



SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SI means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1 RULES

1.1 The event will be governed by the *rules* as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 During the event, notices will be posted on the official notice board on the lower level on the western wall downstairs of the Clubhouse.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Changes to the sailing instructions will be posted prior to 0930 on the day it will take effect. When flag AP is displayed ashore, changes may be posted before flag AP is removed.

3.2 Race Committee may make oral changes to the SIs on the water by hoisting signal flag 'L'

[] and advising each boat that comes within hail of the change.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located west of the clubhouse.

4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in Race Signal AP.

5 COURSES AND MARKS

5.1 The courses and characteristics of marks to be used including their order of rounding are diagrammed in Attachment A.

6 THE START

6.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an ORANGE flag on a race committee vessel and the course side of the start/finish mark.

6.2 The starting sequence of RRS 26 will be used, except that the Warning will be at 3 minutes, and the Preparatory Signal will be at 2 minutes, for an overall 3-minute sequence.

6.2 Boats that have not started 5 minutes after their starting signal will be scored DNS.

7 THE FINISH AND TIME LIMIT

7.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on a race committee vessel and the course side of the start/finish mark.

7.2 Boats still racing 15 minutes after the second boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF.

7.3 If no boat rounds the first weather gate within 15 minutes or if the second boat does not finish the course within 40 minutes, the race will be abandoned.

8 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

8.1 Hearing Request forms are available in the Regatta Room downstairs at the Clubhouse.

8.2 The protest time limit will be 60 minutes after the race committee Signal vessel docks.

9 SAFETY

9.1 A boat that retires from the racing area shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. There will be an open-access VHF radio in the Regatta Room downstairs in the Clubhouse for competitors without personal VHF equipment to use. [DP]

 Marks LL and LR will be yellow tetrahedrons.
 The start/finish mark will be a green tetrahedron.
