Waccamaw Sailing Club 47th Annual Indian Summer Regatta Notice Of Race

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of the rule may be less than disqualification, at the discretion of the protest committee.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 "Two-Turns" in the first sentence of RRS 44.1 is replaced with "One-Turn".
- 1.3 US Sailing Prescriptions to RRS 63.1 and 63.2 will not apply.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The event is open to all boats with a North American Portsmouth Yardstick rating.
- 2.2 Boats without such ratings will be considered for entry. If accepted, such boats will race one design, with a THREE (3) boat minimum class size.
- 2.3 Expected divisions are Monohull Open Portsmouth and Multihull Open Portsmouth.
- 2.4 If FIVE (5) or more boats of the same class enter, that Class may request a separate start. Such fleets must provide their own Class flag. Individual Class starts will be provided at the sole discretion of the Race Committee.
- 2.4 Boats may enter online at https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/23195 or by following the link from the WSC website. Entry and other fees, and regular and late registration dates are detailed in the Registration form. Entries close at 1000 on October 2.

3. SCHEDULE

- 3.1 Dates of racing are Saturday, October 2nd, 2021, and Sunday, October 3, 2021.
- 3.2 Up to five races are scheduled for the regatta.
- 3.3 On the last scheduled day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1300.

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS


6. COMMUNICATION

- 6.1 Before the event, notices to competitors will be posted on the event website https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/23195.
- 6.2 During the event, notices to competitors (including the NOR and SI) will be posted on the official notice board located at the lower Pavilion of WSC.
- 6.3 A Competitors' Meeting prior to the first days' racing will be held at the WSC Pavilion.

7. VENUE AND COURSES

7.1 Chart of Lake Waccamaw showing general Club location and approximate racing area:



7.2 The courses will be drop-mark windward-leeward configurations, with separate (longer) windward legs for multi-hull classes.

8 SCORING

- 8.1 The North American Portsmouth Yardstick D-PN rating will apply to all boats not racing under a one-design fleet.
- 8.2 THREE (3) or more boats of the same class will be scored One-Design (boat-for-boat) in their class.
- 8.3 ONE race is required to constitute a regatta.
- 8.4 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. ALL races will be scored. NO scores will be excluded.

9 PRIZES

- 9.1 Awards will be given based on registered boats. 1st place only for a three-boat class, two places deep for a five boat class, three places for a nine boat class, four deep for a fifteen boat class, and FIVE places awarded for a class of twenty or more.
- 9.2 Classes may elect to provide their own prizes.

10 RISK STATEMENT

10.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in an increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.
