

# NOTICE OF RACE

## DANA WEST YACHT CLUB

### CREW<sup>2</sup> - DOUBLE-HANDED SERIES

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be sailed on the Pacific Ocean in the vicinity of Dana West Yacht Club and by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of the US national authority will apply.
- 1.3 Rule(s) 44.1 and 44.2 are changed. The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.4 The crew is limited to two individuals.
- 1.5 Spinnakers, gennakers, bloopers, double headsail or other free-flying headsails are not allowed. Mizzen staysails may not be used.

#### 2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

#### 3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all yachts whose owners or chartering skippers are members of yacht clubs affiliated with SCYA or a club affiliated with US Sailing.
- 3.2 Eligible boats shall enter by completing and submitting the DWYC entry form on Regatta Network [www.regattanetwork.com](http://www.regattanetwork.com) under Dana West Yacht Club (DWYC). A copy of the PHRF rating certificate may be submitted with the entry. If no PHRF rating certificate is supplied, a rating will be assigned at the sole discretion of the DWYC Race Committee.
- 3.4 Entries will be accepted until 0900 Saturday, May 8, 2021.

#### 4 FEES

- 4.1 There is a \$30.00 entry fee, for the race series (3 days)

#### 5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 The number of races scheduled for each day depends upon the weather, but the goal will be two races.
- 5.2 There will be a skipper's meeting at DWYC on the May 8, 2021 at 0930.
- 5.3 The first warning signal will be made at 11:55 on race day.

5.4 The class assignments and ratings will be announced at the Skippers' Meeting on May 8, 2021. Any subsequent changes will be available on the Regatta Network page, and posted by the DWYC entrance window and race board on the ocean side of the fireplace.

## 6. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

6.1 The sailing instructions will be available at the Skippers' Meeting. SI's will be posted on webpage at Regatta Network prior to May 8, 2021.

## 7. **THE RACE COURSES**

7.1 The courses to be sailed will be selected from the Dana Point Race Chart v.07.1, (available at <http://dwyc.org/dwyc-race-chart/>) and the selected course number will be displayed from the committee boat on a white board.

## 8 **PENALTY SYSTEM**

8.1 Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, are required.

## 9. **SCORING**

9.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply with modifications detailed in the Sailing Instructions. Handicaps will include the non-spinnaker offset.

## 10 **BERTHING**

Visiting yachts that require guest slips should contact the dockmaster at DWYC by calling 949-661-1185.

## 11 **RADIO COMMUNICATION**

11.1 A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. **Except in the case of an emergency Ch 68.**

## 12 **PRIZES**

12.1 Overall Daily Trophies will be emailed at the end of day, and Overall Series Trophies will be after the last race on August 15 at or about 1600 at the DWYC Clubhouse.

#### **The following policies of Dana West Yacht Club is in effect on the club grounds.**

We strongly encourage all participants to participate in these measures to minimize the current public health concerns.

- Face coverings must be worn at all times when both inside and around the clubhouse, unless you are seated at a table and consuming food and beverages.
- No land-based social event or gathering associated with the regatta will be scheduled.
- Maintain physical distancing of at least 6 feet at all times from others.

#### Measures to Protect Guest Health (Mandatory)

- Each boat will be required to log all persons aboard for purposes of contact tracing during the incubation period.
- The person in charge of each boat will confirm that each person aboard has shown no signs of illness and does not live with or had contact with any person who has had signs of illness for at least 14 days. Signs of illness can include but are not limited to:
- fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.
- Face coverings will be required to be available for everyone on the boat and must be worn properly when within 6' of another person not in the same household.
- Measures to Prevent Crowds from Gathering
- When rafted together, persons transiting across boats or on someone else's boat will wear face covering when 6' of separation cannot be achieved.
- Measures to Keep People at Least Six Feet Apart.
- Limit number of persons on board based on the natural configuration of the boat to allow a 6-foot separation between non-household persons unless face coverings are worn.
- Measures to Prevent Unnecessary Contact.
- Face coverings will be utilized in interior areas where more than one person is present.

- The person in charge of the boat shall be responsible for the cleanliness and sanitation of the boat prior to allowing persons on board.
- The person in charge of the boat will be responsible for providing hand washing facilities and/or hand sanitizer effective against COVID-19 to all persons on the boat, to include requiring hand sanitizing before boarding.
- The person in charge of the boat will be responsible for providing disinfecting sprays or wipes that are effective against COVID-19 to sanitize equipment and frequently touched surfaces.
