SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Skaneateles Sailing Club Regatta Series 6/8-8/31/2024

Skaneateles, New York

- 1. **RULES** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024*.
- 2. ENTRIES Eligible boats may enter by registering on-line at

https://www.regattanetwork.com/clubmgmt/applet_registration_form.php?regatta_id=28175

Payment may be made on-line during registration. The series is open to all sailboats. However, only sailboats that have ratings listed in the US Sailing Portsmouth Yardstick handicap tables, or a rating that has been approved by the Race Committee, will be eligible for race or series scoring. The Race Committee and administrators reserve the right to make adjustments to published handicaps to ensure fair racing. Any boat that does not have a Portsmouth rating prior to the start of the race or a handicap rating approved by the Race Committee will have a finish time recorded but will not be scored. One Design Classification requirements do apply.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the event website.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from a flagpole or staff on the dock at the Skaneateles Sailing Club. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag AP is lowered. Updates from the race committee including delays, postponements and cancellations or rescheduled races may also be posted on the event website.

5. SCHEDULE

12:30 pm -There will be a Skippers/Competitors meeting with race committee on the SSC dock. 2:00pm - Warning signal for the first race.

Dates of racing:

Saturday June 8 Saturday June 22 Saturday July 6 (Columbia Cup) Saturday July 20 Saturday August 3 Saturday August 17 Saturday August 31 No races will be started after 4 PM. There will be two starts per race. The "Centerboard" fleet will start first followed by the "Keelboat" fleet. It is recommended that multihulls and any boat with a Portsmouth handicap rating lower than 83 start with the "Keelboat" fleet.

6. THE START

The starting sequences for the Sandbagger Series follow the racing rules of sailing (RRS) Rule 26, which prescribes a 5-minute starting sequence using visual and audible signals The class flag signals are as follows:

International signal flag "C" for "Centerboard" boats (Red White Blue horizontal stripes)

International signal flag "K" for "Keelboat" and multihulls (Yellow | Blue)

The 5-minute starting sequence for the centerboard fleet will be followed immediately by a second 5minute sequence for the "keelboat" fleet. The starting signal for the centerboard fleet is the warning signal for the keelboat fleet which is sometimes referred to as a "rolling start". The overall 10-minute sequence for both fleets is shown in the table below:

A general recall, postponement or abandonment involving the centerboard fleet will result in abandonment of the keelboat fleet starting sequence. A new sequence for the centerboard fleet shall be initiated which will be followed by the keelboat sequence in the typical manner. A general recall, postponement, or abandonment involving the keelboat fleet after the centerboard fleet has been successfully started shall result in a new 5-minute sequence for the keelboat fleet.

7. RACING AREA

The racing area will be set up on the northern end of Skaneateles Lake, somewhere within about 6 miles of the village. For your reference, the Sailing Club address is 2745 East Lake Road, Skaneateles.

8. CHECKING IN


Each entrant will check in with the Race Committee boat prior to the first race each day. Boats will not be scored unless they have completed the registration and paid the entry fee.

9. COURSES AND MARKS

The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward. The diagram below shows marks that may be used to define the course. Windward and leeward marks will be round or cylindrical inflatable orange or yellow buoys. The optional finishing mark will be a small round buoy.

The start/finish line is between a staff on the Race Committee (RC) boat (typically an orange flag pole flying the RC "on station" flag) and the starting pin on the F port side of the RC boat. Optionally the RC may choose to utilize an inflatable mark to create a separate finish line on the starboard side of the RC boat. To begin, the start line is crossed from the downwind side of the line and marks are rounded in the

order listed below leaving the marks to the port side of the boat. The course is completed by crossing the finishing line from the direction of the last mark rounded as detailed below:





The course designations are as follows:

- W1 START between RC and S, U, D, FINISH between RC and S
- W2 START between RC and S, U, D, U, D, FINISH between RC and S
- D1 START between RC and S, U, FINISH between RC and S
- D2 START between RC and S, U, S, U, FINISH between RC and S

10. TIME LIMIT

In a race where no further racing will be scheduled that day due to constraints of time, competitors finishing more than 30 minutes after the first boat to finish will not be scored for the race. If no competitor finishes within 90 minutes of the start, the race may be abandoned.

11. EXONERATION

RRS Rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty for violations "when boats meet".

12. PROTESTS, REQUEST FOR REDRESS and PENALTIES

A protest committee will be available to hear protests should the need arise. A protesting boat shall notify the Race Committee verbally or in writing as soon as possible after her finish of her intent to file a protest and provide the sail number(s) of the boat(s) being protested. The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the arrival of the race committee boat at the dock. The time limit may be extended if the Race Committee Administrators need more time to obtain relevant information. The Race committee will notify the Administrators Skaneateles.

13. Scoring

2 races will constitute a series. The Regatta Series races will be scored using the RRS Appendix A low point scoring system and the Portsmouth handicap boat rating system using Regatta Network.com's event website scoring module. Ratings may be adjusted at the discretion of the Series Committee if an entrant's boat and sails differ from the ratings assumptions for that class of boat or the published handicap numbers and do not promote fair racing. One design class with 3 or more registered boats in the series will also be scored. It is the boats that are the entrants and are scored. A skipper is permitted to change their boat with one of the same class whether on a temporary or permanent basis and be scored as one entrant. Simply advise the Series Race Committee/scorer of the alternate boat so that results are posted properly. Registered entrants serving as Principal Race Officer (PRO) for up to four completed races will be scored for those races as the average points of their scores for all of the number of boats finishing that race +2 and boats starting but not finishing a race will be scored as the number of boats finishing that race +1. There will be no 'throw-out' scores.
