NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority - Davis Island Youth Sailing Foundation, Tampa, Florida

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official. Failure to comply may be considered misconduct. - Reasonable actions by event officials to implement COVID-19 guidance, protocols, or legislation, even if they later prove to have been unnecessary, are not improper actions or omissions.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 Competitors and coaches shall enter by completing the on-line entry form on the event website <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/24468> and paying the required fees. Entries must be received no later than 1800, May 13.
- 2.2 Competitors under 18 years of age shall complete a parent (or guardian) consent and declaration form during online registration.
- 2.3 The regatta is open to any monohull boats with center or dagger board. Anticipated Classes: Optimist (Green, White/Blue/Red), ILCA 7, ILCA 6, ILCA 4, and C420.

3 FEES

- 3.1 Optimist or ILCA \$107.50 (\$100 plus 7.5% sales tax)
- 3.2 C420 \$150.50 (\$140 plus 7.5% sales tax)
- 3.3 The entry fee includes a regatta t-shirt for skipper and all crew; bag lunch on the water both days; coffee, juice, and donuts for competitors both Saturday and Sunday; and awards as described herein.
- 3.4 LATE FEE – Entries received after midnight May 2 will be charged an additional \$15 and are not guaranteed to receive t-shirts.

5 VENUE

All classes will race in Hillsborough Bay South of DIYC.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available on the event website prior to May 10. Other documents governing the event will be published with the sailing instructions.

7 SCORING

- 7.1 Many races are scheduled. One race for a class or fleet must be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 7.2 When 5 of more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 7.3 RRS 90.3(e) will apply, such that there shall be no changes to race or series scores resulting from action, including correction of errors, initiated more than 24 hours after the protest time limit for the last race of the event.

8 SUPPORT VESSELS AND PERSONNEL

- 8.1 All support vessels shall be registered with the organizing authority and will be required to comply with event support vessel requests.
- 8.2 Except when assisting the Optimist Green Fleet competitors, support vessels with team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first fleet to start until all boats have finished or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall, or abandonment.
- 8.3 All outboard-equipped support vessels shall be equipped with a functioning engine safety cut-out switch (kill switch) which shall remain attached to the support person (operator) at all times when the engine is on. Support vessels shall check-in with the RC Signal vessel before the first race of each day to demonstrate compliance. Failure to comply may be considered misconduct and result in expulsion from the event.

9 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 boats in each fleet. Participation awards will be given to all Optimist Green Fleet competitors.

10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. Neither the organizing authority nor race committee will accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, illness, disease, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

11 MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

By participating in this regatta, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority, and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped, or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
