



NOTICE OF RACE

The notation '[NP]' in a rule meaning that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

The Northern Ohio Leukemia Lymphoma Society and Cleveland Yachting Club is the Organizing Authority (OA) for this regatta and Vermillion Boat Club is the Host Club and will provide race management.

1. Rules

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). Competitors are restricted from displaying advertisements for businesses or products competing with those of the primary and support sponsors of the event as determined by the OA.

The US Sailing prescription to RRS 63.2 will not apply.

[NP] It is each skipper's responsibility to ensure they and their crew adhere to all state and county health regulations.

2. Sailing Instructions

The sailing instructions will be available no later than 19:00 on 7/23/21 at the event registration web site and on-site at the registration desk.

3. Communication

The online official notice board is located at the VBC Club House.

The RC may transmit via VHF radio information concerning safety, in addition to hailing OCS boats, and general information to assist in the management of the event.

From the time a boat leaves the dock until she has finished the last race of the day, returned to shore, or, has been instructed to return to shore by the Race Committee, except in an emergency, a boat shall

not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. Eligibility and Entry

We are encouraging people to aim to have at least 3 junior sailors (18 and under) aboard, or an average age under 30.

The regatta is open to all members of US SAILING, other National Governing Body, members of recognized yacht clubs, or members of recognized sailing associations.

One Design: Races will be offered for the T-10 Class.

5. Fees

Classes shall meet eligibility requirements no later than July 25th, 2021.

6. Advertising

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

7. Schedule

8. Venue

The course will be set using the fixed mark course of Vermillion Boat Club in conjunction with drop marks, at the discretion of the OA and race committee.

9. Courses

The courses to be sailed will be windward leeward or another configuration at the discretion of the PRO.

10. Penalties

RRS Appendix V shall apply which states:

Penalties at the time of the incident: According to Appendix V; the first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: "A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 while racing. However, when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty."

Penalties within three (3) boat lengths of Mark 1 or on the leg from Mark 1 to Mark 1a may be delayed and taken as soon as possible on the downwind leg. This changes RRS 44.2 and V1

Penalties after the race: After a race, a boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 while racing may take a Post-Race Penalty for that incident. The penalty shall be a 20% Scoring Penalty, calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c). However, rules 44.1(a) and (b) apply and the penalty shall not be taken after a protest hearing involving the incident has begun. A boat takes a Post-Race Penalty by informing the race committee in writing and identifying the race number and when and where the incident occurred.

11. Scoring

The Low-Point Scoring System, RRS Appendix A4 will apply, except that each boat's total score will be the sum of her scores for all races. If five (5) or more races have been completed, a boat's final series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score (one throw-out). This changes RRS A2. One race will constitute a series. This changes RRS Appendix A.

One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

12. Guest Dockage and Launching

Yachts arriving by water will be given complimentary guest dockage, more details to come in NOR amendment.

13. Risk

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

14. Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$100,000 per incident or the equivalent.

15. Prizes

Top fundraising boats will be recognized.
Prizes will be awarded for Top 3 finishers.
