Safety Resources On Shore

Emergencies ashore will be handled by the LYC Office or Security. AEDs are available at the LYC Clubhouse in the hall near the bathrooms in front of the Game Room. One AED is kept at either the Guardhouse or near the pool and one located at the Seahorse Lounge by the fuel dock.

Safety Boats and Resources on the Water

Emergencies afloat will be handled at the direction of the Principle Race Office of the respective line. Race Committee boats, coach boats and judge boats are all safety boats, when there is an emergency.

All competitor boats are required to carry basic first aid kit.

Medical Emergencies On the Water

Emergency Response Pick-Up Location: Blue Marlin Fuel Dock.

Severe life threatening injury:

For example: head injury with loss of consciousness, stroke, heart attack, severe bleeding, drowning or if any doubt.

- 1. Call 911
- 2. Hail Race Committee Signal Boat on VHF
- 3. Proceed to EMS ambulance pick-up location
- 4. Notify on-shore safety.

Severe non-life threatening injuries:

For example: severe cuts, broken bones, head injuries when the victim is conscious, etc.

- 1. Hail Race Committee Signal Boat on VHF
- 2. If it is safe to do so, transfer the victim to a race committee or the fastest available boat for transport
- 3. Proceed to Lakewood Yacht Club on-shore First Aid station
- 4. Notify on-shore safety.

Weather Monitoring

In the event of a severe storm or safety issue, Race Officials will announce a return to Safe Harbor.
