Notice of Race Hyannis Yacht Club 2022 Race Around the Cape Hyannis Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority July 15th – 17th, 2022

The Hyannis Yacht Club (HYC) Ocean Race Class invites you to participate in the Race Around the Cape half and full. The half race finishes at the Northern entrance to the canal. The full race finishes at Hyannis. Classes are for PHRF NE (Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker divisions). Yachts may enter either event.

The notation `[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

- 1 RULES
- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing.*
- 1.2 The event will be governed by the US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirement (SER) for Coastal Racing, <u>https://www.ussailing.org/competition/offshore/safety-information/ser-world-sailing-special-regulations/</u> dated January 1, 2020, as amended by Appendix One.
- 1.3 RRS 40.1 applies at all times.
- 1.4 RRS 44.1 is changed as follows: A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or Rule 31 in an incident while racing.
- 1.5 All vessels are required to have properly registered active AIS transmit and receive running at all times during the race.
- 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be posted to the regatta registration website no later than one week prior to the first warning signal of this race and will be available on the official Notice Board at Hyannis Yacht Club.
- 3 COMMUNICATION
- 3.1 The official notice board is located at the southwest corner of the

HYC patio.

- **3.2** All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channels 9, 13, 16, 68 and 69.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.
- 3.4 While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY
- 4.1 All skippers shall be current members of US Sailing.
- 4.2 The event is open to all mono hull boats 28 feet (LOA) or longer with auxiliary power and current valid PHRF New England certificate. With a rating of 165 or less.
- 4.3 A boat with a PHRF rating greater than 165 can apply to the OA, <u>*cjbrownrealtor@gmail.com*</u>, for a waiver. If a waiver is granted the boat shall sail with a rating of 165.
- 4.4 Boats wishing to apply for a waiver to the rating limit must do so by emailing <u>cjbrownrealtor@gmail.com</u>, a minimum of 2 weeks prior to registration close. Skippers should be prepared to provide documentation of past racing performance.
- 4.6 Classes are defined as follows:

Class A - Spinnaker	PHRF	Below 165
Class B - Non-Spinnaker	PHRF	Below 165

4.7 All skippers are required to attend one of the two skipper's meetings. These meetings will be held virtually and in person at Hyannis Yacht Club.

4.8 Boats may enter the event by registering online at Regatta Network.

- 4.9 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.10 Late entries will not be accepted under any conditions.

6 SAFETY

6.1 It shall be the sole and inescapable responsibility of the owner and master of each boat to declare that she is seaworthy in hull, rig and gear and that she is properly equipped and competently manned and sailed.

A Finish Declaration and Participant Waiver will be provided to each entrant. The Race Committee must receive the Participant Waiver signed by all crew members by 1500 hrs on July 14, 2022.

7 ADVERTISING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

- 7.1 By participating in this race or series, each competitor grants to the organizing authority and its members the right in perpetuity to make, use and show and to license any other person to so make, show and use, from time to time at their discretion, any photographs, sound recordings, motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television or other productions of them or their property made during the period of the series.
