NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in:
 - 1.1.1. The current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) including Appendix V,
 - 1.1.2. The current PHRF regulations, as administered by Yacht Racing Association of Long Island Sound (YRALIS),
 - 1.1.3. US SAFETY EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS (SER), Nearshore Category.
- 1.2. Rules that will be changed and are not discussed in this Notice of Race will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.
 - 1.2.1. RRS 35 and 63.1 are modified to include a finishing time limit window.
 - 1.2.2. RRS 90.3(e) is modified to extend the deadline for appealing scores to 48 hours.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1. The regatta is open to boats of PHRF classes whose owner is a member in good standing of the LHYC.
- 2.2. Eligible boats can enter using the Lloyd Harbor Yacht Club's online registration at www.lhyc.org, following the link to the Race Information page. The final deadline for entries is 1800 hours, July 18.
- 2.3. There will be two divisions, Cruising and Racing. Boats which generally do not race and use "cruising canvas" will race in the cruising division. All other boats will race in the Racing Class.
- 2.4. Entrants must possess either a valid YRALIS PHRF certificate, a valid One-Design certificate, or receive a waiver and LHYC handicap rating from the LHYC Measurer.
- 2.5. This is a non-spinnaker event. No spinnakers of any variety may be used.

3. FEES

- 3.1. There is a registration fee of \$30 for all boats.
- 3.2. US Sailing members receive an additional \$5 discount.
- 3.3. Fees should be paid online during registration. Unpaid entrants will not be scored.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 4.1. Racing is scheduled for July 20, 2024.
- 4.2. The scheduled time for the first warning signal is 1400 hours.
- 4.3. One race is scheduled.

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1. The sailing instructions will be available on the club web site by July 13 at 1800 hours. Scratch Sheets will be available on the web site no later than 1800 hours, on the day prior to the race.

6. VENUE

6.1. The venue is Huntington Bay. The starting area will be at Nun "2" at the entrance to Lloyd Harbor.

7. COURSES

7.1. The course for all classes will be indicated by the race committee and be comprised of government marks.

7.2. The intent is to either sail out to Mid-Sound gong buoy "11b" and back, or go around the "Huntington Bay Triangle", depending on the wind.

8. PENALTY SYSTEM

8.1. RRS 44 is modified as specified in RRS Appendix V1 and V2.

9. SCORING

9.1. Time allowances will be per YRALIS PHRF procedures using the Time on Distance method.

10. RADIO COMMUNICATION

10.1. Each boat shall carry a VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on channel 72.

10.2. Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to all mobile devices.

11. PRIZES

11.1. Prizes will be given as follows: Overall winner will receive the Little Brown Jug award.

11.2. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place finishers in both divisions.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

12.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

13. INSURANCE

13.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
