1. RULES

1.1 The event is governed by the current rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* plus any other rules the Race Committee thinks up at any time.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available at SSS

3 COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located beside the race office

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The event is open to all sailboats

4.2 Classes will be scored in PHRF, One Design or Portsmouth

4.2 Fleets of five or more will have their own start

4.3 The organizing authority reserves the right to group similar boats together to form one or more classes

4.5 Boats may register on-site January 1, 2022 starting at 1000 hrs. at the Sailing Squadron

8 VENUE

8.1 Racing will be in Sarasota Bay.

9 COURSES

9.1 The start of the races will be at Intercoastal Marker 13 or wherever the RC says.

9.2 The courses for each fleet will be signalled from the RC signal boat.

10. CLASS FLAGS

10.1 Class flags will be the class insignia on the class flag

10.2 If the standard class flag is unavailable, the RC will post the change on the signal vessel

11 SCORING

11.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.

12 RISK STATEMENT

12.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury.

12.2 Competitors voluntarily assume the risks associated with communicable diseases including but not limited to COVID-19.

13 INSURANCE

13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
