SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Rules

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the US Sailing Prescriptions, the Notice of Race and these Sailing Instructions.

2. Safety

Boats shall not impede the passage of a vessel which can safely navigate only within a narrow channel or fairway (see US Dept. of Commerce chart 18649 for designated narrow channels and fairways of SF Bay) or fishing or other vessel with restricted ability to maneuver. Boats identified by sail number who endanger their own safety or that of the commercial or government vessel will be subject to protest by the Race Committee (R/C) or a contestant and face possible disqualification. A protest for allegations of the above will be heard by a protest committee whether or not the requirements of RRS 61.1(a) and (b) have been fulfilled or exclusions referenced in RRS 60.2(a) have been met.

Personal safety is the responsibility of each individual while racing. While wearing a personal flotation device is not a requirement of this regatta it is encouraged.

4. Notices to Competitors and Changes to SI

Notices to competitors or changes to these Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board at the SYC clubhouse. Notices will be posted not later than 1800hrs on Friday, June 25th. Notices may also be posted on the SYC website but the official notice board will prevail.

5. Schedule and Class Flags

6. Course and Marks

The start is in the Knox area at the SYC committee boat. The finish line is in the Mare Island Strait in front of the Vallejo Yacht Club (VYC).

Start, YRA 12 (Little Harding, G"1" Fl G 4 sec) P, Finish.

7. Starting and Finishing Lines

The Starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat and an inflatable mark.

The Finish Line is the extension of a line running from the staff displaying an Orange Flag on the Vallejo Yacht Club deck through the flagstaff at the harbor entrance.

8. Time Limit

The time limit is 1800 hrs. Boats still racing after 1700 hrs will record their own finish time which must be submitted to a member of the SYC race committee no later than 1900 hrs. Boats failing to submit their finish time will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35.

9. Protests

Written protests shall be delivered to the PRO (or their representative) by 1900 hrs. Protests received will be posted on a notice board at the VYC. Hearings will be held as soon as possible.

10. Scoring

Time on Time scoring will be used.

11. Check-In & Retire

Boats are checked in by starting. A boat that retires from the race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

12. Communications

RRS 25 and 60.1(b) are modified to allow for on the water communications between the R/C and the racing boats on VHF channel 72. The R/C may hail boats that are OCS. The inability of a competitor to hear a hail for OCS or any other information shall not relieve her of her responsibility nor shall it be grounds for redress.

RRS 90.2(c) is amended to allow oral changes to the SI on the water. In the event the R/C needs to communicate oral changes it shall raise the "L" flag and attempt to hail competitors on VHF channel 72.

13. Trophies

Prizes will be awarded for each division after the race at the VYC. Winners in each division will be eligible to have their names inscribed on the Frank Mora Perpetual Trophy.

14. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. (RRS 3, Decision to Race) The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
