NOTICE OF RACE

4/15/25

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Life jacket and shoes are required for each sailor and shoes shall be worn while launching or retrieving your boat due to oyster shells.
- 1.3 All boats shall have sail numbers.
- 1.4 All boats shall give way to commercial traffic.
- 1.5 ICW 242 (across from the club) shall not be passed toward the western shore.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The event is open to one-design dinghy sailboats with sailors of all ages.
- 2.2 Invited classes include: Highlander, Melges 15, MC Scow, Lightning, SIOD, Y Flyer, Snipe, ILCA (Laser) 4,6 & 7, VX Evo, Flying Scot, Thistle, C420, JY15, Sunfish, Optimists and O'Pen Skiff. Additional dinghy classes are welcome. Three class boats are required to constitute a class and be able to start.
- 2.3 Junior age eligibility - skipper and crew may not reach the following birthdays in 2025:

3. **ENTRY:**

- 3.1 Eligible boats may enter by completing a registration for the regatta as well as reservations for all meals **ONLINE before the cutoff date/time of Saturday, June 28, 10:00 am, at: <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/29676>** or at byscnet.com (which will connect you to Regatta Network.).
- 3.2 If you know you are attending, we ask that you register **ASAP**. This makes it much easier to order trophies and meals. Thank you.
- 3.3 Meals are to be reserved and paid for with this online registration. Note: Meals will not be available for purchase at the regatta. Additional meals may be purchased by editing your online registration or by going to the Regatta Network online storefront.

4. **SHIRTS:**

- 4.1 T-shirts and other clothing are available for purchase at the Print Your Cause online store: [ORDER HERE](#). No shirts will be available for sale on site. The website store is open to all.

5. **REGISTRATON FEES:**

- 5.1 Adults \$75, Juniors \$45.
- 5.2 There is a discount of \$15 on the entry fee if the registration is received by the advance registration date of June 8, 2025. Early registration is encouraged.
- 5.3 Guests will become temporary members of BYSC upon registration.

6. **MEALS**

- 6.1 Continental breakfast will be provided on Saturday and Sunday.
- 6.2 Pre-packaged lunches will be available for \$12 each, RESERVED DURING ONLINE REGISTRATION.
- 6.3 Our ***“Famous Lowcountry Boil”*** will be served on Saturday night. Chicken is available for non-seafood diners. The adult fee is \$30, and for children (13 and under), the price is \$12. **RESERVATIONS NEED TO BE PREPAID ON THE REGATTA NETWORK REGISTRATION SITE.** Guests may make meal reservations at this link: [Meal Reservations](#). **NO ONSITE CASH TRANSACTIONS WILL TAKE PLACE.**

7. **SCHEDULE**

- 7.1 Friday, June 27, 2025.
 - 6:00 pm Commodore’s Welcome Reception.
- 7.2 Saturday, June 28, 2025.
 - 9:00 – 10:30 am. Pick up your welcome package in the clubhouse. Verify registration information and sail numbers.
 - 11:00 am. Competitor’s Meetings. These meetings will be conducted separately for each race circle. Further instructions upon arrival.
 - 11:15 am. Lunches are available to be picked up on the deck.
 - 12:30 - 1:00 pm. Warning for 1st races. See Sailing Instructions for Warning times on each course. Other races to follow.
 - 6:00 pm ‘til..... Social time. Dancing to the local band ***“Cluster Shucks”***
 - **7:00 pm. OUR FAMOUS LOWCOUNTRY BOIL IS BACK.**

7.3 Sunday, June 29, 2025.

- 9:00 am. Lunches can be picked up on the deck before or after the races.
- 10:30 am - 11:00 am. Warning for 1st race. See Sailing Instructions for warning times for each course—other races to follow.
- No warning signal will be given after 2:00 pm on Sunday.

8. **SCORING**

- 8.1 One race completed for each class will constitute a regatta.
- 8.2 A boat's event score shall be the total of all her race scores, excluding her worst score if six (6) races or more are sailed. This changes RRS A2.1.
- 8.3 A maximum of seven (7) races will be considered for the North and South Circles.
- 8.4 There is no maximum number of races for the Opti/O'Pen Skiff Circle.

9. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 9.1 Sailing Instructions will be available online no later than June 20, 2025, at the Registration check-in and on the Official Notice Board on the riverside porch.
- 9.2 Note that separate SI's exist for the North, South and Opti/O'Pen Skiff circles.
- 9.3 Upon publication of the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall prevail in any conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.

