# Contest Instructions

## Midwinter Predicted Log Navigation Contest

Saturday – February 12, 2022

### The Course:

Start:	Range on West jetty entrance of Alamitos Bay	100 yards stbd
CP -1	Range on Belmont Pier	200 yards stbd
CP-2	North-West corner Island Freeman	100 yards port
CP-3	FI R 2.5s 41ft 5M "2" (Queen's Gate)	75 yards port
CP-4	East end Long Beach breakwater FI G 6s 43ft 5M "1" HORN	75 yards port
CP-5	G C "3" (Anaheim Bay entrance)	25 yards port
FINISH:	Range on East jetty entrance of Alamitos Bay	200 yards stbd

### Notes & Rules:

Start Time: Start at skipper's discretion to email actual logs to John Walker no later than 1300

- 1 Official distance: 9.0 nautical miles excluding the 360 degree turn, see note 4. (Your distance will vary depending upon distance off the marks and the 360 degree turn).
- 2 This contest will permit using **ONLY** Compass and Tachometer.  
Use of the following data is **Not** permitted:
  - a. Clock time or elapsed time.
  - b. Vessel speed
  - c. Cover all instruments (GPS, Radar, Chart Plotter)
- 3 Skippers should announce: "Five minutes to start" on VHF-71 if other vessels are in the start area.
- 4 When on course between CP-3 and CP-4, skipper will execute a 360 degree turn to starboard and continue on course to CP-4. The skipper may select the place to turn and the actual turn radius. There will be a special trophy for the skipper that records the most accurate time prediction between CP-3 and CP-4.
- 5 A time out may be taken to avoid a dangerous encounter; note the elapsed time and reason on reverse side of Actual log .
- 6 For convenience, plan to finish the contest before 11:00 to avoid sail race interference.
- 7 Monitor Marine Channel 16 for safety and 71 for contest information.
