NOTICE OF RACE

(Revised August 24, 22)

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Westhampton Yacht Squadron (WYS) is the Organizing Authority for this race. The WYS is located at 9 Yacht Club Drive (formerly New Street, at the foot of Shore Road), Remsenburg, New York 11960. The WYS website is <u>www.yachtsquadron.com</u>.
- 1.2 The Fall Series Race at the Westhampton Yacht Squadron shall consist of races on six (6) Sunday afternoons commencing Sunday, September 11, 2022 and concluding on Sunday October 23, 2021, except there will be no racing on Sunday October 9, 2021.

2. RULES

- 2.1 The races will be governed by "*The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024 including US Sailing Prescriptions*" ("RRS"), except as changed by this Notice or the Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2 As permitted by Rule 86 of the RRS, Rule 44.1 will be changed by requiring only one penalty turn under any circumstances covered by Rule 44.1.

3. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Sailing Instruction will be available on the online Official Bulletin Board no later than 6:00 PM on September 10, 2022.
- 3.2 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official WYS Notice Board by 09:00 AM on the day it will take effect. Oral instructions may be given on the water, as necessary, with a loud hailer from the Race Committee boat or by an official support boat, as permitted by RRS 90.2(c).

4. **COMMUNICATION**

4.1 The online official notice board may be found on the Club Website or at the following link:

- 4.2 All boats may carry a VHF capable radio and/or a cell phone.
- 4.3 From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

5. ELIGIBILITY, ENTRY & REGISTRATION

5.1 The races are open to all eligible boats of the Sunfish (open & novice), Laser, 420, JY15 and Optimist (Red, Blue, White or Green Fleet) classes. Eligible boats are entered in the series upon full completion of registration and payment of the applicable fee. Registration must be made by completing the online form on RegattaNetwork.com using the following link:

- 5.2 All participants are subject to the COVID-19 rules and policies required by the State of New York and/or established by the WYS at the time of any of the races.
- 5.3 The skipper of each boat **MUST** be a member of US Sailing <u>www.ussailing.org</u> or associated with a US Sailing Club.
- 5.4 Boats who participate but who have failed to properly and completely register as required above prior to participating will be scored DNC for the day without a hearing (changes RRS 63.1).
- 5.5 Sunfish designation as open or novice will be self-selected by the registrant, subject to re-designation by the Race Committee following the second week of racing.
- 5.6 Competitors are to sail in the boat in which they are registered. Any changes must be approved by the WYS Race Committee before racing.
- 5.7 With permission of the Race Committee, sailors from outside the geographic area covered by GSBYRA may sail for some or all of this series but shall be scored. This changes RRS A2.2.
- 5.10 The Organizing Authority reserves the right to exclude boats or competitors from this series pursuant to the terms of RSS 76.

6. **FEES**

6.1 The entry fee per boat for the Fall Series is as follows:

7. RACING AREA

7.1 The racing area is on Moriches Bay directly in front of the WYS club house, as well as areas and coves to the east and west of the club house as designated in the WYS UCG permit (available on request).

8. THE COURSES

8.1 The courses to be used during this series will be posted on the Club Website prior to the commencement of the series and can be found at:

The course or courses to be used on any given race day will be announced and reviewed at the Competitors's meeting.

- 8.2 Racing will be held on two separate courses, one for each division:
 - **Division 1:** Sunfish Open, 420's, JY15, Lasers
 - **Division 2:** Sunfish Novice, Optimists Red/White/Blue and Green Fleets

9. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 9.1 Each racing day should include from three (3) to five (5) races but may be more or less depending on conditions and other factors.
- 9.2 Racers must check in with the Race Committee boat on the water prior to the first race each day. If leaving the race area, racers must communicate that information to the Race Committee as soon as possible.
- 9.3 Dates of Racing: The schedule of races, including date, time of skippers meeting, and race start and end times can be found on the Club Web Site at:

10. SCORING

- 10.1 The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A will apply as modified. As this is a series, RRS A5.3 of Appendix A shall be applied to the scoring. This modifies RSS A5.2.
- 10.2 There will one (1) throw-out race allowed for every five (5) races sailed. This changes RSS A2.1.
- 10.3 Provided the Race Committee Chairman is informed ahead of time, in writing or by email (providing the date and time of the away race, the Organizing Authority of same, the class of boat to be sailed and the capacity in which the away sailor will be sailing), any competitor registered in this Fall Series can race in a recognized Regatta and miss a regular Sunday race at WYS and receive a score other than DNC for the day missed. The scores for the Series races on the missed race day will be determined at the end of the season and will be based on an average of the competitor's scores in Fall Series for all races sailed at WYS during the Series. In addition, the away race must be a race in which the away competitor competes in the same class and capacity (i.e. skipper, crew, etc.) as they are racing in the WYS Series. This option may be exercised only one weekend during the Fall Series.
- 10.3 Any boat not properly registered in accordance with Para. 5 above will be scored DNC for any days such improper registration persists.

11. SAFETY

1. Competitors shall wear a US Coast Guard (USCG) approved personal flotation device (PFD) 100% dependent on foam for flotation and the appropriate size for the sailor, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment while on the water. The PFD must be worn outside of all clothing except that a thin shirt may be worn over the PFD to prevent snagging. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices. This changes RSS Part 4 Preamble, RSS 40.1 and RSS 40.2.

12. AWARDS

- 12.1 At the end of the series (at the Fall Series Awards Dinner-Saturday, October 29, 2022), trophies will be presented to the top three (3) finisher in each class of boat that participated.
- 12.2 The Bob Rice Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the WYS Sunfish Open Division Member with the Best Score for the races held on the first Sunday in October (October 2nd, 2022). WYS Sunfish novice are eligible for the Bob Rice Memorial Trophy if they have the lowest score for the day when scored with the WYS Open fleet, they must be a WYS member.
- 12.3 The Sailaction Trophy will be awarded to the 420 skipper and crew, all of whom must be WYS members, who do not turn age 19 before the end of the

2022 calendar year, with the best score (with no throw-out race) for the races held on the first Sunday race day in October (October 2nd, 2022).

- 12.4 WYS Perpetual Trophies will also be awarded. Non-WYS club member shall not be eligible for any of the club based Perpetual Trophies.
- 12.5 An award will be presented to the highest finishing WYS Sunfish sailor between the age of 60 and 69 and a separate award for any such finisher over the age of 70.
- 12.5 The Fall Series Awards Dinner will be held on Saturday October 29, 2022. All are welcome, but reservations for the Awards Dinner must be made by calling WYS at (631)325-8321 or sending an email to <u>email@yachtsquadron.com</u>.

13. USE OF CLUB BOATS

- 13.1 There are a limited number of WYS owned "club boats" available for use by WYS club members, only, during the fall series. The use is subject to the Club Boat Use Policy.
