Notice of Race (NoR)

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1. RULES

1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. The sailing instructions will be available after 1700h on Thursday, March 2, 2023 at Sarasota Sailing Squadron and on-line at [Regatta Network](#). Event ID 25435.

2.2. The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions (SSIs) that will be posted on the official notice board.

3. COMMUNICATION

3.1. The official notice board is located beside the race office at SSS. Race documents may also be found online at [Regatta Network](#). Event ID 25435

3.2. [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channel(s) 16 and 72.

3.3. On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the sailing instructions (SSIs). Such announcements are a courtesy and failure of the RC to make the announcement or of competitors to hear or understand the announcement shall not constitute a ground for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

3.4. [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1. The event is open to all one-design multihull boats and multihull boats holding a valid PHRF certificate. PHRF Ratings from regions other than West Florida may be adjusted to compensate for regional differences.

4.2. A minimum of FIVE boats makes a class. Expected classes include PHRF Multihull, Corsair F28 R, Corsair 750/760 Sprint,

4.3. The organizing authority reserves the right to group similar boats together to form one or more open classes.

4.4. Eligible boats may only enter the event by completing the entry form and submitting it, together with the regatta fee to [Regatta Network](#). Event ID 25435

4.5. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5. FEES

5.1. The registration fee is \$185 per boat which includes one dinner ticket and one T-shirt.

5.2. After Monday, February 3, 2023, the registration fee is \$225 per boat which includes one dinner ticket and subject to availability, one T shirt.

5.3. Additional dinner tickets for Saturday night are \$20.00. Additional T shirts are \$20.00.

6.1. A maximum of 12 races are scheduled.

6.2. On the last scheduled day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1400 hrs.

7. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

7.1. Each boat not having a one design rating shall supply a valid rating certificate to the organizing authority by 1900 hrs on March 2, 2023.

7.2. If a valid rating certificate is not available, a temporary rating may be assigned (on a best-efforts basis) for the duration of this event at the discretion of the Organizing Authority

8. VENUE

8.1. Racing will be in Sarasota Bay North of New Pass.

9. COURSES

9.1. Courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward.

10. PENALTY SYSTEM

10.1. For all classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One Turn Penalty.

11. SCORING

11.1. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

11.2. Scoring for each class will be described in the Supplemental Sailing Instructions.

12. RISK STATEMENT

12.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury.

13. INSURANCE

13.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 USD per incident or the equivalent. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has third-party liability insurance.

14. PRIZES

14.1. Prizes will be awarded to boats placing first, second and third in each class with five or more entries; and to the first place in classes with fewer than five entries.

14.2. Additional awards may be presented.

15. [DP] [NP] PARKING

- 15.1. The Sarasota Sailing Squadron is a very active sailing club. Please recognize the inconvenience the Squadron's hosting of our event causes for our members not participating in the event and respect the right of the squadron members to be able to use the squadron while our event is ongoing.
- 15.2. Parking is available outside of the main entrance to the Squadron.
- 15.3. Parking inside the main entrance on Squadron grounds is limited to Squadron members. Cars parked on the Squadron grounds that do not display a member's decal may be towed at the owner's expense.
- 15.4. Any cars/trailers parked inside the club, member or non-member blocking a member's boat/trailer may be towed at the owner's expense.

Accommodations:

There is no tent, car or RV camping permitted at SSS this year. Camping may be available at Oscar Scherer State Park or Myakka State Park (quite a distance away), or Jiggs Landing Campground (closer). Boat Storage and Set Up:

Competitors wishing to store their boats outside of the complimentary period must make arrangements through the Club Manager. Space at the Squadron is limited and may not be available.
