Notice of Race (NoR)



1 RULES

- 1.1 The Totally Dinghy Regatta is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Rule 40.1 will apply at all times when boats are in the racing area, and on their way to and from the racing area.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Sailing instructions will be available online on the Official Notice Board located at: <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/26909> by 21:00 PDT on Thursday, September 28th.
- 2.2 Changes to the rules will be posted on the official notice board by 0930 on the day they will take effect. Changes to the schedule of races will be posted by 1900 on the day before they will take effect.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board: <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/26909>
- 3.2 [NP] All boats may carry a VHF capable of monitoring channels 16 and 69, 72, or 79.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 Eligible boats are non-foiling centerboard monohull dinghies, plus Thistles, Wabbit and Mercury classes.
- 4.2 Classes with 4 or more boats registered by Tuesday, September 19th will be sailed and scored as One Design. Otherwise, boats may be assigned to an Open Class. Two or more classes may be started together at the discretion of the race committee. If there are less than 4 boats registered for one of the Open Classes, then the boats may be consolidated or offered a refund.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by submitting the entry form, waiver and paying the entry fee online at: <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/26909>
- 4.4 No entries will be accepted after 0800 hrs. on Saturday, September 20th.

5 FEES

- 5.1 Entry fees are as follows:

Single Handed	\$35.00
Double Handed	\$55.00
Three or More Handed	\$75.00

A late fee of \$10 will be added to the entry fee for registrations after Tuesday, September 19th.

6 SCHEDULE

- 6.1 **Registration Deadline:** Must be completed online no later than Saturday, September 30 at 08:00 PDT.
- 6.2 The schedule for racing is as follows:
 - Competitors Briefing and Check-in at 1000
 - Three (3) races are scheduled. First warning at 1130

7. VENUE

- 7.1 There will be three race areas as follows:
 - Inside Breakwater in the area known as El Toro Cove
 - Keller Cove which is approximately 1/4 nm Northwest of the Richmond Breakwater
 - Outside Breakwater which is in the general vicinity Southeast of the Richmond Breakwater, and may be as far East as Brooks Island

8. COURSES

- 8.1 The courses and marks will be described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 8.2 All marks will be temporary marks (inflatable marks or balls).

9 SCORING

- 9.1 Two races must be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.2 A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores (RRS A4). No scores will be excluded.
- 9.3 Open Class boats will be scored Time on Time using the Royal Yachting Association's Portsmouth Yardstick.

10 PRIZES

- 10.1 1st and 2nd for classes with 6 or less boats. 1st, 2nd and 3rd for fleets with 7 or more boats.

11 RISK STATEMENT

Competitors shall participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk and in accordance with the Waiver signed during Registration. Minors must have a signed Minor Waiver completed with their Regatta Network registration prior to the day of the event or may not be allowed to participate.

12 INSURANCE

- 12.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
