Given the improving COVID-19 situation, the Rock Hall Yacht Club will host the 2021 Summer One-Design Regatta as our normal two-day event on Saturday June 19<sup>th</sup> and Sunday June 20th, following the Annual Down River Race on Friday. The One-Design Regatta is the cornerstone of the summer for the RHYC, so we are excited to continue the tradition, while providing a safe regatta experience for our racers and volunteers!

The Rock Hall Yacht Club is located at the confluence of Lankford Creek and the Chester River, on the Chesapeake Bay's picturesque Eastern Shore. This stretch of the beautiful Chester River is a great place to sail One-Design boats since there is a lot of open water, limited powerboat traffic, easy beach and lift launching and plenty of grass on which to park and rig. The members of RHYC welcome you and appreciate your attendance at our regatta. Be safe and have fun.

- 1.) **COVID-19 RULES:** Current state and local requirements for protection against the transmission of COVID-19 must be practiced throughout the regatta. Sailors and guests must follow club guidelines for use of the RHYC clubhouse and pool.
- 2.) **Racing Rules:** This regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing, and the respective class association rules, except as any of these rules are changed by the SIs or any appendices to the SI. This regatta is designated **Category A** in accordance with RRS Appendix J1.2(2), ISAF Regulation 20.
- 3.) Eligibility: There will be starts for any one-design class if 5 or more boats are registered (including):
  - Windmill
  - Wayfarer
  - Comet
  - DaySailer
  - Hobie
  - A Cat
  - Laser/Radial
  - Albacore
  - Chesapeake 20
  - Hampton One Design
  - Rebel
  - Open Monohull Class for the C. Doune Greene Memorial Trophy
  - If there are fewer than five boats in a class, the RC may combine starts with similar speed and size classes.
  - No-show classes will be eliminated from the starting lineup.

The RHYC Log Canoe Lounge will be open for food and beverages all day on Saturday and until 6pm on Sunday for competitors and their families. Social distancing must be practiced and masks must be worn as required by club policy.

5.) Registration and Fees: Entrants MUST pre-register online at <u>www.rockhallyachtclub.org</u> or <u>www.regattanetwork.com</u>. This online registration service is provided by US Sailing Regatta Network. No on-line registrations will be accepted after 2000 on June 18<sup>th</sup>

All registrants must check-in at the beach on Saturday morning.

The fees for this Regatta are:

Boat	Online Registration Fee
Single-handed	\$60.
Double-handed	\$80.
Triple-handed	\$100.
Junior	\$40.

Fees include two bottles of water per person per for each competitor, awards as earned, and use of the RHYC grounds, bath house and Pavilion for the weekend.

Lunches for both days can be ordered in advance for \$10.00 per person (includes tax) each.

Saturday night's dinner is \$30.00 per person (**includes tax and gratuity**), \$16.00 for kids 12 and under (**includes tax and gratuity**).

- 6.) **Sailing Instructions:** The SI will be online at <u>www.rockhallyachtclub.org</u>. **Notices and Changes** to the SIs will be announced at the online Skippers Meeting and posted at the Beach.
- 7.) **Scoring:** The Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A2 of the RRS will apply except as modified by the following: a minimum of one race must be completed to constitute a regatta.
  - A. Windmill Class: if five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her (1) one worst race score. (WCA By-Law XIII. 14.G.1)

- 8.) Awards: Trophies will be awarded for all classes, as well as the Down River Race, on Saturday afternoon as soon as scoring is complete. Trophy places per class will be determined based on numbers registered for each class one week prior to the event. The organizing authority will review the registered competitors in each class and make a determination on the final trophy order. General guidelines are as follows: 3 boats, one place awarded. 5 boats, two places awarded. 7+ boats, three places awarded.
- 9.) Facilities: Launching facilities include ramp, hoist and beach launching; a nearby public ramp also allows water access for trailered boats. The RHYC grounds are free of all overhead wires. A port-apot and handwashing station is available at the Beach, and the RHYC bathhouses are open 24 hours.
- 10.) **Camping:** There is plenty of land to camp and the RHYC bathhouses are open 24 hours. Tent camping is free, but there is a \$15 fee per night for campers/RVs requiring electrical hookup, payable in advance or onsite. All campers must pay fees and complete camping application at the Clubhouse **before** setting up for the weekend.

- 13.) **Risk:** All competitors are ultimately responsible for the inherent risks associated with sailboat racing. It is the competitor's decision to enter the regatta and to start or continue any race. Each competitor will accept full responsibility for all his/her actions during any activity related to the event. This includes on- shore activities before, during, and after the regatta.
