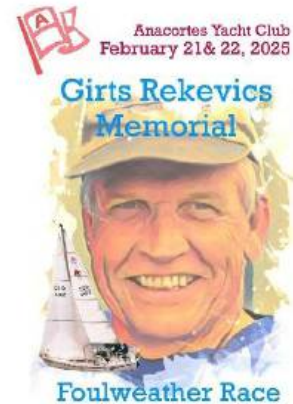

2025 NOTICE OF RACE – AYC CLUB RACE EVENTS

1. Governing Rules

Anacortes Yacht Club races are governed by these Sailing Instructions and comport with the current U.S. Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the rules of the Pacific Handicap Racing Fleet Northwest (PHRF-NW), and the US Coast Guard's International Regulations for Prevention of Collisions at Sea, 1972 (72COLREGS) and U.S. Inland Navigation Rules (aka the Rules of the Road Manual). Any exceptions, exclusions or variances to these regulations shall be noted in these instructions.

2. Responsibility

Skippers of each boat are responsible for the safe operation of their vessel at all times and shall give due regard to the U.S. Racing Rules of Sailing and exceptions thereof as noted in this document. Sportsmanship and sportsmanlike conduct are expected from each Skipper and members of their crew both on the water, on the docks and while on the grounds of Anacortes Yacht Club. Skippers are responsible ultimately to preserve and protect the highest ideals of our Corinthian yachting spirit and to ensure the Anacortes yacht racing program is fun and safe for all participants.

3. Insurance

All boats are required to be insured by valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 per event or the equivalent.

4. Liability - Hold Harmless Clause

Occasionally, sailboat racing has resulted in property damage, personal injury, or loss of life. All competitors in AYC events participate at their own risk. It shall be the responsibility of the skipper to inform the crew of the risks of sailboat racing, to make sure they understand and accept those risks, to decide whether the crew is competent and adequate for the event, and to decide whether to start or continue in a race.

The Anacortes Yacht Club, its officers, directors, and members accept no responsibility for damage to property, injury, or loss of life as competitors participate at their own risk. By registering and/or competing in AYC events you and you alone accept this risk.

5.. Entry & Registration Process

To be scored a boat must have a valid current PHRF Northwest rating or a club rating for Wednesday Fleet 4 and a Race Packet.

An AYC boat is defined as a boat owned either in whole or in part by an AYC member. AYC member boats that wish to participate in AYC buoy and distance events must register on-line using the AYC website and pay a \$110.00 registration fee. In the case when a person owns multiple boats additional registration fees will be minimal, to cover the costs associated with Regatta Network.

Non-AYC boats that wish to participate in AYC buoy and distance races may do so in up to three (3) races without registering. However, they will not be scored. Thereafter, the boat must register on-line using the AYC website and pay a \$185.00 registration fee.

The Race Packet registration does not apply to AYC regional invitational races and regattas. A separate online registration and payment for AYC and non-AYC boats is required for the following events:

- ***Girts Rekevics Memorial Foul Weather Race***
- ***Rockfish Rock n Roll Regatta***
- ***Northern Century***

6. Class Splits

Buoy racing class splits are as follows. The race committee reserves the right to modify these splits plus assign individual boats to specific classes outside of these rating bands:

<i>Class "1"</i>	<i>Multi-hulls and PHRF rating less than 186 with hull displacement exceeding 4,000 lbs</i>
<i>Class "2"</i>	<i>PHRF rating 179 or less with hull displacement less than 4,000 lbs</i>
<i>Class "3"</i>	<i>PHRF rating 180 and above with flying sails</i>
<i>Class "4"</i>	<i>PHRF or Club rating with or without spinnaker</i>

All boats will be required to finish the race series within the class they started sailing. A boat may move from a slower rated class to a faster rated class in the subsequent series start. For distance racing, no class splits will be observed and all boats will be scored in one fleet.