10. **COURSES.** There will be three race circles with the following possible classes:

- 10.1 North Circle: classes designated for this circle: ILCA, Sunfish, 420, JY15. Courses will be windward/leeward with downwind finishes unless changed by PRO.
- 10.2 South Circle: classes designated for this circle: Highlander, Melges 15, MC Scow, Lightning, Y Flyer, SIOD, Snipe, VX Evo, Flying Scot, Thistle. Courses will be windward/leeward with downwind finishes unless changed by the PRO.
- 10.3 Opti/O'Pen Skiff Circle: Courses will be trapezoid with mid-leg start and finish lines and short weather marks for Green Fleet Optis.
- 10.4 Additional classes will be assigned to appropriate circles as needed.
- 10.5 Courses will be described in more detail in the Sailing Instructions.
- 10.6 At the discretion of the PRO, classes may be combined for the start but scored separately.

11. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY.** Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See *RRS Rule 4. Decision to Race*. The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with, before, during, or after the regatta.

12. **AWARDS.** The number of awards in each class will be based on the pre-registration entries, but not less than (1) for three or more boats, (2) for five or more boats, and (3) for eight or more boats.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

13. RAMP LAUNCHING AND RETRIEVING FOR ROAD TRAILERS

- 13.1 Safe launching for road trailers is usually between 3 hours before or after high tide.
- 13.2 Launching from the jib boom on the dock is available after 9 am on Saturday, and 8 am on Sunday, and with advance notice on Friday. You will need to bring your lifting bridle.
- 13.3 Tides for Beaufort/BYSC
 - Friday: low tide is at 5:27pm and high tide is at 11:31 pm.
 - Saturday: High tide is at 12:26 pm, and low tide is at 6:16 pm.
 - Sunday High tide is 1:21 pm, and low tides are at 6:53 am and 7:05 pm.
 - Note: for those trailer launching, you should be able to launch late Sat morning, but retrieving will not only be difficult late on Sat afternoon due to the low tide, but the low tide on Sun morning may hinder your ability to make the warning at 10 am. We encourage you to dock or moor overnight.
- Other information.
 - Limited docking spaces will be available, so you may be required to raft up at the dock or designated moorings. Bring fenders and lines.
 - Power boats may be launched and retrieved from the Beaufort City Dock or Whitehall Landing at the end of Meridian Dr. Overnight docking will not be available for power boats unless they are mark boats.
 - Water shuttles will be available to service designated moorings or floats.
 - Dollies must be returned to their assigned parking area after launching due to tide and interference concerns.

14. COACH AND SPECTATOR BOATS

- 14.1 The PRO of the respective courses shall restrict Coach and spectator boats to certain areas.
- 14.2 Boat operators must register with the Motorboat Registration desk in the clubhouse, receive and fly the appropriate designation flag, and follow written guidelines.
- 14.3 All support and spectator vessels shall be equipped with a functioning engine safety cut-out switch (kill switch), which shall remain attached to the operator while the engine is running.
- 14.4 You are responsible for the safe operation of your boat, including installing a prop guard. Our insurance company highly recommends Prop guards and your insurance may not cover you if you have an incident that a prop guard could have prevented.
- 14.5 The BYSC ramp is reserved for competitors during pre and post race launching and retrieving. No interference will be tolerated.

15. VHF RADIOS

- 15.1 VHF radios are necessary for safety communication and other information from the Principal Race Officer (PRO). When flown, Code Flag V (red X on a white background) requires all regatta support boats and competitors (if they have a radio) to monitor their circle communication channel for further instructions. This is usually a safety issue.
- 15.2 Competitors on the South Circle (MCs, Highlanders, SIODs, Snipes, etc.) are specifically requested to have VHF radios.
- 15.3 VHF radios are required for all RC boats, coach boats, spectator boats, and other visitors on the water. Please monitor the signal boat channel on the circle you are following.
- 15.4 Except in an emergency, a competitor shall neither make radio transmission while racing nor receive radio communication unavailable to all boats. No other electronic devices are allowed.
- 15.5 VHF channels to be used will be detailed in the Sailing instructions.

16. CLUB AMENITIES.

- 16.1 The pool and tennis/pickleball courts are open to regatta guests during regular club hours.
- 16.2 Limited electrical hookups are available upon request. A bathhouse (with showers) is public near the pool.
- 16.3 **NO PETS ARE ALLOWED ON CLUB GROUNDS.**
- 16.4 Camping is available on club grounds, but please check with the general manager or his representative for preplanned camping locations.
- 16.5 Most hotel chains are represented in the Beaufort area.

17. DIRECTIONS TO BYSC.

- 17.1 From the north: follow Rt 21 south, follow Bus. 21 through downtown Beaufort and over the Wood's swing bridge. Take the first right onto Meridian Dr, across from the launch ramp. In approximately 1 mile, turn right onto Yacht Club Drive.
- 17.2 From the south: follow SC 170 over the Broad River Bridge, and in ¼ mile, turn right onto SC 128 at the Circle K. In two miles, turn right at the first stoplight onto Rt. 21. Go to the third stoplight with Hardees', CVS, and Advance Auto Parts on the corners. Turn right and proceed over the McTeer Bridge. In ½ mile, turn left onto Meridian Dr.; in approximately 1 mile, turn left onto Yacht Club Dr.
