


SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Rules

- 1.1. This event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2. RRS 40.1 applies while racing

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to these sailing instructions will be posted before 1145 on the day it will take effect, except any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to Competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board in the northeast window of the clubhouse upper level and will be posted online at the Regatta Network event site which can be found at www.scyc.org/race.
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee may monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 68.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

4.1 Dates of Racing for all classes:

April 17th, 2021 Three Races, Two Races for Santana-22 Fleet, scheduled May 15th, 2021 Three Races, Two Races for Santana-22 Fleet, scheduled June 26th 2021 Three Races, Two Races for Santana 22 Fleet, scheduled.

4.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 1255.


5. CLASS FLAGS

Class	Class Flag	
Santa Cruz 27	Flag with Santa Cruz 27 Class symbol	
Moore 24	Flag with Moore 24 Class symbol	
Santana 22	Flag with Santana 22 Class symbol	

6. THE COURSES

6.1 The diagrams below show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order to which the marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.





Course	Mark Order
1	Start -> 1 -> Finish
2	Start -> 1 -> gate -> 1 -> Finish
3	Start -> 1-> gate -> 1 -> gate -> 1 -> Finish
4	Start -> Natural Bridges -> Finish

7. MARKS

- 7.1 Mark 1 is an orange inflatable tetrahedron to be rounded to port.
- 7.2 The Gate is two yellow inflatable tetrahedrons.
- 7.3 Mark S is a red ball.
- 7.4 Natural Bridges is a yellow ball to be rounded to port located at N 36 56.60 W 122 03.70.

8.THE START

- 8.1 The starting line is between mark S and an orange flag displayed from a staff aboard the signal vessel.
- 8.2 The race committee may hail on VHF the sail number or other identifying feature of any boat that was on the course side of the starting line at the start signal. The failure of a hail, the failure of a boat to hear a hail, or the order of the hail(s) shall not be the ground for a boat to request redress. The changes RRS 62.1(a).

9. THE FINISH

9.1 The finishing line is between mark S and an orange flag displayed from a staff aboard the signal vessel.

10. PENALTY SYSTEM

10.1 RRS rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

11. CHECKOUT

11.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

12. HEARING REQUESTS

- 12.1 For each class, the protest time limit is sixty (60) minutes after the signal vessel has arrived at her berth in Santa Cruz Harbor. The protest filing time limit will be posted on the official notice board.
- 12.2 Notices will be posted no later than thirty (30) minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearing in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at the regatta shed, beginning at the time posted.

13. SCORING

- 13.1 A boats series score is the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.1.
- 13.2 RRS A5.3 applies.