7. Notices to Competitors

Notices to competitors shall be posted on the AYC Racing website. Be sure to check the website as changes may be made regarding Wednesday night and club distances races. Notices to competitors may also be made via email no later than 18:00 hrs one day prior to the race to racers who have registered their email address with the race committee. Notices may also appear on the AYC web site no later than 18:00 hrs one day prior to the race. Prior to the race start, the race committee will broadcast on **VHF channel 72** all race announcements before the first warning signal.

8. Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be flown from the flagpole in front of the AYC clubhouse. Warning signals for races postponed from shore will be sounded no sooner than one hour after the A.P. flag has been lowered ashore. We will RARELY signal from shore, and only in the case that all racers are already at the yacht club waiting for the weather.

9. Schedule of Races

The Race Schedule is posted on the AYC General Calendar and the Racing page at www.anacortesyachtclub.org

10. Marks

The marks used for buoy racing are described in this document, or alternate marks set by the race committee may be used. The use of alternate marks will be announced by the race committee prior to the first warning signal. The race committee reserves the right to modify or move these marks at any time.

11. Racing Areas and Courses

Buoy racing is conducted primarily in Fidalgo Bay using fixed government marks, inflatable marks and AYC permanent marks, subject to modification by the race committee on the water. Distance racing areas and courses are as described in this document. Pursuant to current state regulations, item 12 has been added this year.

12. Protection of Orcas

Washington Senate Bill (SB) 5371 states: “Operators of motorized, non-motorized (i.e. sailing vessels) and paddle vessels must stay 1,000 yards (approximately one-half nautical mile) away from “southern resident killer whales” (SRKW) in all directions. If the SRKW approaches within 400 yards of any

vessel, state law requires that the vessel disengages the transmission, luffs sails, or stops paddling (if it is safe to do so) until the animal(s) moves away.

Boaters who think they may be closer than 1,000 yards to SRKW, but not within 400 yards, should attempt to navigate out of the path and away from SRKW at a speed of 7 knots or less.”

If an orca is seen by the crew of a boat, the boat shall not enter the circular area within 1000 yards of the orca (therefore, that area is an obstruction.); and if the boat is within 400 yards of an orca, she shall, as soon as reasonably possible, luff (or, if motoring before or after racing, disengage her transmission) to slow to the slowest safest speed, which may be to stop, until they are no longer within 1000 yards of any orca.

- (a) AYC club races are conducted under the requirements of SB 5371
- (b) AYC racers shall regard these precautions for all orca whales; not just SRKW.
- (c) A boat may be subject to protest for willful disregard of these requirements.

Add to RRS Rule 32.1 (R/C Abandonment of Race)

- (e) if an individual orca or orca pod is found to be in, near, or approaching the race area.

Add to RRS Rule 61.4 (b): (Protests / Redress)

- 6) reasonable actions she took to comply with (SB 5371)

13. The Start

Except for the boats starting within a class fleet, boats shall not enter the starting zone defined as a box area 25 yards either side of the starting line extending 50 yards aft of the starting line after the first warning (5-minute) signal. The AYC Race Committee will use a “rolling start” sequence. Meaning the “Start” signal for a prior class, represents the “Warning” signal (5min) for the following class start.

Races shall be started per RRS 29 using the following sequence:

<i>Minutes before Start</i>	Visual Signal	Sound Signal	Meaning
5	<i>Hoist Starting Class Pendant</i>	<i>1-Horn</i>	Warning Signal
4	<i>Hoist "Prep" Flag</i>	<i>1-Horn</i>	Preparatory Signal

0	<i>Lower Class Pedant</i>	<i>1-Long Horn</i>	Start!

Individual Recall signals will be in accordance with RRS 29.1

General Recall shall be per RRS 29.2

The Race Committee may attempt to hail the sail numbers of the recalled boats. Failure to do so or failure to hear the hail will not constitute grounds for redress. There may be races where the boats shall start on GPS time without a race committee. On those occasions, skippers are asked to use their best judgement in the case that they might be over early at the start.

When a race boat acts as the start boat it may start anytime in the 10 minutes following the last start. The start boat must record their elapsed time from start to finish. For example, if you start within 3 minutes of the last start then proceed, or if you need the full 10 minutes to prepare then this is also allowed. The start boat may run its engine up to one minute before its own start.

