## SAILING INSTRUCTIONS<sub>v1</sub>

---

### 1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing.

1.2 Sailing Instructions may be changed verbally on the water

### 2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board(s) located in the basement of the clubhouse.

### 3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions may be modified verbally on the water

### 4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the club's flagpole.

4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in race signal AP.

4.3 When flag Y is displayed ashore, RRS 40 applies at all times while afloat. This changes the Part 4 preamble.

5 **SCHEDULE** -This may differ from the dates or times on the club calendar in the handbook. Always check the website for the correct dates/times.

**5.1** When more than one race will be held on the same day, the warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable

## **6 CLASS'S**

**6.1** Recognized classes will be **Sunfish**

## **7 RACING AREA**

Manasquan River between Route 35 Bridge and Point Pleasant Canal.

## **8 THE COURSES**

**8.1** Courses will be portable marks, wind-leeward or triangle, with or without a leeward gate. board clearly displayed on the committee boat, and/or by verbally hailing to each competitor

**8.2** Marker board will show type (WL=windward-leeward, T=triangle), number of legs (1,2 3, etc) and direction of rounding (P=port or S=starboard) plus any exceptional information such as G=leeward gates or FAC=finish at club (may be accompanied by hailing).

## **9 MARKS**

**9.1** Portable marks will be drop marks.

**9.2** New marks, will be a different color inflatable.

**9.3** The starting mark will be an inflatable.

**9.4** The finishing mark on portable mark courses will be an inflatable.

## **10 THE START**

**10.1** Races will be started by using appendix U

**10.2** The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and the starting mark.

**10.3** A boat starting later than four (4) minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS . This changes RRS A4.1.

## **11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE**

**11.1** To change the next leg of the course, see RRS 33.

**11.2** RRS 33 (a)(2) is changed to read a green rectangular flag or board for a change to starboard or a red rectangular flag or board for a change to port.

## **12 THE FINISH**

The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a committee boat and the finishing mark, or between the finishing mark and an orange flag displayed on the club dock.

## **13 TIME LIMITS**

**13.1** Time limits are as follows: Race Time limit (30) minutes; First mark time limit (10) minutes. If no boat has passed the first mark within the first mark time limit the race will be abandoned.

**13.2** Boats failing to finish within ten minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes RRS 35 and A4.1.

## **14. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS**

**14.1** Protest hearings will be held at MRYC's clubhouse at the convenience of the protest committee no later than ten (10) days following the applicable race.



**15 SCORING**

**15.1** The Low Point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will apply as changed in the NOR RRS

**15.2** No race shall be declared official unless three or more entrants come to the starting line.

**16 SAFETY REGULATIONS**

**16.1** Boats are required to have on board at all times while racing the following safety equipment:

	<u>Paddle</u>	<u>Pump or Bailer</u>	<u>Anchor</u>	<u>Anchor/Tow Line</u>	<u>PFD</u>
Sunfish	No	No	No	Yes	Yes

**Notes:** 1. All boats must carry a towline solely dedicated to towing and/or anchoring and readily available for use at all times. Line must be at least 24' long and of sufficient strength to tow a swamped boat.

**17 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT**

Substitution of skippers, or changes of sail numbers, will not be allowed without prior written approval of the race committee.

**18 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.

**19 INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of the policy limit of their homeowner's insurance policy per event or the equivalent thereof.
