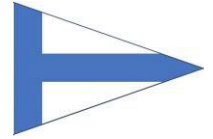

NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing including all Prescriptions.

1.2 Racing rule A2 will be changed to provide one discard with six completed (6) races, if fewer than six (6) races are completed there will be no discards. Racing rule A5.1 will be changed as follows: A boat starting later than four (4) minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. Racing rule 33 will be changed as follows: During the race, “gate” marks, windward marks and offset may be repositioned without signal for minor changes in course. Racing rules 35, A4, and A5 will be changed as follows: Boats still racing (and that do not subsequently retire, get disqualified, or get redress) 15 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes, will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired). RRS 44.1 will be modified so that a boat that breaks a rule of RRS part 2, may either: take a one turn penalty prescribed in RRS 44.2 or take a scoring penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.3. RRS A4, A5, and A11 will be changed as follows: Boats scored TLE will be scored points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus two points by the race committee without a hearing. These changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions.

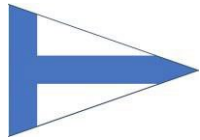
2 ADVERTISING

Advertising will conform to the World Sailing Advertising Code.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

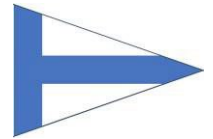
3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the MC class design and current members of the MC Sailing Association

3.2 Eligible boats must enter in advance. **NO ONSITE REGISTRATION OR ONSITE PAYMENT WILL BE ACCEPTED.** All competitors must register at regatta network calendar at www.regatta-network.com by 5PM, Thursday, June 2nd, 2022. Registration after May 28^h, 2022 will be subject to a \$25 late fee.

 11:00 AM Warning Signal, Race 1-4

 No warning signal will be made after 1630 hours.

5.3 Sunday, June 5th, 2022 10:15 AM Harbor Gun

 11:00 AM Warning Signal, Race 5-6

 Lunch and Awards following sailing

 No warning signal will be made after 1600 hours.

5.4 Because more than one race or sequence of races will be held on the same day the warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practical after a day’s prior race is completed or abandoned. After a long postponement (ten minutes or more), and/or the break, to alert boats that a race will begin soon, the ORANGE line flag will be displayed (withone sound) at least four minutes before a warning signal is displayed.

6 MEASUREMENT

All boats must meet the measurement requirements of the class scantlings.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

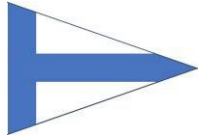
The sailing instructions will be available no later than 09:00am on June 4th, 2022.

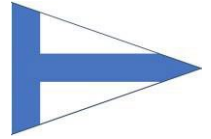

10 SCORING

10.1 RRS A2 will apply as modified in 1.2 above.

10.2 The number of scheduled races is 6 of which 1 must be completed to constitute the regatta. Should wind, weather, or other conditions make it impossible or impractical to complete all six (6) races within the publicized time, the event will be terminated, and the results based upon the completed number of races.

11 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

A boat shall be allowed to receive radio transmissions from the race committee. No other transmission or reception of radio signals is allowed while *racing*.

12 REQUIRED SAFETY EQUIPMENT

Notes: 1. Manual bailer must be a minimum of 4-quart capacity.

2. All boats must carry a towline solely dedicated to towing and/or anchoring and readily available for use at all times. Line must be at least 24' long and of sufficient strength to tow a swamped boat.

13 AWARDS

Prizes will be awarded to the skipper and crew in the top Seven (7) finishing boats, Top Master, and Top Grand Master.

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

15 INSURANCE Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of the policy limit of their homeowner's insurance policy or the equivalent thereof.
