****Rules of Limited Use of Chappaquiddick Beach Club ****

The Edgartown Yacht Club receives special permission on a year-to-year basis to use a portion of the Chappaquiddick Beach Club (CBC) beach for the EYC Annual Regatta. This courtesy is extended for the purposes of boat storage, landing and launching for Junior sailors by visiting yacht clubs only.

It is of the utmost importance that this relationship and limited use of the CBC beach be maintained, respected and the rules abided to. These rules apply to ALL sailors, coaches, parents and chaperones:

- All use of the CBC should be done in a manner that is least disruptive to the normal day to day activity of the Club.
- Use of the facility is strictly for the storage of boats and related gear during the regatta (Wednesday-Saturday only). All boats and equipment must be off the beach no later than 5:00 p.m. on **Saturday, July 16, 2022.**
- Boats trailered to Edgartown can bring boats to the CBC beach at the designated access area(s) only.
- Access to the CBC facility is limited to the period of launching and landing boats before and after races each day.
- No boat repairs are allowed at CBC (please use the EYC Sailing Center for repairs).
- Use of the CBC facility begins at Noon on the Wednesday before racing.
- At the conclusion of the Regatta (Saturday) all gear and equipment must be removed from the CBC.
- Place boats and gear only in the designated area posted for your club.
- Do not place any items in the cabañas, other structures or on the walkways.
- Use EYC designated trash cans for all trash.
- No swimming or lounging on the beach.
- No use of showers or bathroom facilities (please use the Sailing Center's toilets).
- No pets are allowed at the CBC facility.
- Do not use CBC furniture.
- Respect the CBC Staff and management and comply with their requests.
- Temporary dockage is limited strictly to those times required to assist sailboat fleets as they arrive at and depart from the facility.
