SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current *World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing*.

- 1.1 Personal Flotation Devices (PFD) shall be worn by all team members, at all times while on the water except for brief periods while adjusting personal gear.
- 1.2 The 420 class No Age Limit for sailors.
- 1.3 The Optimist Championship Fleet will have no age limit. Any sailor over the legal age of the Optimist Class will be awarded separately.
- 1.4 All will follow the COVID Protocols set by the US Virgin Islands Government and SCYC.

2 ENTRIES

2.1 Competitors may enter by completing the entry form online at Regatta Network (https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/21488) or at the St. Croix Yacht Club no later than 2000 on Friday, November 20, 2020.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

3.1 Notice to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the west side of the clubhouse, facing the T-dock.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole on the east lawn. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag AP is lowered.

6 RACING AREA

6.1 The racing area will be Teague Bay

7 COURSE[S] and MARKS

7.1 All marks will be orange or yellow buoys.

7.2 Attachment A (420, Sunfish) shows the courses, course designations and the marks in order.

7.3 Attachment B (Opti Green) (Optimist Championship Fleet) (Open Bics) shows the courses, course designations and the marks in order.

8 STARTING AND FINISHING LINES; STARTING SYSTEM

8.1 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the RC signal boat and a nearby mark.

8.2 The finish line will be between a blue flag on the RC signal boat and a nearby mark.

8.3 The start will be a 3 min sequence.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 For all sailors, rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty

10 TIME LIMITS

10.1 A boat starting more than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes rule A4.

10.2 A race may be abandoned by the race committee, if the leading boat has not rounded the first mark within 10 minutes of starting, or the time for the first boat to finish exceeds 20 minutes from start. This modifies rule 32.

10.3 Boats failing to finish within 10 minutes after the first boat in their fleet finishes will be scored one (1) point more than the number of finishing boats and will be scored TLE. This changes rules 35, A4.1, A4.2, A5, and A1.

11 PROTESTS and REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

11.1 A boat intending to protest shall inform the signal boat, on the finish side, as soon as they finish.

11.2 Protests shall be delivered to the Protest Secretary at the clubhouse east room.

11.3 Protests will be heard on the East patio. ASAP.

12 SCORING/AWARDS

12.1 The Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A, will apply.

12.2 One race constitutes a series.

12.3 One, throw out will be allowed after 6 races have been completed

12.3 Top Three in each class: Sunfish, Optimist Open, Optimist Green, 420, Open Bic

13 SAFETY


13.1 All sailors are to check-in with the Race Committee each time to sail from the beach to the Course.