14. Start/Finish Line Restrictions

Unless otherwise instructed by the Race Committee prior to the 1st warning, all boats shall regard the start and finish lines as closed. After completing the first leg of the course, a boat shall not cross the starting line. A boat shall not cross the finish line until she has completed her last leg of the course and finishes. A boat that breaks this rule shall not correct her error as per Rule 28.1. However, she will be exonerated if she takes a Two-Turns Penalty as per Rule 44.2. This changes Rule 28.1.

The start finish line (the boats or buoys that define it) ranks as an obstruction on upwind and downwind legs. Before finishing, boats may therefore leave the start finish line either to port or starboard. As an obstruction, Rules 19 and 20 may apply between boats as they approach and pass it.

Exceptions to this rule may be made by the race committee on the night of the race or hailing on **VHF channel 72**.

15.. Changes of Course after the Start

The race committee will announce any changes over **VHF channel 72**. Short course finish lines will be defined as follows:

- Twice around will be shortened too once around.
- A line 50 yards long and perpendicular to the line between the short course finish mark and the previous mark. Leave the Short Course mark to port unless otherwise instructed.

OR

- A line defined as a magnetic bearing to a mark of the course, to a navigation aid on a chart or to a prominent feature easily recognizable on land.

Shorten Course for Distance Races

All competitors for distance races are to **record** their time at “Short Course Finish” as well as finish time for full course if within the time limit. It is advisable to **report** both the Short Course and Full Course finish times to the Scorer after completing the race. Short Course Finish lines are described in the Sailing Instructions for each distance race. Results will be calculated using full course times unless no boats finish the full course within the time limit in which case results for all will be based on short course finish timesheet.

16. The Finish

Wednesday night races the Race Committee shall be on station to record finish times. However, each Skipper is responsible for recording their own finish times and furnishing it if requested to do so by the Scorer.

If the Race Committee is not on station at the time of finish, each boat is required to record and report its own finish time using a GPS or other Coordinated Universal Time (UTC) device. Finish times (or DNFs) for all other events should be turned in within hour (1) hour following the race time limit, but not later than 24 hours after finishing to be scored.

Reporting Your Score

Skippers will report their finish time by sending an SMS “text” message by cellular phone to Frank Parker, AYC Race Committee/Scorer, **(757) 718-9781**.

The text will include:

- Boat Name
- Time of Finish (24/Hr: Minutes: Seconds)
- Indicate Full Course or Short-Course.

Example:

BOAT NAME, 18:32:03, Full Course

17. Time Limit

The finish time limit for all distance races over 6 miles is 12 hours. The finish time limit for all other distance races (6 miles or less) and for Wednesday night buoy races is 2 hours after the start time of each class. The time limits are final. If a boat that starts but does not finish by the specified time limit as defined in this race packet or sailing instructions, it will be scored **DNF**.

If a boat performs the duties of the start boat for an event, she will have her finish time limit adjusted based on their actual start time so that her time limit is in equal duration to other competitors.

18. Protests and Withdrawing

Boats who wish to protest or withdraw shall inform the race committee upon finishing or withdrawing from the race. Written protests for buoy races must be given to the race committee within (1) one-hour after the last boat finishes the last race. Protests for distance races must be filed with the race committee no later than 2 hours after the time limit for that race. All protests must be in writing on the US Sailing official protest form. The identity of the protesting and the protested boats and the schedule of protest hearings will be posted on the AYC outside bulletin board by the conclusion of the time limit for filing.

It is the responsibility of all skippers to check the AYC outside bulletin board. Protests will be heard downstairs at AYC in as timely a manner as possible. Unless otherwise stated by the Race Committee's PRO (Principal Race Officer) protest committee hearings shall be closed to observers. Protesting and defendant Skippers and their witnesses are not allowed in the protest room until called upon; but shall make themselves available to the hearing until excused.

19. Race Scoring

All races will use low point scoring. The first boat to finish, per her corrected time, is awarded one point and one point will be added successively for each boat finishing behind. All boats counted in a series must start at least one race in that series.

