



Notice of Race
84th Annual One Design Regatta
July 22-23, 2023

1 RULES

1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRIES

2.1 The event is open to the following classes: Flying Scot, ILCA 6, ILCA 7, Melges 15, Hampton One Design, San Juan 21, Windmill, Optimist (Red, Blue, White and Green fleets) & Portsmouth Handicap.

2.1.1 Additional classes may be added at the discretion of FBYC. Please email the event chairman for consideration.

2.1.2 A class shall have a minimum of five entries by July 17 for a separate start and separate scoring.

2.1.3 Any class with less than 5 boats on the course, will continue to be scored separately, but may have their starts combined with the Portsmouth fleet or another class with less than 5 boats.

2.4 Any class not meeting the 5 boat minimum of entries by July 17 will be moved to the Portsmouth Handicap fleet and scored using DPN-2. Portsmouth competitors must enter their boats US Sailing Portsmouth DPN-2 Code in Regatta Network. See Appendix E: <https://www.fbyc.net/sailing-documents/appendix/>

2.5 Each competitor will be responsible for their boat complying with class rules.

2.6 All pre-registered competitors are required to check-in at the check-in table upon their arrival at the club on Friday by 1700 or no later than 0930 Saturday.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available at check-in and online at www.fbyc.net/events/ on the Regatta Network site by July 21, 2023.

6 VENUE

- 6.1 The racing areas for adult classes will be on the Piankatank River between Fishing Bay and Godfrey Bay on the North and South and Gwynn's Island to the east.
- 6.2 The racing areas for junior classes will be in Fishing Bay.
- 6.3 Hand-launched boats may use ample ramp and beach facilities. Trailered boats will be put in by tractor or may use the hoist on the Northside of the property in Jackson Creek.
- 6.4 Please respect that sailboats have priority on the launch dock during the event. Power boats must be launched before 0830 on Saturday and 0800 on Sunday; otherwise they can be launched after all ramp and hand launched sailboats have launched both days. Power boats can only be retrieved once all ramp launched sailboats have been retrieved both days.
- 6.5 Power boats docked at the Fishing Bay dock may only dock on the West side of the dock. At no time should a power boat be on the East or south sides.

7 SCORING

- 7.1 One completed race shall constitute the regatta.
- 7.2 Low-point scoring will apply except for no throw-outs. This changes RRS A2.1.

8 AWARDS

- 8.1 Awards will be given to the first 3 finishers in each class.
- 8.2 The John R. Hawksworth Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the class winner who has been most competitive as measured both by the degree to which he or she has consistently been at the top of his or her class and the number of boats against which he or she has competed.

9 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate, valid third-party liability insurance, or the equivalent.

10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in any race or regatta entirely at their own risk as instructed in RRS, Rule 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
