Desription: The Fall High Point Sailing Series is a combination of three race events, one around the

buoys series (Fall Regatta), and two pursuit style distance races. The single \$25 entry fee is for all three events. The entry fee is not prorated for sailing fewer than 3 events. A boat must sail 2 of the 3 events to qualify for the high point award, one of the two required events must be the Fall Regatta. A minimum of 5 boats registered per class at

the beginning of the series is required to ensure first through third awards.

Eligibility: All PHRF entries must have a valid 2022 PHRF of the Chesapeake rating or proof of a

submitted rating application to PHRF of the Chesapeake. Each competitor must sign a waiver. Each owner must register and pay fees for a boat to be scored. At the discretion of the Organizing Authority, a provisional PHRF rating may be assigned if a valid certificate is not available. Dinghies must be class compliant for their particular class.

Navigation lights if applicable must be operational. Each boat should meet US Sailing Near Shore requirements as described in Racing Resources at www.discsailing.org

Lifelines, if the boat was originally equipped with them. For those boats that did not have lifelines, all crew must wear approved Type III or Type V Personal Flotation Devices while racing.

Each boat must be owned by a member in good standing of DISC. The boat owner is not required to be onboard or to helm. A captain of a club-owned boat must be an active DISC member and must register the boat in DISC races. Dinghy classes are exempt from this requirement.

At least one class for non-spinnaker, at least one class for spinnaker fleet boats, and at least one class for Dinghy's will be offered. Other divisions may be offered.

Notices: The official Notice Board will is electronic and will be located at www.discsailing.org,

under the appropritate event website.

Rendezvous: Fall Regatta: For races designated as "Middle Course", at 1100 in the vicinity of

Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s. The course options for each race will be posted on the DISC web site (www.discsailing.org) under the Racing Resources tab. At the discretion of the Standing Race Committee, race rendezvous and start locations may be moved,

especially at times of extreme low tide.

For Mt Vernon Chase: The rendezvous point is Potomac River "90", FL R 4s. **For Frostbite Regatta**: The rendezvous point is Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s.

Mt Vernon Course and marks – DISC Mt Vernon courses are listed under Racing Resources on the DISC website www.discsailing.org, . All marks serving as turning marks are to be left to Port unless that mark is a finishing mark. Designation of courses used will

be at the discretion of the DISC Standing Race Commttee. Courses for spinnaker and non-spinnaker fleets may be different or may be the same. Except for course 1, rounding GC 81, GC 79 will be rounded on the channel side as a mark of the course in both directions. All courses will begin at Potomac River "90", FI R 4s, South of the Woodrow Wilson Bridge, and will round 1 of the following 6 marks:

- 1) GC 81 (7.24 mi)
- 2) GC 77 (9.20 mi)
- 3) GC 73 (11.38 mi)
- 4) GC 71 (13.08 mi)
- 5) GC 69 (14.10 mi)
- 6) GC 67 (15.36 mi)

Frostbite Courses and marks – A pursuit start format will be used. DISC Frostbite courses will be designated as Two or Three Bridges Courses and are listed under Racing Resources on the DISC website www.discsailing.org, Designation of courses used will be at the discretion of the DISC Standing Race Commttee. Courses for spinnaker and non-spinnaker fleets may be different or may be the same. The first boat will start no earlier than 1100 hours the day of the race at Potomac River R6 FI R 2.5s as the east end of the start line and an imaginary line due west of R6, FI R 2.5s. If there is a Race Committee boat the start line will be between the mast of the race committee boat, or an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and R6, FI R 2.5s. Each skipper is responsible for knowing their correct start time, and starting correctly.

Mt Vernon Chase Starting and Finishing Lines – A pursuit start format will be used. A starting schedule will be provided based on boats registered to compete via the registration form on the DISC website www.discsailing.org. The start times for each of the courses will be posted on the DISC website. The first boat will start no earlier than 1100 hours the day of the race at Potomac River "90", FI R 4s as the east end of the start line and an imaginary line due west of "90", FI R 4s. If there is a Race Committee boat the start line will be between the mast of the race committee boat, or an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and "90", FI R 4s. Each skipper is responsible for knowing their correct start time, and starting correctly.

Radio: Boats should monitor VHF 69 for courtesy communications from the Race Committee.

For Fall Regatta races designated as "Middle Course", the start/finish line will be between Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s and the Race Committee Signal Boat. If no RC is used, the starting line will be a line due west from Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s. For Mt Vernon Chase the start line will be Potomac River "90", FI R 4s as the east end of the finish line and an imaginary line due west of "90", FI R 4s. For Frostbite, the start/finish line will be between Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s and the Race Committee Signal Boat. If no RC is

used, the starting line will be a line due west from Potomac River R *6" FI R 2.5s.