- a. **Distance Races** - Distance races will be scored using the **time-on-distance** method as prescribed by PHRF Northwest with the course distance as listed in this document. A boat must start at least one race in that series to be counted. Time-on-distance is applied using the following formula:

$$\text{Elapsed Time} - (\text{PHRF} \times \text{Distance} \div 60) = \text{Corrected time}$$

- b. **Bouy Races and Wednesday Nights** – Bouy races and Wednesday Night races will be scored using the **time-on-time** method as prescribed by PHRF Northwest using the following formula: **$\text{TCF} = 650 / (520 + \text{PHRF})$** thus, **Corrected Time = TCF * Elapsed Time**

Note:

- PHRF is the boat's current PHRF Northwest rating.
 - TCF is the Time Correction Factor. When multiplied into the elapsed time, in minutes, it results in the Corrected Time for the boat's score.
- c. **Volunteering** – On Wednesday nights a boat who forgoes a race or withdraws early to perform volunteer duties such as bartending, cooking or race committee will receive a score of "0" for the night. Remember it's fun to volunteer!

d. Penalty Scoring - Penalty scoring will be applied by the Race Committee if a boat participating in a series does not start a race in the series, or if during a race the boat does not sail the course or does not finish or retires before finishing a race (except in the case of Volunteer duties mentioned above) shall be scored accordingly:

DNS - Did not start, will be awarded points according to the number of starters in that boat's class for that series + 1

NSC - Did not sail the course, will be awarded points according to the number of starters in that boat's class for that race +1

DNF - Did not finish, will be awarded points according to the number of starters in that boat's class for that race + 1

RET - Retired before finishing race, will be scored as DNF above

DSQ - Disqualified, will be awarded points according to the number of starters in that boat's class for that series + 2

Other provisions of RRS, Appendix A apply, except that Rule A9 of the RRS will not be in effect. Series scoring will have no score excluded.

20. Race Scoring

Results for Wednesday evening buoy races are typically presented at the evening meal following the race. All race results will be posted on the club website. Results will be scored using the Regatta Network program and will be immediately available on their website. All Series results will be tallied and presented at the end of the year Commodore's Awards Banquet.

21. End of Year Performance Criteria for Awards

As stated above all scoring will be based on the low scoring method. The performance criteria will be weighted by participation in all AYC and other North Sound Regional events.

DISTANCE RACE CHAMPION

Shall be decided by the boats participating in all nine club distance races within the distance race series. The lowest overall score will be the leader. Participation in any or all regional distance races shall be counted into the overall score. And placing in those events will be added to the overall total score average.

Total Score Average = (Numerator) DIVIDED BY Total # of Races Sailed = (Denominator) = Result for the season

Example: Two Boats are tied for 1st place at 40 points each. Boat 1 sailed only AYC distance races and is scored: **40 pts/9 races = 4.44** yet, Boat 2 also has 40 pts in AYC races but participated in two more regional distance race events and is scored **40 pts/11 races sailed = 3.63**. A boat that started a regional distance race but does not finish will get DNF for the race based on the total number of AYC boats that started that event but will get credit for sailing the race. All AYC boats will be placed in accordance with their Corrected Time on Distance elapsed time.

BOUY RACE CHAMPION

Similarly, to the distance racing scoring, the overall score total will be divided by the number of buoy races sailed. If the boat participates in additional regional buoy racing events that will weigh the score, and total number of races sailed. All AYC boats will be scored on their cumulative placement score divided by the number of races sailed.

