NOTICE OF RACE
Cruising Class

OBJECTIVE

Provide the women of the Tampa Bay area an opportunity to compete against each other with all female crew and socialize after the racing. Provide an opportunity for less-experienced women to compete and gain the confidence with a coach on board. Allow other participants (i.e. those of the male persuasion) to coach some of our women sailors.

In the spirit of promoting current and future inclusion in the sport of sailing, the event organizers would like to encourage Dore Drake Regatta participants to donate to the Davis Island Yacht Club/Davis Island Youth Sailing Foundation partnership initiative, the pilot "Sailor-Ship" scholarship program which promotes sailing for 9-18 year olds in Tampa, FL. The Sailor-Ship is a need based program with the goal of raising \$3000 to fund two sailors, one in Green Fleet and one high school aged. In either case, please include the word "Sailor-Ship" in the memo line. Donating is voluntary and not a requirement of the competition.

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* except that the US Sailing Prescriptions to RRS 63.1 and 63.2 will not apply.

2 ELIGIBILITY

2.1 All keelboats, with valid WFPHRF certificates, with all-women crews are eligible.

2.2 Division to race is: Cruising (Dinghies and Non-cruising PHRF boats have a separate Notice of Race.)

3 ENTRY

3.1 Boats shall enter online at <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/25159> or by following the link from the DIYC Calendar page.

3.2 No entries will be accepted after 6:00pm on October 14th.

PHRF Boats: \$48.38 (\$45 plus 7.5% sales tax)

1000 Competitors Meeting downstairs near Tiki Bar

1100 Base starting time, pursuit race

Awards to be presented after competition downstairs

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available on the RegattaNetwork event website.

7 THE COURSE

The course will be random leg using DIYC marks, with a pursuit start.

8 SCORING

8.1 One race is scheduled.

8.2 The race will be scored using WFPHRF RLC ratings.

9 PRIZES – Prizes will be awarded to up to three boats, depending on entries.
