### General and Skipper Meeting

Please join all of your fellow racers at 0900 on Saturday March 13 for a Skipper's Meeting. Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, we will hold this meeting outside, in the parking lot in front of DPYC. We will have several announcements to make regarding the upcoming year of racing at DPYC, and we will answer any questions that may not have been covered in this Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions.

### 1. Rules

1.1 This series of races will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021 - 2024, PHRF of Southern California Class Rules, US Coast Guard and the US Safety Equipment Requirements (USSER) for Nearshore racing. Modifications and exceptions to those rules will be set forth in the Sailing Instructions.

1.2 Face masks will be required of all crew members at the start, finish, and any other time crew is in close proximity. We will rely on skippers' good judgment, and we ask your cooperation.

### 2. Eligibility

2.1 The series is open to all boats whose owners are members of an SCYA Member Yacht Club or an organization affiliated with US Sailing. All boats must have a 2021 rating certificate listed in the [Current Fleet List at phrfsocal.org](#). The certificate must be available on phrfsocal.org no later than 1800 hours the day before the first race in which a competitor is registered. We will

allow a two-race grace period, during which the DPYC Race Committee will assign a temporary handicap at its sole discretion, which shall not be subject to review or redress.

### 3. Fleets and Classes

3.1 There will be three fleets for racing; the “PHRF Fleet”, the “Non-Spinnaker Fleet” (or “NonSpin Fleet”), and the “ORCA Fleet”.

3.2 PHRF boats must have a spinnaker.

3.3 ORCA boats must be multihull.

3.4 There will be four classes (A - D) in the PHRF Fleet. There will be two classes (A-B) in the Non-Spin Fleet, and an overlapping Double-Handed class. The ORCA fleet will not be divided into classes. Spring Series class assignments will be posted online by 18:00 March 12.

### 4. Sail Restrictions

4.1 Only one headsail may be used at a time.

4.2 Spinnaker offsets will not be used in the Non-Spin Fleet.

### 5. Entry and Fees

5.1 Entry forms and fees must be completed online. Go to [www.regattanetwork.com](http://www.regattanetwork.com) and click on the Calendar menu item at the left, select All Events, then filter by state.

## 6. Schedule

6.1 Twelve races are scheduled (Ten for Non-Spin and ORCA classes):

Non-Spin and ORCA classes will not compete in Spring #6 or Fall #4. Fall Series #3 to #5 constitute the Doheny Series.

6.2 First Warning for all series races will be 11:55.

6.3 All race courses will be called by the Race Committee; random leg races from Race Chart ver. 8.0, and buoy races from Dana Point W/L Race Charts ver. 3.0, Chart 'A'.

6.4 The Start/Finish Line for random leg races is shown on chart ver. 8.0, and further described in the Sailing Instructions.

6.5 The Start/Finish Line for buoy races shall be as determined by the Race Committee between Mark S/F and C Mark on Racing Chart ver. 8.0.

## 7. Scoring

7.1 The overall series will be split into two halves; the Spring Mini-Series and the Fall MiniSeries. Three races are required to be completed to constitute each mini-series. RRS A2 and A9 will apply to each mini-series scoring, except that four or more races will be required for a boat to drop her worst score.

7.2 Upon completion of both the Spring and Fall Mini-Series, combined overall scores will be tabulated for each boat, with an award to the first place finisher in each class.

7.3 Scores for each race will be based upon the respective Area E PHRF ratings (Random Leg or Buoy) and the elapsed race times of each boat in that race. If a boat has no Area E rating, we will use the boat's Regional PHRF rating.

7.4 Races will be scored 'Time on Distance'.

## **8. Trophies**

8.1 Class trophies will be awarded for the Spring Mini-Series and the Fall Mini-Series. In addition, trophies will be awarded for overall performance in both mini-series.

8.2 For each class having 1 to 3 boats participating a 1st place trophy will be awarded. Classes with 4 to 5 boats - 1st and 2nd place trophies. Classes with more than five boats will be awarded 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies.

8.2 Spring Mini-Series trophies will be presented on June 12th, and Fall Mini-Series trophies will be presented on October 16th. The Overall series perpetual trophies will also be presented on October 16th.

## **9. Disclaimer of Liability**

9.1 Competitors participate in series entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority (DPYC) will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, or after any racing activity.
