- 1.3 Oral changes to the SIs may be made on the water and announced over VHF 68.
- 1.4 Boats encountering non-racing craft shall conform to <u>USCG Navigation Rules and Regulations</u>. Be advised that no vessel has the "right-of-way" over a large ship in the deep-water channel. RRS 60.2, 63.1 and A5 are modified to add that the R/C may disqualify a yacht infringing this instruction without a hearing.[DP]
- 1.5 Per RRS 42.3(h), competitors may use an engine or other propulsion method to avoid situations in 1.4 provided they gain no significant advantage in the race.
- 1.6 RRS 55 TRASH DISPOSAL is changed to add the following sentence to the rule: 'However, discarding biodegradable bands when setting a sail is permitted.'
- 1.7 RRS 60.2, 63.1, and A5 are modified to allow the race committee to disqualify a boat without a hearing due to not having clearly visible sail numbers or for not following SD County COVID-19 requirements.
- 1.8 Sailing Instructions 1.4, 1.6, 1.7, 5.5, 7.3 and 8.1 modify the RRS.

## 2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 2.1 One race is scheduled.
- 2.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first class is 10:55 AM.

# 3. ENTRIES & CHECK-IN:

- 3.1 All eligible boats will have entered on-line at <u>www.cortezracing.com</u>, no later than **6pm** on Friday, September 11, 2020.
- 3.2 Late entries will only be accepted from CRA members. Late entrants may not check in by radio, but must provide to the R/C, in writing, the owner's name, DOB and zip code, email address, phone number, emergency contact information, names of all persons on board, boat name and type, sail number, class, and RLC rating, to complete their entry. Submission of this information to the RC represents the boat's acceptance of the liability waiver in the registration form and that they agree to be bound by The Racing Rules of Sailing and by all other rules that govern this event, including the SD County Health requirements.
- 3.3 Yachts will have completed their "Check-In" when they check-in with and are acknowledged by the R/C, while clearly displaying their sail number. Check-In will commence when announced over the radio. Visual and radio check-in (VHF 68) are acceptable. All yachts must check-in prior to one minute before the warning signal for their class. No check-in will occur after one minute before or during a starting sequence for any class.

## 4. CLASSES, CLASS FLAGS AND STARTING ORDER:

- 4.1 No class pennants will be used for this race.
- 4.2 The expected starting order is as follows:
  - 1st Start: Single Handed Non-Spin AND Single/Double Handed Spin combined
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Start: Double Handed Non-Spin
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> Start: 3 or More Spin Greater Than 50
  - 4<sup>th</sup> Start: 3 or More Spin Less Than 50
  - 5<sup>th</sup> Start: Multihull

The time between class starting sequences will be dependent upon conditions. The PRO will announce the expected warning signal of each class on VHF68.

4.3 In the absence of any class, all other class starts will be moved up accordingly. The Race Committee may combine classes dependent upon the number of boats coming to the starting area. Note the reverse starting order. It is the responsibility of a boat to start at her signaled start time.

## 5. THE START AND RACING AREAS:

- 5.1 The starting area will be in the vicinity of San Diego Channel Buoy #9.
- 5.2 The Starting Line will lie between a staff with an orange flag on the R/C vessel and SD Channel Buoy #9.
- 5.3 An inflated distance buoy may be streaming from the R/C vessel and this buoy is considered part of the R/C vessel. For purposes of RRS 31.1 (Touching A Mark), this buoy is to be considered a permanent part of the starting mark. If the Race Committee boat is damaged as a result of a boat breaking a rule, that boat shall pay for the repairs.
- 5.4 Yachts whose Class Warning Signals have not been made shall keep clear of the starting area and vessels attempting to start. [DP]
- 5.5 All classes will be started in accordance with RRS **Appendix U**, with the following modification of U3: The starting sequence shall consist of the following sound signals made at the indicated times. These signals shall be timed from their commencement and shall govern, even if visual signals are also used.

## 6. COURSE:

After starting, round North Coronado Island to Port and finish (see 7.1). Distance for handicap purposes: 30.6 N.M.

## 7. THE FINISH:

- 7.1 The finish line will be *between* SD buoys 9 and 10.
- 7.2 There will be no RC Boat on station at the finish. The skipper shall take the time when the boat crosses through the above described finish line (GPS Time) and send an e-mail to <u>sailorcookie@cox.net</u> and report:

Prudent skippers have photographic evidence of position and time at finishes.

7.3 Finishing information must be reported **within 1 hour** of a boat's finish. Failure to comply with this SI may result in a score of DNF. [DP] This modifies RRS Appendix A5.

# 8. TIME LIMIT:

- 8.1 Yachts not finished by 6:00 AM Sunday will be scored DNF. This modifies RRS 35.
- 8.2 A boat that retires from a race, or chooses not to compete after checking in, must notify the R/C. Call or text (619) 852-5010 to report retirement and provide Sail #, Boat Name, plus owner's name and telephone number. Failure to do this may result in rejection of entry from future CRA races. *We'll worry about you, and you don't want that guilt!*

## 9. SCORING:

One race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.

# 10. PROTESTS:

- 10.1 Protests shall be initiated in compliance with Rule 61.
- 10.2 Protests must be filed, in writing, no later than two hours after finishing.
- 10.3 Scanned, photographed, or e-mailed protest contents must be sent to <u>sailorcookie@cox.net</u>. USSA protest forms are downloadable <u>here</u>.
- 10.4 Protests will be scheduled for a later date. This constitutes the notice required by RRS 63.2, Time and Place of the Hearing.

# 11. PENALTIES:

RRS 44 - PENALTIES AT THE TIME OF AN INCIDENT- will NOT be changed for this race.

## 12. RESPONSIBILITIES, SAFETY & PERSONAL FLOTATION:

- 12.1 It is the sole responsibility of the skipper of each yacht to decide whether or not to start and/or continue to race.
- 12.2 After the starting sequence is complete, the R/C vessel will make every attempt to monitor VHF channel 68.
- 12.3 Not withstanding any safety requirements, the ultimate safety of a yacht and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the owner or charterer. He/she must do his/her best to ensure that the yacht is fully sound, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by an experienced crew who are physically fit to face bad weather. He/she must be satisfied as to the soundness of hull, spars, rigging, sails and all gear. He/she must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed, and that crewmembers know where it is stowed and how it is used.
- 12.4 While racing, each competitor will be required to have onboard and accessible, a "wearable" PFD. The use of PFDs by individuals and skippers is encouraged at all times. If in the opinion of the R/C conditions warrant the use of PFDs, the R/C will signal the "Y" flag accompanied by multiple rapid horn blasts, indicating RRS 40 is in affect.

# 13. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. [DP]

## 14. RACE RESULTS & PRIZES:

- 14.1 Race results will be published on the CRA web site (<u>www.cortezracing.com</u>).
- 14.2 Regatta prizes will be awarded using the listed procedure: one prize in each class of 2-4 yachts, two for 5-7 yachts, three for 8 or more, based on the number of starters in the class.
- 14.3 SD BOATWORKS is our gracious sponsor for this race and prizes will be available at their shop after final scores are posted. SD BOATWORKS is located at 2733 Shelter Island Dr, San Diego, CA 92106, (619) 592-8682.

## 15. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. The race organizers (CRA, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or an other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. As a condition of their participation in this regatta, competitors release all claims they may have against CRA and its officers, directors, members, committees and employees for damage to property, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta. Competitors shall be responsible for damage or injury caused by their breach of *The Racing Rules of Sailing* or applicable governmental rules for the avoidance of collision.
