

Kelowna Yacht Club (KYC) Open Racing 2022 Dick Duggan's Series May through August 2022

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SIs)

Amended 30May2022

1.0 RULES

1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (2021-2024),* the prescriptions of Sail Canada, the Notice of Race (NoR) for these series, and the Sailing Instructions for this series.

2.0 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted no later than one (1) hour before racing on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 8:00 PM on the day before it will take effect.

3.0 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 The KYC Flag pole and on-dock bulletin board, located south of the ramp to the main dock. NoR and SIs updates will also be posted at <u>https://kelownayachtclub.com/racing/open-racing/</u>. An alternate bulletin board will be kept updated on the Regatta Network page. A link to this page will be provided before April 1, 2022.
- 3.2 The race office is located at KYC Statistician's Office, telephone 250-490-5689, email petty.john.douglas@gmail.com.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 72.
- 3.4 The following communications may be made by the race committee on VHF channel 72.
 - Changes to course
 - Requirement for individuals on a boat to wear life jackets

4.0 CODE OF CONDUCT

4.1 [Discretionary Penalty - DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

5.0 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the KYC Flagpole.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

6.0 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 See SI Addendum A for Schedule table
- 6.2 The scheduled time of the first warning signal for all races is 6:00 PM.
- 6.3 No rolling start will commence after 7:00 PM.
- 6.4 Races will be started as described in RRS 26, except that an Attention signal, consisting of a series of sounds, may be made one minute before the first warning signal.

7.0 CLASS FLAGS

- 7.1 Races will comprise of three PHRF fleets. Fleets are defined in the NoR.
- 7.2 Fleet 1 Class flag is the Numeral pennant 1.
- 7.3 S525 Class flag is the Numeral pennant 2.
- 7.4 Fleet 3 Class flag is the Numeral pennant 3.

8.0 RACING AREA

- 8.1 SI Addendum B shows the location of the racing area.
- 8.2 The Finish line is to be considered an obstruction and shall not be crossed unless a boat is finishing or within her start sequence.

9.0 COURSES

- 9.1 The table in SI Addendum C shows the courses, including the order in which marks and gates are to be passed. All marks to be left to port. X denotes a gate between X mark and a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel when X is displayed mid course. This gate must be crossed in the direction travelled from the previous mark.
- 9.2 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal vessel will display the course to be raced.
- 9.3 The course for Fleet 1 and S525 will be displayed at the stern of the RC boat as a series of letters.
- 9.4 The course for Fleet 3 will be displayed at the stern of the RC boat as a number. The boat must use Addendum C to determine her course.
- 9.5 The course for Fleet 3 may differ from the course of the other fleets.

10.0 MARKS

- 10.1The following marks can be rounding marks: A, B, C, D, and E.
- 10.2 X is a gate defined as a line between X mark and a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel.

11.0 THE START

- 11.1The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel and mark X.
- 11.2There will be a rolling start. Fleet 3 will start first followed by Fleet 1 and then Fleet 2.
- 11.3A boat must keep clear of the start area by 50 meters unless the warning signal for her start sequence has been made.

12.0 THE FINISH

- 12.1The finishing line is between the blue flag mounted to the signal boat and the course side of Mark Y.
- 12.2If the race committee is absent when a boat finishes, she shall report her finishing time, and her position in relation to nearby boats, to the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

13.0 TIME LIMITS

13.1The Mark 1 Time Limit, and the Race Time Limit (see RRS 35) are shown in the table below.

Mark 1 Time Limit(first boat only)	Race Time Limit

- 13.2If no boat within a fleet has passed the first mark within the Mark 1 Time Limit, the race will be abandoned for that fleet.
- 13.3If any boat within a fleet has passed the first mark within the Mark 1 Time Limit, then this time limit has been met for all boats within that fleet.

14.0 HEARING REQUESTS

- 14.1The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day.
- 14.2Hearing request forms are available from the race office at Statisticians Office.
- 14.3Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in a protest room ,as determined by RO, beginning at the time posted.
- 14.4RRS 62.2(a) and 66.2(a) do not apply.

15.0 SCORING

- 15.1One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 15.2See NoR for details on scoring system.
- 15.3Rule A5.3 applies.

16.0 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1All Transport Canada safety regulations as they apply.
- 16.2A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 16.3A boat may be requested to assist another vessel as directed by the Race Officer of the Day.

17.0 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 17.1A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, Notice of Race, and Sailing Instructions.
- 17.2[DP] When instructed by a race official on the water, a boat shall proceed to a designated area for inspection.

18.0 TRASH, SEWAGE OR GREY WATER DISPOSAL

- 18.1Trash must be taken ashore and disposed of in the provided containers. It is not permissible for a boat to discharge any trash into the lake.
- 18.2Use pump-out services for your boat sewage and grey water. Be sure to also dispose of you and your pet's waste responsibly.

19.0 PRIZES

19.1Prizes will be awarded for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} for each fleet for each series and for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} of combined series overall.

20.0 RISK STATEMENT

20.1RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in an increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

21.0 INSURANCE


21.1Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.
