2 RULES

- 2.1 The Alerion 28 Regatta is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 2.2 Class rules will apply.

4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1 Sailing instructions will be available after 1500 hrs. on Thursday, April 18, 2024 on the Richmond Yacht Club website.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at: https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/27840
- 3.2 [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on the VHF channel used by the RYC race committee.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.
- 3.4 [DP] From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

1 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 1.1 The regatta is open to Alerion 28 sailboats.
- 1.2 Eligible boats may be entered by completing online registration found at: https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/27840.
- 1.3 Entry deadline is 1800 hrs on Thursday, April 18, 2024.
- 1.4 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5 FEES

5.1 The entry fee is \$65.

7 COURSES

- 7.1 The racing area will be between Southampton and the south end of Brooks Island.
- 7.2 Drop (inflatable) marks will be used.

8 SCORING

8.1 Three races are scheduled. All races will count toward the final score. This changes RRS A2.

9 PRIZES

- 9.1 Prizes will be awarded to first through second place finishers.
- 9.2 The trophy presentation will be held on the RYC deck after the racing on Sunday April 21.

10 RISK STATEMENT

10.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

10 INSURANCE

10.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
