

2023 PRSA President's Cup Regatta

NOTICE OF RACES

1. RULES

- 1.1 The Potomac River Sailing Association (PRSA) will organize the PRSA President's Cup on the Potomac River from the Washington Sailing Marina in Alexandria, VA.
- 1.2 These races will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 All class-legal boats in one-design classes 20' or under are invited to participate. Classes of 5 or more boats will be started separately. Starts for classes of fewer than 5 boats may be combined with the start of another class.
- 2.2 All competitors must register, sign the waiver of liability, and pay the entry fee at https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/26912. Online registration and payment is required in order to be scored for the regatta.
- 2.3 Competitors are required to comply with applicable federal, state, and local COVID-19 regulations.

3. ENTRY FEES & DINNER TICKETS

- 3.1 Required fees as following and <u>includes Saturday dinner tickets for Skipper and crew</u>.
 - 1-Person boat \$85
 - 2-Person boat \$100
 - 3-Person boat \$115
- 3.2 A \$10 discount will be applied for purchases before September 10.
- 3.3 **Additional** dinner tickets are available for purchase at \$15.
- 3.3 A \$10 fee for non-WSM boats will be charged to cover launch fees and overnight storage.

4. SCHEDULE

Several races may be sailed on any day at the discretion of the race committee. The warning signal for the first race on each day is scheduled as indicated below.

Saturday:

Check-in between: 0900 and 1000 Competitors meeting: 1000 First warning signal: 1125

Dinner will start approx. 1hr after last boat finishes

Sunday:

First warning signal: 1125 No warning signal after: 1530

Awards will start approx. 1hr after last boat finishes

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1 Sailing instructions will be posted to the regatta network site prior to the regatta.
- 5.2 Sailing Instructions will **not** be available at registration.

6. VENUE & SAILING AREA

- 6.1 The Washington Sailing Marina is located at <u>1 Marina Drive</u>, <u>Alexandria</u>, <u>Virginia 22314</u>, just off of the George Washington Parkway about 1.5 miles south of Reagan National Airport and a similar distance north of Old Town Alexandria.
- 6.2 Marina Entry: Registered participants bringing boats from outside the marina will receive a special gate code for the marina gate (this will be emailed via Regatta Network to registered competitors). Please use this code for only **one** car and only **one** entry each day (PRSA is charged for each use of the code). Crew and/or additional vehicles should park outside the gated drysail area in the free parking area.
- 6.3 Races will be conducted on the Potomac River between National Airport and Hains Point.
- 6.4 Channel-bound commercial vessels within the racing area are obstructions. Boats that are racing must keep clear of such vessels.
- 6.5 Keep the ramps clear of dollies and return trailers to dry slips and/or designated storage areas.

7. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

7.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio channel 68.

8. SCORING

- 8.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 8.2 If fewer than 6 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. If 6 or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. This modifies RRS A2.1.

9. AWARDS

- 9.1 Awards will be given to each member of the winning crews. Depth of awards in each class will be based on the number of registered boats in each class at the September 9 early registration deadline. Classes with 1-3 boats registered as of September 9 may only be awarded 1st place trophies.
- 9.2 The Norman C. Schaller Memorial Trophy will be conferred to the skipper with the fewest points in the largest fleet among fleets of 10 or more boats.

10. SUSTAINABILITY

10.1 PRSA has joined the race to restore the health of our waterways in partnership with the <u>Sailors</u> for the <u>Sea Clean Regattas Program</u>. Protecting our natural resources (including National Parks

such as Washington Sailing Marina) and our local waters (including the Potomac River) is very important to us. We ask for your help in this effort when racing with PRSA. In particular, we ask that you:

- Clean, Drain, Dry boats, trailers, and other recreational equipment that comes in contact with water. Avoid moving vegetation and other potentially invasive aquatic organisms to new waterbodies.
- Consider a water only washdown for your boat following the event.
- Bring reusable rather than single-use water bottles.
- Print one, double-sided copy of the Sailing Instructions if you wish to have a hard copy.
- Ensure that recycling and trash is separated properly before disposing of waste.

11. SOCIAL MEDIA

12. SAFETY

- 12.1 The Washington Sailing Marina has cranes as an option for getting boats in and out of the water. Under no circumstances should any person or part of the body ever be under a boat or other item attached to and/or suspended by the crane.
- 12.2 All members of the RC are required to wear PFDs or buoyancy aids at all times. All competitors are required to wear PFDs or buoyancy aids while racing.
- 12.3 Competitors leaving the racing area must notify the RC (verbally or via VHF).
- 12.4 No race shall be held in the event of an active **Gale Warning** issued by the NOAA for any part of the race course. The Race Committee will monitor the weather the evening before racing as well as prior to leaving the dock before the start of racing.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, "Decision to Race." The Potomac River Sailing Association will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
