

Bluster on The Bay

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NOR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. Rules

1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2. Advertising

2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3. Eligibility and Entry

3.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the A-Cat (Classics and Foilers), Hobie 14, 16, 17, 18, 20, and Wave, F16, F18, Nacra 15 and Weta classes.

3.2. Eligible boats may enter online through the Regatta Network/ Hobie Division 8 website by November 19th, 2021.

3.3. Per IHCA class rule 26, all competitors must be members in good standing of their class association.

3.4. Entries after January 3rd will be accepted with a \$25 late fee.

4. Fees

4.1. Required Fees:

Doublehanded boats until 0000 on January 3, 2022: \$135 (\$160 afterward)

Singlehanded boats until 0000 on January 3, 2022: \$90 (\$115 after 1/3/22)

Please note: a portion of the entry fee will be donated to the My Sail Foundation for the promotion of youth sailing across North America.

6. Sailing Instructions

- 6.1. Sailing instructions will be available online by January 2, 2022, on the Hobie Division 8 website and Facebook page and on Regatta Network. To reduce paper waste, copies will be available onsite only by request.
- 6.2. Online sailing instructions may be changed until 1800 Thursday, January 13, without a posted amendment.

7. Venue

- 7.1. Racing will take place in the Indian River Lagoon South of the Eau Gallie Causeway.
- 7.2. The regatta venue is Ballard Park, Melbourne, (On Florida’s Space Coast).

8. Penalty System

- 8.1. For all classes, rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

9. Scoring

- 9.1. Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.2. When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her races scores.
- 9.3. When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

10. Radio Communications

- 10.1. Competitors are strongly encouraged to carry personal VHF radios to monitor race committee communications. Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data

communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

11. Prizes

11.1. Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority

12. Disclaimer of Liability

12.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

13. Insurance

13.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$100,000 per incident or the equivalent. Proof of insurance required at registration.