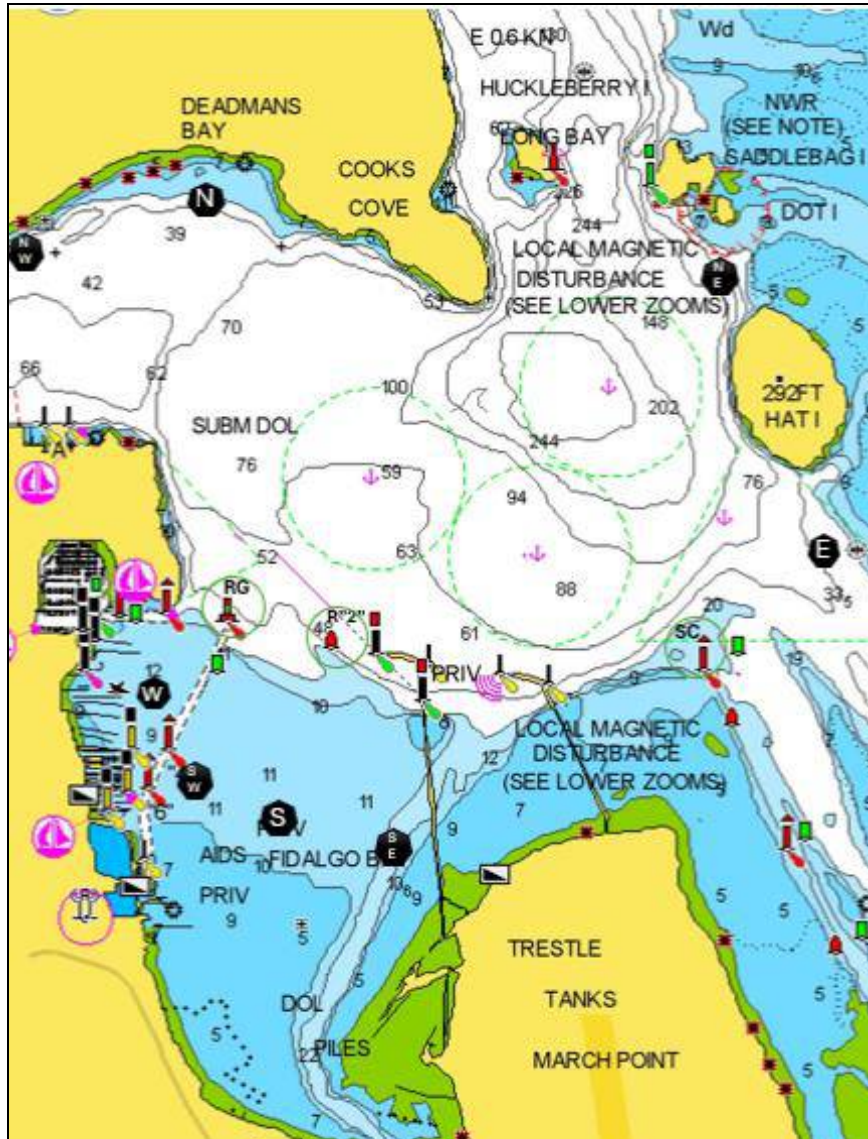
BOAT OF THE YEAR

AYC FIDALGO BAY MARKS & SIGNALS



-  Class 1 - white with red dot
-  Class 2 - blue with white dot
-  Class 3 - red, white, blue sections
-  Class 4 - red with white cross
-  L (Lima) "Come within hail" - approach the RC boat to check-in.
-  P (Papa) "Preparatory Signal" - It goes Up at 4 min. signal and Down at 1 min. signal
-  X(Xray) "Over Early" - at least one boat jumped the gun!
-  Code "AP" - "Postponement" - RC may postpone a race. Watch and Listen for further instructions

STARTING SEQUENCE

Starting Time - the time published in the Race Packet.

Start Time -10 Minutes: On VHF Ch.72 RC will announce the course for the evening, the starting order of each class, and any other notes or instructions.

Start Time- 5 Minutes: The Class pennant is raised for the class which will be starting in 5 minutes. A blast of the horn will accompany the raising of the pennant.

Start Time-4 Minutes: Code flag "P" (Papa) - the "Preparatory" flag is raised accompanied by a blast of the horn. From this time until you finish you are bound by the US Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

Starting Time-1 Minute: Code flag "P" (Papa) is lowered accompanied by a blast of the horn.

START! - The Class flag is lowered accompanied by a blast of the horn. If its your class this means "GO!" If you're the next class in sequence, this blast of the horn is your Start-5 minute signal, and you will see your class pennant raised.
