## **Sailing Instructions**

### **Wahine Big Boat Pau Regatta**

### **September 21, 2024**

#### **1. RULES:**

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US SAILING, pertinent Class/Fleet Rules, the Hawaii Yacht Racing Association Season Points Notice of Series, the Waikiki Yacht Club Standing Sailing Instructions, this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. The Racing Rules will be changed as follows:
  - 1.2.1. Rule 52 is changed to allow the use of powered winches.
  - 1.2.2. Rule 52 is modified to allow the use of autopilot for double and single-handed racers only.
  - 1.2.3. Rule 55 is changed to allow the use of banding for safety purposes.
  - 1.2.4. Rule 63.2 does not apply.
- 1.3. Crew shall be at least 50% female or consist of at least 4 females, whichever number is lower, (rounded up for odd number crews). More females are preferred but not required. Females are expected to have key roles. A wahine must be at the helm at all times from the preparatory signal of a race until the boat has finished the race. No male is allowed to touch the helm during this period. If a male must touch the helm during this time (for example in an emergency situation), the boat shall retire from that race.

#### **2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS:** Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the WYC on the regatta board.

#### **3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:** Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

#### **4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE:** Signals made ashore will be displayed from the WYC flagpole

#### **5. SCHEDULE OF RACING:**

- 5.1. Skippers meeting at 1030 Saturday September 21, 2024 at Waikiki Yacht Club
- 5.2. The first warning will be at 1225 Saturday September 21, 2024. All boats will start together.
- 5.3. Number of races: There will be three races sailed

#### **6. CLASS FLAGS** will be Pink with X

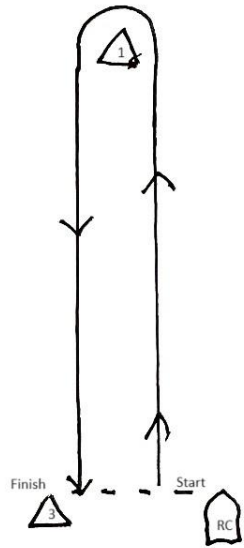
#### **7. RACING AREA:** The attachment shows the location of the racing area

#### **8. THE COURSES:**

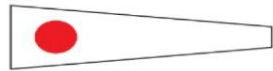
- 8.1. Mark 1 will be a yellow or orange tetrahedron located approximately 1 mile to windward of the start line  
Mark 3 will be a yellow or orange tetrahedron at the pin (port) end of the starting line  
Course 1: Start - Mark 1 to port - Finish (signaled with #1 pennant)  
Course 2: Mark 1 to port - Mark 3 to port - Mark 1 to port - Finish (Signaled with #2 pennant)

9. **THE START & FINISH:** The starting line will be between an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and a yellow or orange inflatable tetrahedron (Mark 3)
10. **TIME LIMIT:** The time limit for the races will be one and a half hour for the first boat to finish.
11. **PROTESTS:** Protests shall be delivered to WYC within 45 min. after the race committee boat docks. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing at WYC.
12. **SCORING:** Yachts will be scored in a class under PHRF system as endorsed by HYRA.
13. **PRIZES:** Awards will be at WYC after the event
14. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY:** Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta
15. **INSURANCE:** Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.
16. **REQUIREMENTS FROM DNLR:**
  - 16.1 All boats shall follow all navigational rules at all times while in the ocean waters.
  - 16.2 Each boat operator shall have passed the boater safety education class and have their boater safety education card on them during the use of the motorized vessels.

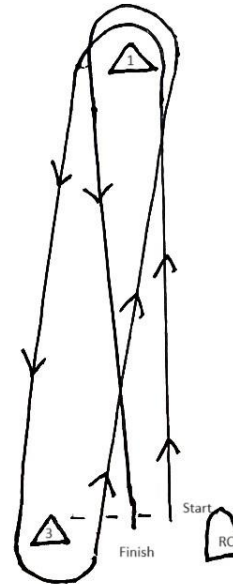




Course 1 - Windward/Leeward - 1 lap



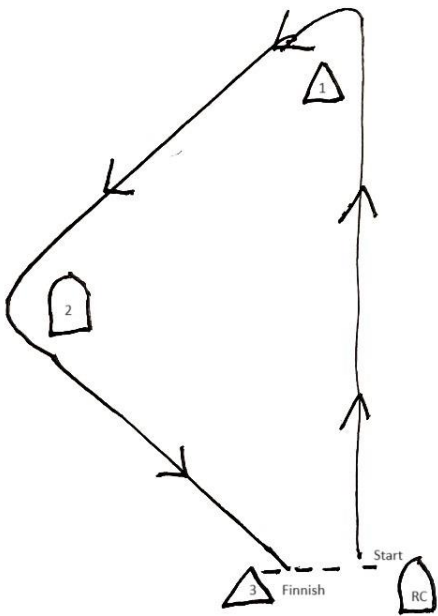
**Pennant 1** ↑ • • ↓ •



Course 2 - Windward/Leeward - 2 laps



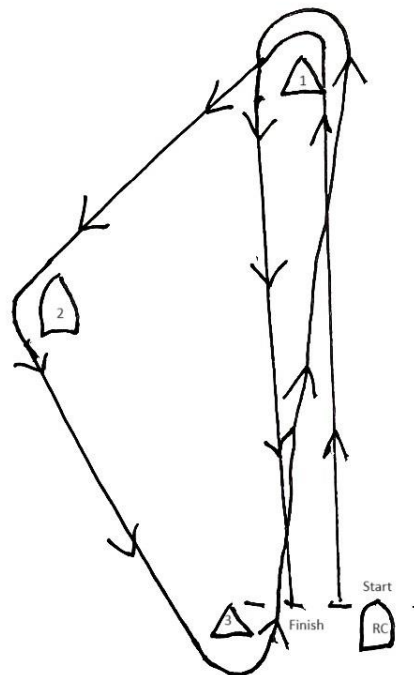
