SUPPLEMENT to the STANDARD SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (Numbering corresponds to the RRS Appendix S)

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.2 The flagpole is located on the front lawn of the Sarasota Sailing Squadron.
- 4.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.3 Number of races:

Date	Maximum Races per day	Frist Warning Signal
Friday March 18	4 races scheduled	1130
Saturday March 19	4 races scheduled	1000
Sunday March 20	4 races scheduled	1000

- 5.4 Additional races may be scheduled each day at the discretion of the principal race officer.
- 5.5 On the last scheduled day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1400 hrs.

7. COURSES

7.3 The course will be LAD or T. Attachment 2 describes courses LAD and T, the order in which the marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left.

8. MARKS

8.2 If only one gate mark is set, boats shall leave the single mark to port.

10. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 10.2 The race committee may, without signal, move an automated MarkBot to change the direction up to 10 degrees or the length up to 10% of the previous length, provided that no boat is sailing to the mark.
- 10.3 To change the next leg of the course, when signaled in accordance with RRS 33, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line). This changes RRS Appendix S 10.1.

12. TIME LIMITS

12.5 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

13 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

13.5. Protest hearings are expected to be heard in person but may be changed to online. Instructions for online hearings will be provided by the protest committee.


14. SCORING

- **14.1**(a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When 5 to 10 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When greater than 10 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.


15. SAFETY

- 15.1 [DP] Boats shall check in and receive acknowledgement from the race committee prior to their first race of the day.
- 15.2 [DP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
