## Notice of Race

### 1. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

South Shore Yacht Club (SSYC) is the organizing authority for the Sunday Sailing Series.

### 2. RULES

2.1 The Series will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing, (*RRS*), the rules of the Performance Handicap Racing Fleet of Southern California (PHRF), and the Notice of Race, except as altered by the Sailing Instructions, as found at:

2.2 The Series is classified as a Category "A" Event in accordance with ISAF Regulation 20.

2.3 Boats are subject to inspection by the appropriate fleet coordinator to ensure conformity to the applicable class rules, bylaws and/or measurement certificates.

2.4 *RRS* 55 is changed by adding the following sentence to the rule: "However, discarding elastic or wool bands when setting a sail is permitted."

2.5 The US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements (USSER) Coastal Category will apply, except as modified below. USSER is available at

### 3. CLASSES

The fleet will be divided into appropriate classes based on the PHRF Area D Random Leg Course (RLC) Ratings

### 4. ELIGIBILITY

Each entrant must be a member of PHRF of Southern California and have a valid rating, and be a member of an SCYA Member Yacht Club or a USSA recognized yacht club if not a resident of Area J.

## **5. ENTRY FEE**

5.1 The entry fee is \$40.00.

## **6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Sailing Instructions will be available not later than one (1) week prior to the first race on the SSYC website at [www.SouthShoreYC.com](http://www.SouthShoreYC.com).

## **7. SCHEDULE AND COURSES**

7.1 Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1900 hours on the day before the race on the SSYC website ([www.SouthShoreYC.com](http://www.SouthShoreYC.com)).

7.2 The races are scheduled to be sailed on September 25<sup>th</sup>, October 16<sup>th</sup> and November 19<sup>th</sup>.

7.3 The first warning signal each day is scheduled for 1255 hours.

7.4 Random Leg courses will be sailed.

7.5 The Start/Finish line will be in the vicinity of the Coral Street dock on Balboa Island and Racing Mark N.

## **8. PENALTIES**

*RRS* 44.1 and *RRS* 44.2 shall apply.

## **9. SCORING**

9.1 Scoring will be according to *RRS* A4.1 Low Point System for each day's race

9.2 The races will be scored using the PHRF Area D RLC Rating

9.3 For boats rated without a spinnaker, the races will be scored using the PHRF Area D RLC Rating plus the boat's Non-Spinnaker Offset

9.4 There are no throw-outs. This changes *RRS* A2.

9.5 *RRS* A9 shall not apply.

## **10. PRIZES**

10.1 Trophies for the Series will be awarded after the last race.

10.2 A 2-boat class will awarded one trophy. A class of 3-5 boats will receive first and second place trophies. A class of 6 or more boats will receive first, second and third place trophies.
