Ocean Springs Yacht Club, Ocean Springs, Mississippi Sailing Instructions

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SIs means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule in the SIs means that the instruction is not grounds for protest or a request for redress by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a) and 60.1(b).

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 In rule 30.4, "sail number" is replaced with "bow number".
- 1.3 RRS 40.1 (Personal Flotation Devices Basic Rule) shall apply while racing.
- 1.4 The US Sailing prescription to RRS 63.1 and RRS 63,2 shall not apply.

2. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the **official notice board** located in the breezeway at OSYC and on Regatta Network (www.regattanetwork.com/event/26006).
- 2.2 Radio communication between boats and the race committee during racing will be carried out on **VHF channel 68**. Competitors are advised to maintain a listening watch on this channel at all times.
- 23 [NP] The following may be made by the race committee using the designated VHF channel in addition to any Race Signals (this changes RRS 29, 32, 33 AND 41): courses, including the bearing and distance to the first mark; postponements and abandonments; boats identified as OCS and general recalls; changing courses or marks and identity of marks; shorten course; time limits.
- 24 [DP] A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction applies to mobile telephones.
- 25 Competitors may monitor the race committee channel, but communications between the race committee that may be overheard by a competitor shall not be grounds for redress. *This changes RRS 62.1(a)*.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board not less than sixty (60) minutes prior to the first scheduled race on the day it will take effect, except that changes to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 hrs. or by the protest time limit, whichever is later, on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the upper deck of OSYC.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than thirty (30) minutes' in Race Signals AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Races are scheduled for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, 13, 14 and 15 October. Multiple races may be held on any racing date, wind and weather permitting.
- 5.2 A competitors' meeting will be held Friday 13 October at **1000 hrs**. downstairs in the OSYC breezeway. Additional Competitors' Meetings may be scheduled for Saturday or Sunday.
- 5.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for Friday is 1130 hrs, for Saturday it is 1030 hrs, and the warning signal for Sunday is 1030 hrs. Warning signals for subsequent races each day will be made as soon as practical. No warning signal will be made after 1400 hrs. Sunday 15 October.

- 5.4 The RC intends to run five races back-to-back each day, when conditions permit. There is no maximum number of races.
- 5.5 Flag 'L' displayed with no sound while boats are finishing means 'Additional races are planned'. Flag 'A' displayed, with no sound means 'No more racing today".

6. CLASS FLAG

6.1 The class flag will be a Pink Formula Wave Class burgee.

7. COURSES

- 7.1 Attachment A shows the courses for Friday, October 13, 2023. Attachment B shows the courses for Saturday and Sunday. They show Order and side in which marks are to be passed. All marks shall be left to port (except gates).
- 72 No later than the preparatory signal, the race committee signal boat may display the approximate compass bearing and distance of the first leg.

8. MARKS

- 8.1 Marks will be inflated tetrahedrons, cylinders, or spheres. The description, color and shape will be posted on the official notice board and will be reviewed at the competitors meeting on Friday, 13 October.
- 8.2 If one of the gate marks is missing, the remaining mark shall be left to port.

9. THE START

- 9.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an **orange** flag on the race committee signal boat and the course side of the starting mark on the port side of the race committee signal boat.
- 92 The race committee, as a disinterested party, may attempt to hail OCS starters. However, the following **shall not be grounds for redress:** failure to hail; the timeliness of the hail; failure to hear the hail; and the order of the boats hailed.
- 9.3 A boat starting later than five (5) minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. *This changes RRS A4 and A5*.

10. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 10.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark. An offset mark will not be set with a changed weather mark.
- 10.2 A course may be adjusted up to 10 degrees and 0.1 nm to square the course, and a single gate mark may be moved to align the course, without signaling a change. *This changes RRS* 33.

11. THE FINISH

- 11.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a **blue** flag on the race committee boat and the course side of the finish mark adjacent to the race committee boat.
- 11.2 Boats failing to finish within thirty (30) minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes, will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing and shall be scored one more point than the number of finishers that have sailed the course and finished. This changes RRS 35, A5.1, A5.2 and A10.
- 11.3 [NP] Boats may be finished on the course at the discretion of the RC. The RC determines the method and order of finishing. *This changes RRS 28.1, 35, A5.1 and A5.2.*

12. PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1 RRS Appendix V applies with the following change: In V1, the language "However, when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 while in the *zone* around a *mark*, other than a starting *mark*, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty" **is deleted**.

13. TIME LIMITS

13.1 If no boat has passed the first mark within thirty (30) minutes of the start, or if no boat finishes within seventy-five (75) minutes of the start, the race will be abandoned. Failure to meet the time limits will not be grounds for redress. *This changes RRS* 62.1(a).

14. HEARING REQUESTS

- 14.1 The protest time limit is sixty (60) minutes after, the race committee signal boat docks following the last race of the day, or when the RC signals 'No more racing today', whichever is later. The race committee will post the protest time limit on the official notice board.
- 14.2 Protests shall be delivered to the protest committee table downstairs in the breezeway at OSYC. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing each day. Notices will be posted on the official notice board within thirty (30) minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they may be parties or witnesses.

15. SCORING

- 15.1 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 15.2 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of all her individual race scores. *This changes RRS A2, and NoR 1.3 and NoR 11.2.*

16. SAFETY (CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT)

- 16.1 [DP] Before the initial warning signal on each race day, all boats shall check in with the race committee signal boat by sailing across her stern **on starboard tack** and hailing their Bow Number until acknowledged. The race committee may check in any boat sailing nearby but is not required to do so.
- 16.2 [DP] A boat that retires from a race or decides to leave the racing area shall notify the race committee by hail until acknowledged as soon as possible before leaving the racing area.

17. PRIZES

17.1 Prizes will be awarded for first, second and third place.

18. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 18.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors and coaches participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 3, Decision to Race.
- 18.2 The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor or coach agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

19. INSURANCE

19.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$100,000 per incident, or the equivalent.


