SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Rules:

Race will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). In the event of conflict between the NoR and the SIs (or amendments thereto), the SIs as amended shall take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.
All boats shall comply with their Class Rules.

Notices to Competitors:

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board which is electronic and located at: <http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/15915>

Changes to Sailing Instructions:

Any changes in the sailing instructions will be posted before 0800 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 hours on the day before it will take effect.

Signals Made Ashore: No signals will be made ashore.

Rendezvous:

Competitors shall rendezvous in the vicinity of CBYRA Annapolis Area Chart mark "X" (R2).

Prior to a competitor's warning signal, competitors must check in at the "Race Committee Check-In" boat flying a large *yellow* flag stationed approximately 300 yards NW of the Race Committee Signal Boat. Please do not attempt to check in with the Signal Boat.

If necessary the Signal Boat may begin moving to the new location prior to the scheduled Warning in which case the Check In boat will remain near R2 until 0930 and then proceed to the new starting area.

Schedule of Races:

Saturday, May 26 – 0900 Check in Boat on Station
0925 Warning Signal for first start

Racing Area:

The racing area will be the Chesapeake Bay, between the mouth of the Severn River and Miles River.

Course:

Annapolis Area Chart - round mark "Q" (R "84A") to port, mark "F" (R "2A") to port, and mark "N" (R "4") to starboard (20.2 nautical miles).

Start:

Races will be started using RRS 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the starting signal.

Starting Line shall be between orange flag on the Signal Boat and Annapolis Area Chart mark "X" (R "2"), or alternative mark if the Signal Boat displays the "L" flag and moves to another location.

Recalls:

The Race Committee intends to hail the recall or sail numbers of OCS boats after the starting signal on VHF channel 71. The failure of any boat to hear the hail, the timeliness of the hail of OCS boats, failure to hail any boats, and the order of the boats in the hail shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 41 and 62.1.

Any boat not starting properly after an Individual recall will receive a 30 minute penalty plus the time the boat was OCS prior to the start.

Finish:

Unless the course is shortened, the finishing line will be between an orange flag on the Signal Boat and CBYRA Miles River and Eastern Bay Area Mark "H" (RN8). If necessary, the course will be shortened at a rounding mark in accordance with RRS 32.

Penalties:

For one-design classes only, RRS 44.1 is changed so that when a rule of Part 2 is broken outside the zone at a mark, and there is no injury or damage, and no significant advantage is gained, the Two-Turn Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1.

Time Limit:

There is no Time Limit. Any boat still racing after 1700 shall report their finish time via contact noted in Safety below. In addition a representative of the boat shall report time to the race committee room at the west end of the club house, just past the bar. If other than GPS time was used the time piece used shall be brought to the RC office.

Protests and Requests for Redress:

Boats intending to protest for an incident in the racing area shall inform the Race Committee when they finish. Should a vessel leave the course without finishing, an intent to protest may be made via VHF channel 71 or e-mail to onecenthine@gmail.com. The information shall include the Sail Number and/or Boat Name of the protested yacht.

Protest forms will be available at MRYC and must be filed with the Race Committee within 60 minutes of the Signal Boat docking **or within 90 minutes of the finish time of any boat taking its own time**. Notices of protest will be posted on the Official Notice Board at MRYC within 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.

Hearings will be held at MRYC beginning at 5 pm or approximately (30) minutes after being posted.

Scoring:

- **Corrected times for PHRF Classes will be calculated using PHRF Time-on-Time scoring using Random Course Handicaps. A boat's corrected time will be her elapsed time multiplied by: $(650 / (550 + \text{PHRF Rating}))$**
- **Corrected times for CRCA-ORR Classes will be calculated using ToT handicaps provided by the CRCA Class Administrator**
- **Corrected times for the CRCA-ARC Classes will be calculated using TOD handicaps provided by the CRCA Class Administrator**
- **Corrected times for the Multihull Classes will be calculated using CMA ToT handicaps**

Safety: A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible either by hail, VHF channel 71 or via e-mail to onecentrhine@gmail.com.

A boat shall not exercise right of way, cross in close proximity to, or interfere with reasonable transit of the race area by commercial ships, tugs or barges. Boats must take evasive action well in advance of a potentially dangerous situation. The US Coast Guard, ship captains, and bay pilots have been encouraged to report any incident they observe.

A boat without way may use any means of propulsion to avoid commercial traffic that is under way provided: (a) the boat does not gain an advantage; (b) use of the propulsion is the boat's only means of avoiding the commercial traffic; and (c) the boat submits a report to the race office (in writing or by e-mail by the protest filing deadline described the incident and the boat's actions.

The race committee or protest committee may protest a boat based on information received from any source. The protest time limit does not apply. A written statement from the US Coast Guard, a ship captain, or a bay pilot will be accepted as evidence without the author present. This changes RRS 60.2, 60.3, 61.3 and 63.6

Trash Disposal:

This is a Clean Race; all competitors are encouraged not to use disposable water bottles. Racers should refrain from throwing trash in the water and recycle all appropriate items. Boats observed purposefully discharging trash into the water will either be disqualified or subject to other suitable disciplinary action or both.

Radio Communication:

Competitors shall have a working VHF radio capable of communicating on VHF channels 9, 13, 16, and 71.

RC will communicate with competitors on VHF channel 71.

Boats are encouraged to make contact with commercial traffic on VHF channel 13, as required for safety.

Awards:

1st/3, 2nd/6, 3rd/9 & 4th/12 in each class. Awards will be presented at approximately 2000 at the post-race party. Rhine Trophy will be awarded to the MRYC skipper with the best corrected finish time per mile.

Beneteau America will also award prizes to the top three Beneteaus in the Cruising Class and the top three Beneteaus in the Handicap Classes.

NOTE: Awards ceremony may be earlier if scoring permits – a shotgun warning will be fired ½ hour before the ceremony

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk; see RRS 4 (Decision to Race). The organizing authority or any other party involved in the organization of the regatta will not accept any responsibility or liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

Insurance:

Each boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000.
