Sailing Instructions

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in between the shop and the bathrooms. To practice social distancing, official notices will also be put on regatta networks.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except to the extent that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore shall be made from the flag pole in the middle of the main yard.
- 4.2 When flag "AP" is displayed, "I minute" is replaced with "not less than 45 minutes" in Race signal "AP". This changes race signal "AP".

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.2 Due to Covid -19, no organized social events are planned.

6. RACING AREA

6.1 The racing area will be North West of Clearwater Pass in the Gulf of Mexico or on Clearwater Harbor South East of CCSC.

7. The Course And Change Of The Next Leg Of the Course

- 7.1 SI appendix A illustrates the course, including the general configuration of the marks, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left. The course length and exact configuration will be based on sailing conditions.
- 7.2. To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position.

8. Marks

- 8.1 Marks 1 will be a big yellow cylinder.
- 8.2 Marks 2s/2p and the starting/finishing pin will be orange cylinders

9. The Start

- 9.1 Races will be started in accordance to RRS 26.
- 9.2 Class flag will be a Code Flag 'F' for IQ and Open Foil and numeral pennate #7 for U16 foil.
- 9.3 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange starting line flag flown from the signal boat on the starboard end and an orange cylinder.
- 9.4 Race committee will not hail the sail numbers of the boats that are OCS or subject to starting penalties.

10. The Finish

10.1 The finish line will be between the staff of an orange flag of the signal boat and a orange cylinder on the course left side of the finish line.

11. Time Limits

- 11.1 The time limit for the first boat in a race to sail the course and finish is forty five (45) minutes.
- 11.2 Boats failing to finish within twenty (20) minutes after the first boat in a race sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing or scored in place.

12. Protests, Scoring Reviews, Redress Requests, and Penalties.

- 12.1 Protest and scoring review forms are available at front desk of the CCSC.
- 12.2 The protest time limit is 45 minutes after the race committee signal vessel docks. The protest time limit will be posted on the official notice board as soon as practical.

13. Scoring

- 13.1 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of all her race scores.
- 13.2 When five (5) or more races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. Safety

- 14.1 Support vessels shall monitor VHF channel 63.
- 14.2 Competitors shall wear a helmet at all times while racing.
- 14.3 U19 Competitors shall wear a buoyancy aid/impact vest while racing.

15. Measurement

15.1 It is the responsibility of each competitor to ensure that their equipment conforms with the class rules of the division they are participating in.


16. Disclaimer Of Liability


17. Prizes
