Notice of Race

1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. The current *ECSA PHRF Regulations*, available at <https://ecsa.net/>.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1. The sailing instructions will be available no later than 1200 on Friday, July 18, 2025 at <https://RegattaNetwork.com/>.
- 2.2. Copies of the notice of race and sailing instructions will be available on the race committee boat on Saturday, July 19, 2025.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1. The online official notice board will be located at <https://RegattaNetwork.com/>.
- 3.2. All boats shall carry a VHF marine radio and a cellular phone.
- 3.3. On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF marine radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. The event is open to all boats with valid 2025 ECSA-PHRF certificates.
- 4.2. Spinnaker and Non-spinnaker PHRF classes will be offered given sufficient entries (minimum 3 entrants for spinnaker and 2 entrants for non-spinnaker). Further class assignments will be determined by the race committee based on ECSA-PHRF class designator and rating given sufficient entries.
- 4.3. Eligible boats may enter the event by registering online at <https://RegattaNetwork.com/>.
- 4.4. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees by 1700 on Thursday, July 17, 2025.
- 4.5. Late entries may be considered at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 4.6. Entrants are recommended to comply with the following *US Sailing Monohull Safety Equipment Requirements (SER)*:
 - 4.6.1 [Nearshore Category races](#)
 - 4.6.2 *Addition of: items 2.4.1 through 2.4.8 regarding lifelines, pulpits and toe rails of the [Coastal Category races](#).*
- 4.7. On boats that, BY DESIGN, do not meet the lifelines, pulpits, and toe-rails recommendations in 4.6.2 (e.g., Melges 24, Alerion 28) all crew members MUST wear Life Jackets at all times while racing.

5. FEES

- 5.1. Early Registration Discount: \$10 on or before June 30th 2025
- 5.2. Registration Fee: \$60
- 5.3. Post-race party: \$10 per person

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1. The scheduled time of the warning signal is 1000 on Saturday, July 19, 2025.

7. VENUE

- 7.1. The starting and finishing area will be in an area within 1 nm of Charles Island, Milford, CT.
- 7.2. The race will be in a general area between Norwalk, Port Jefferson, and Falkner Island.

8. COURSES

- 8.1. Courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions. Marks will be a combination of drop marks and/or government marks.
- 8.2. Distance of course will be 25 to 54 nm based on conditions, with the goal of all entrants being able to finish before sunset. Different classes may sail different courses.

9. SCORING

- 9.1. PHRF classes will be scored based on Time-On-Time calculation using $650 / (\text{PHRF} + 550)$ as the Time Correction Factor (TCF).

10. RISK STATEMENT

- 10.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

11. INSURANCE

- 11.1. Each participating boat shall hold insurance, including third party liability insurance, and it is the owner or owners' representative's sole and inescapable responsibility to ensure that the insurance is in place and is adequate prior to participating in this event.

12. PRIZES

- 12.1. Results will be posted at <https://RegattaNetwork.com/> as soon as possible following completion of racing.
- 12.2. The Windjammers Distance Race perpetual trophy will be awarded (name engraved & Photo op) to the winner of the spinnaker class at the post race party.
- 12.3. Prizes for the top boats in each class will be awarded at the Windjammers Sailing Club banquet at the end of the season.
- 12.4. This race is part of the Mid Sound Offshore Racing Championship (MSORC). See <https://windjammers.org/> for more details.
- 12.5. This race is part of the ECSA Offshore Circuit and qualifies for 2x scoring.