For Fall Regatta, the RRS 26 Starting System will be used. See Event Sailing Instructions on the DISC web site (www.discsailing.org) for specific class flag and class order specifics. The DISC Race Committee Manual under the Racing Resources tab is a valuable resource for class flags and order specifics. Alternatively, a pathfinder (rabbit) start may be used if briefed by the Standing RC, particularly if no RC boat is present.

Course: Fixed government marks will be used. The course will be determined the day of each race. Code letters will be posted on the Race Committee boat. The Race Committee will do it's best to select a course, that is based on the conditions the day of the race. It is the responsibility of each owner/skipper to know the draft of their own boat, and the depth of the selected course. The contour of the river bottom is constantly changing due to natural causes, and may not be what is noted on available nautical charts. Additionally, there are natural and manmade obstructions in the sailing area to include sunken trees and submerged pilings. All of these will affect the individual competitors in different

manners based upon their boat's characteristics. Decisions whether to race, or tactical decision during a race are the owner/skippers sole responsibility. Redress will not be given for running aground or into a submerged obstacle. This modifies RRS 62.1a. A description of all marks and their code letter designations is available at the Racing Resources tab at www.discsailing.org.

At the discretion of the Standing RC, drop marks may be used in lieu of one or more government marks for either the Fall Regatta or the Frostbite Regatta. If drop marks are to be used, a description of these marks will be provided at the skippers' meeting.

Finish:

Fall Regatta and Frostbite: Between Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s or Potomac River GR "HP" FI (2+1) G 6s and the Race Committee boat, or at a location determined by the Race Committee. If no RC is used for the event, the finish will be an imaginary line at 90 degrees due west of Potomac River R "6" FI R 2.5s and each boat should record their finish times for submission to the Standing RC.

Mt Vernon Chase Finish: Potomac River "90", FI R 4s as the east end of the finish line and an imaginary line due west of "90", FI R 4s. Each boat should record boats they finished in front of and behind.

Time Limit:

Two hours per race for Fall Regatta and 5 hours for Mt Vernon Chase and Frostbite. The Race Committee will be allowed "discretionary leeway" in determining the exact time limit of the race, but under no circumstances should the skipper expect the Race Committee to be on station after the two hour time limit.

Rules:

This regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in current <u>The Racing Rules of Sailing</u> Conflict between Rules, "If there is a conflict between the Event Sailing Instructions and the Notice Of Race, the Event Sailing Instructions shall apply." this modifies RRS 63.7. US Prescriptions will apply.

PHRF of the Chesapeake class rules, One Design rules will apply.

DISC's Event Sailing Instructions and Notice(s) of Change will be posted on www.discsailing.org under the appropriate event web page.

Scoring:

The Fall Race Series is a High Point Scoring based upon all three of the race events. To qualify for the series high point a boat must sail in a minimum of 2 of the 3 events, with one of those events being the Fall Regatta. PHRF boats will be scored using TOT (time on time) and CR ratings for the Fall Regatta, or CR ratings and pursuit start times (Time on Distance – TOD) in the case of the Mt Vernon Chase and Frostbite. Dinghy's will be scored by One Design class. Some classes may need to be combined. Portsmouth rating may be used if insufficient dinghy boats register to make a single class. High point scoring is as follows, first place = N (N being the number of boats that finished in that class in that event), second place = N-1, third place N-2, etc. The boat's total scores for the Fall High Point will be divided by the point total if the boat finished first in each event, multiplied by 100.

Protests:

Protests must be made in accordance with the current Racing Rule of Sailing. The Race Committee boat must be notified of the intent to protest as soon as possible after finishing, and the protest must be filed with the Standing Race Committee in person or by email at officers@discsailing.org by 2200 hours on the day of the racing.

Penalties: Scoring penalties will be an option for Part 2 rules and rule 31.

Waiver: All participants will be required to sign a waiver.

Awards: Trophies will be awarded at the Annual Awards Ceremony and may be based upon level

of participation per Fleet.

The following rules have been modified in the Regatta Sailing Instructions or Notice of Race:

RRS 63.7 Conflict Between Rules, Sailing Instructions will apply

- RRS 62.1 **Redress.** All radio communication will be a courtesy. No Redress given for failure to receive or understand a radio transmission.
- RRS 23, Interfering With Another Boat, Sailing in the area of the finish line after racing
- RRS 32.2 Shortening The Course, changes procedure and finish line
- RRS 44.1, 44.2, 44.3, **Penalties At The Time** Of **An Incident**, collision with the Race Committee boat, the penalty is to retire
- RRS 60.2, **Right To Protest**, Race Committee can protest a boat that interferes with commercial traffic with information from any party, and a party with a *conflict of interest*.
- RRS 62.1 **Right To Request Redress**, All boats must check in to be scored, no redress given
- RRS 60.2, 60.3a, 40.1, **Y Flag Rules**, Race Committee can protest violations of rule, can receive information from a person with a *conflict of interest*.
