1. Rules

4. Entry Fees:

All Classes \$45.00 A boat may only enter in one class.

- 5. Course: Start in vicinity of Dog River 5, Theodore 10 to port, Middle Bay Light to port, Theodore 10 to starboard, Finish in vicinity of Dog River 5. Course Diagram will be in the Sailing Instructions.
- 6. Time limit for this race will be 1700 hours.
- 7. Prizes: First, second and third place trophies will be awarded in all PHRF and Portsmouth divisions as well as to PHRF and Portsmouth overall winners. One Design classes will be awarded a first overall trophy. Multiple perpetual trophies to be awarded also
