

COMMODORE JUBY WYNNE MEMORIAL ONE-DESIGN REGATTA Southern Yacht Club May 28-29, 2022 New Orleans, La.

NOTICE OF RACE

Southern Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority (OA). This is an invitational event, and the OA reserves the right to accept or reject the entry of any yacht and will have the authority to interpret the conditions governing the event. This regatta will also serve as the following:

GYA Flying Scot Championship & Commissioner General's Trophy MC Scow Gulf Coast Championship Rhodes 19 Gulf Coast Regional Championship Lightning Southern District Championship Commodore's Cup

1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS). When there is a conflict between rules, this Notice of Race shall govern. <u>This alters RRS 63.7</u>.
- 1.2 US Sailing Appendix V will apply.
- 1.3 RRS 63.7 and A2.1 are altered herein. Other documents may also alter other rules.
- 1.4 There will be no equipment measurement or crew weigh-in at registration.

2 YACHT ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to the following one-design classes and any other accepted class:
 - Keelboat: J/80, J/27, J/30, J/22, Melges 24, Rhodes 19, Viper 640, VX One
 - Centerboard: Flying Scot, Lightning, MC Scow
 - Dinghy: Club 420, Laser, Laser Radial, Sunfish, Optimist and Optimist Green Fleet
- 2.2 Three boats are required to qualify as a class. Fewer than three boats may be accepted at the OA's discretion.

3 COMPETITOR ELIGIBILITY & RESPONSIBILITIES

The term "Skipper" as used herein means the person, whether or not the owner of the yacht, who is so designated on the entry form and who is the Person in Charge of the yacht during the race. The Skipper is responsible for the yacht, its handling and safety, the conduct of the crew before, during and after the race, and compliance with the rules.

4 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices will be posted on the official notice board at SYC. Notices may also be posted on-line using the regatta's website and communicated electronically to competitors via email or text message.

5 ENTRY & FEES

- 5.1 Eligible yachts may be entered by completing the online entry form (linked below), including payment of all fees. <u>http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/24551</u>
- 5.2 Entry Fees will be as follows. Note that after May 20, 2022 an additional Late Fee will apply.

7 COURSES & SCORING

- 7.1 There will be several separate race courses to group similar boats together. Preferred courses will be multi-round, windward-leeward, but this remains at the discretion of each PRO.
- 7.2 Except as listed below, five races are scheduled for each class and a boat's series score will be the total of all her race scores; no scores will be excluded. <u>This alters RRS A2.1.</u>
- 7.2.1 For Laser, Laser Radial, Club 420, Sunfish, and Nacra 15 classes, up to seven races may be sailed. When more than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 7.2.2 For Optimist and Optimist Green Fleet classes, up to ten races may be sailed. When more than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 7.3 One race will constitute a series, except that the Rhodes 19 Gulf Coast Regional Championship requires a minimum of three completed races.

8 PRIZES

Trophies will be presented to the top three finishers in each qualifying class. First place only will be awarded in classes with fewer than five boats entered. Late entries may not be counted toward class prize qualification.

Juby Wynne One Design Regatta will serve as the **GYA Flying Scot Championship**, and the **Commissioner General's Trophy** will be awarded to the winner of the Flying Scot class.

Various class championship trophies will also be awarded, including:

- Rhodes 19 Gulf Coast Regional Championship
- MC Scow Gulf Coast Championship
- Lightning Southern District Championship

9 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. <u>See RRS 3 Decision to Race</u>. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal exposure, illness, injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

10 INSURANCE

Each participating yacht shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance sufficient to cover liability for loss, damage, personal injury or death.

11 MISCONDUCT

In the event of gross misconduct by a competitor or their guests, before, during or after the regatta, a yacht may be subject to disqualification and other disciplinary action.
