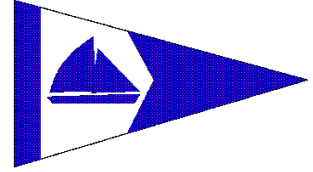


# Bugay Single Handed Race

## Notice of Race (NoR)

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

### 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available after 10:00 AM on September 1<sup>st</sup> at <https://www.sailsbsc.org/events/bugay-single-handed-race>

### 3 COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at <https://www.sailsbsc.org/events/bugay-single-handed-race> or a link from there.
- 3.2 [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channel 72.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.

### 4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 All PHRF yachts are eligible. Random Leg PHRF handicaps will be used. PHRF handicap ratings will be applied per PHRF certificate or by listing if not certified. A valid rating certificate must be presented, or on file with SBSC.
- 4.2 Entrants must be current members in good standing in their respective class, and members of a recognized sailing club or yacht club recognized by SCYA or other regional yachting association (Sailing Anarchy is not acceptable).
- 4.3 Boats may enter the event by registering online at <https://www.sailsbsc.org/events/bugay-single-handed-race> by 10:00 AM on September 11<sup>th</sup>.
- 4.4 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

### 5 SAFETY

- 5.1 Any boat that abandons, retires, or in any way does not finish the race shall notify the Race Committee in person, by radio on VHF channel 72.
- 5.2 It is strongly recommended that all participants wear a life jacket at all times during the race. Entrants should note that single-handed sailing may be hazardous. All competitors are urged to assess sailing conditions with prudent seamanship.
- 5.3 All boats are advised to meet US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements for Nearshore racing. (US SER 2019.0): [https://www.ussailing.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/01/US\\_SER\\_2019.0\\_Categories.pdf](https://www.ussailing.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/01/US_SER_2019.0_Categories.pdf)

5.4 This race is a single-handed race and therefore it is highly recommended that the single-handed entry have experience in all aspects of seamanship.

## **6 FEES**

6.1 The entry fee is \$20.

## **7 CREW LIMITATIONS**

7.1 The crew size for a boat is limited to a single person.

## **8 SCHEDULE**

8.1 Registration: Online until 10:00 on September 11<sup>th</sup>

8.2 Dates of racing: Sunday September 11<sup>th</sup>

8.3 Number of races: 1

## **9 VENUE**

9.1 Skipper's meeting and awards will be held in the SBSC facility, located near the intersection of Shoreline Dr and Harbor Way.

9.2 Races will be held in the area encompassing the Santa Barbara Harbor and Oil Platform C.

## **10 COURSES**

10.1 The course will be to sail around Oil Platform C, as detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

## **11 RISK STATEMENT**

11.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

## **12 PRIZES**

12.1 The Jack Bugay Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the boat with the lowest overall corrected time.
