NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1. The event will be governed by the "rules" as defined by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of the Sunfish class, and by the Sailing Instructions. In case of a discrepancy between the NOR and the SIs, the SIs govern.
- 1.2.Mandatory check-in on land with the Race Committee <u>before 1015</u> is required for ALL competitors. Check-in will be located on the front porch of Southold Yacht Club. *If a competitor does not check-in they will be scored DNC by the Race Committee.*

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available on line via Regatta Network at https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/27979 Copies may also be available at the Race Committee desk on the front porch of Southold Yacht Club on the day of the event and will be posted on the Official Notice Board day of the event.

The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and Supplementary Sailing Instructions that will be on the official notice board located on the front porch of Southold Yacht Cub. Supplementary Sailing Instructions may also be found at https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/27979 before July 20, 2024.

3. COMMUNICATION

3.1.From the first warning signal until a boat has withdrawn from the race or finished the race, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. This event is open to all boats of the Sunfish class. Sunfish class divisions are: Open Sunfish, Sunfish Doubles, Sunfish Youth, Sunfish Youth Doubles. (Youth is defined as under 19 on day of event.)
- 4.2.Online Registration can be found https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/27979
 Registration is available online only.
- 4.3. To be considered an entry in the event, boats must complete registration <u>including the</u> <u>payment of fees</u> *before 2359 July 19, 2024*. There will be no on-site registration.
- 4.4. Fees must be paid at the time of registration or the registration will not be considered valid.
- 4.5.All boats must check in with the Race Committee at the Race Committee desk located on the front porch at Southold Yacht Club before 1015 July 15 or their registration will be considered incomplete and they will not be eligible to race.
- 4.6. Sailors on each boat must be at least 15 years of age by the date of the event unless sailing with a parent or guardian. All sailors under the age of 18 must present a waiver signed by their parent or guardian as well as themselves, to be emailed to the RC/Organizing Authority (address below) or presented day of event before 1015. The waiver may be found at https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/27979.

5. FEES

- 5.1.Entry fees are as follows: \$80 per sailor via advance online registration, to be completed by 2359 June 15; \$100 thereafter. Fee includes the race, regatta souvenir, continental breakfast, beverages, post-race buffet including beer and wine, and awards. Additional individual social function tickets or passes may be purchased for sailor's guests on the registration web site.
- 5.2 Refund policy: If a sailor withdraws their registration by June 15, the entry fee will be refunded 100% less Regatta Network fees; 75% if sailor withdraws by July 1; 50% if sailor withdraws by July 15; 0% thereafter. Withdrawal shall be done via the on-line registration site, and by an email to BMFbethfleisher@gmail.com.

6. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- 6.1. Registration will be from April 1, 2024 open until July 19, 2024.
- 6.2. Day of Event:

0830 to1015	Check-in & Breakfast
1030	Skippers Meeting – ALL DIVISIONS
1127	Warning Sunfish Class, all divisions
1130	Start Sunfish Class, all divisions

****Any boat that does not start within 10 minutes of the start of its class shall be scored as DNC. No exceptions. This decision cannot be appealed. ****

Upon completion Post-race buffet and awards shortly after.

In the case of disadvantageous weather on July 20, a postponement to July 21 may be an option.

7. BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

7.1.Competitors will be responsible for their boats being in compliance with class rules. 7.2.All boats must carry a 20' tow line. Mainsheet can serve as tow line. Safety inspections may be performed by event organizer. It is strongly recommended that all boats carry adequate water for the duration of the race, and that sailors wear and use adequate sun protection. Race averages 4-5 hours duration.

8. CLOTHING AND EQUIPEMENT

8.1. RRS 40.1 is in effect: US Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices must be worn by all sailors while on the water. **Violators will be disqualified without possibility of appeal.** All boats must carry a 20 foot towline. Mainsheet can serve as towline. Safety inspections may be performed by event organizer.

9. COURSE

9.1. The course is a once-around circumnavigation of Shelter Island starting and ending in Southold Bay. The direction of the circumnavigation (clockwise or counter-clockwise) will be announced at the Skipper's Meeting and posted on the official notice board the day of the event.

10. SCORING

10.1. The scoring system will follow RRS Appendix A4.

11. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

11.1. Any Support Persons vessels (safety boat/coach boat) that is on the course to support an individual boat or boats is required to report to the Race Committee before

1015, and to monitor the Safety Boat channel (announced at the Skipper's meeting), and to be prepared to offer assistance to any competitor in need. (RRS 1.1)

12. RISK STATEMENT

12.1.RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

13. AWARDS

Top 10 finishers, First Doubles, First Youth, First Youth doubles.

Names inscribed on perpetual plaques maintained at Southold Yacht Club as follows: **WBAZ-FM Plaque**: Overall race winner. **Peggy Wagner Memorial Plaque**: First female finisher. **Heinl-Lyman Octogenarian Plaque**: Oldest Competitor and First Master (age 50+) to finish.

Please note that the parking permit must be displayed at all times or you may receive a ticket. No boats, trailers, cars or equipment can be left in the town parking lot overnight.

BOAT LAUNCH

Is from SYC grounds only. Please do not launch from either the Town Beach or the private property adjacent to the club.

HOSPITALITY

Competitor's guests are welcome to use the facilities and beach at Southold Yacht Club during the event, but must obey club rules. Hospitality tickets for guests to cover food and beverages costs will be available for purchase at \$15/person, \$10 per child under 10.
