



NOTICE OF RACE DUNEDIN CUP – SMALL BOAT REGATTA Dunedin, Florida Saturday, September 25, 2021 Notice Amended September 22, 2021

1. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

1.1. The event is organized under the overall authority of Dunedin Youth Sailing Association (DYSA)

2. RULES

- 2.1. The event shall be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024.
- 2.2. Class Rules Shall apply to each respective fleet.
- 2.3. Competitors are required to wear non-inflatable life jackets at all times while on the water.

3. ADVERTISING

- 3.1. Advertising shall conform to the current World Sailing Regulation 20.
- 3.2. Boats may be required to display bow numbers and advertising chosen if supplied by the OA.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the following 420, C420, OPTI, Day Sailor, Laser, and Sunfish.4.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the registration form, together with the required fee, to Regatta Network no later than 2000 September 23, 2021. A boat is not considered registered until all information is correctly completed on the registration, payment is made by deadline, any minor waiver of applicable.

4.3. There will be NO late registration and NO on-site registration. All boats are required to sign Checkout and Check-in sheet. Failure to Check-out and/or Check-in may result in disqualification or place points reduction.

4.4. The following restrictions on the number of boats apply: 40.

4.5. Five (5) boats will constitute a class. Classes and starts to be given at Competitors Meeting, and will

be based on numbers of fully registered boats.

5. FEES

5.1 Required entry fees are as follows:

<u>Class</u>	<u>Fee</u>
Double-handed boat	\$50
Single-handed boat	\$40.

6 REGATTA

- 6.1. One (1) race will constitute a regatta.
- 6.2. The Official Notice Board will be posted at the Pram Shed.

7 SCHEDULE

7.1 SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 25, 2021

7.1.1. Check-in 700 to 900

- 7.2. Competitors meeting: 900
- 7.3. Sign-out sheet available after Competitors Meeting
- 7.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1000
- 7.5. No warning signal will be made after 1500.
- 7.6. No maximum number of races scheduled.
- 8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
 - 8.1. The sailing instructions will be posted on Regatta Network.
 - 8.2. A copy of the Sailing Instructions will be posted to Official Notice Board at Pram Shed.
- 9. STORAGE AND PARKING
 - 9.1. In specified area, corner of Main and Broadway.
- 10 VENUE

10.1 St. Joseph Sound.

11 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be as determined by the Race Committee. The diagrams in Attachment 1 show courses. (Attachment 1 will be in separate posting)

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1 The Scoring Penalty, RRS 44.1, will apply.

13 SCORING

- 13.1 The scoring system is as follows: Low Points System Appendix A .
- 13.2 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 13.3 (a) When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When more than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the

total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. SUPPORT BOATS

14.1 Support boats may require designation. Marina and launch fees may apply.

15. PHOTOGRAPHERS AND TV RIGHT

5.1. Competitors give absolute right and permission for any photographs or video footage taken of them or their competing boat to be published in any media whatsoever; for editorial or advertising purposes, or to be used in press information.

16. PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

16.1. No participant or competitor shall use or possess, either on or off the water: 1. marijuana or any other substance if possession is illegal under state or federal law; or 2. any alcoholic beverages. B. An alleged breach of one of these regulations shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when the protest committee believes that a competitor may have breached one of these regulations, it shall follow the process described in the US Sailing Code of Conduct. If a competitor found to have breached one of the elements within the Code of Conduct, they shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practicable, removed from the regatta venue and sent home. The competitor's boat shall be disqualified from all races of the series.

17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1. Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this race participate entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The race organizers (OA, Ratings Authority, Race Committee, Protest Committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury or illness to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this race. By participating in this race, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

18. COVID PREVENTION

18.1. We encourage all participants to wear masks/buffs when on land. Masks are required to be worn at all times in the Dunedin Boat Club building. We encourage all spectators and sailors to maintain a 6ft safe social distance when possible. We also ask spectators not to gather in large groups. Additional information on COVID policy may be included in race documents closer to the event.

19. RADIO COMMUNICATION

18.1. Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

20. TROPHIES

20.1. Trophy Presentation will be same day after racing has concluded.

- 20.2. Trophies will be given as follows:
- 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} place to each fleet of 5 boats.
