**NOTICE OF RACE
POSTED July 7, 2025**

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. "The Texas Youth Racing Circuit Conditions" apply and are available on the web site at <http://www.txsail.org/> . A copy will also be available at the regatta site.
- 1.3. The rules for all classes are modified so that membership in a class organization is not required.
- 1.4. A competitor must notify the Race Committee (RC) of their intent to protest another boat, at the finish line, before talking to a coach or a parent. If this instruction is not followed, the protest will be found to be invalid. This is in addition to and modifies the requirements of class rules and RRS 60.1.
- 1.5. [DP] All boats shall have sail numbers which match the registration form. Sail numbers meeting class standards are required.
- 1.6. Appendix T, Arbitration, shall be used.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1. Boats may not display advertising for this regatta.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the Optimist, ILCA 4, 6, and 7, and Club 420 classes. All classes are "bring your own boat". A minimum of three boats is required to form a class.
- 3.2. The regatta is open to all junior sailors who are less than twenty (20) years old and who do not turn twenty (20) years of age during this calendar year.
- 3.3. Optimists are sailed in four (4) fleets:
 - Green Fleet: Open to all novice sailors under age 15 and through December 31 of the calendar year in which they turn age 15
 - White Fleet: Age 10 and under
 - Blue Fleet: Age 11 – 12
 - Red Fleet: Age 13 – 15
- 3.3.1. For Optimist White, Blue and Red fleets, the skipper's age on the first day of the regatta determines his or her fleet. Skippers move fleets on their 11th and 13th birthdays. Those turning 15 may continue in Red Fleet through December 31 of that year.

4. REGISTRATION AND CHECK IN

- 4.1.1. Pre-Registration is encouraged and may be completed online at [Regatta Network](#).
- 4.1.2. Registration for the regatta will end at 12:00 (noon) on Wednesday, July 23, before the regatta. Late registration may be accepted by the OA at their discretion; however, meals and/or regatta giveaways may not be available to late registrants.
- 4.1.3. All sailors are required to check in on-site, even if the sailor pre-registered, Registration and Check-in at the regatta will be conducted at the registration table on Saturday, July 26, 2025, between 0800 and 0900 at the Clubhouse.
- 4.1.4. Execution of a Liability Release Agreement as set forth in the Registration Form shall be required. Parents are urged to provide a signed Medical Consent Form to enable other adults to obtain emergency medical services in the event of the parents' unavailability during the regatta.



5. FEES

- 5.1. The entry fee is \$75.00 for each sailor, whether in single or doublehanded boats. The entry fee includes one regatta giveaway, lunch on Saturday, dinner after racing on Saturday, and lunch on Sunday. Please see the attached menu for dinner details. Meal tickets will be available for the Sunday Buffet for non-competitors for an extra charge of \$15.00.
- 5.2. Make all registration checks payable to CORPUS CHRISTI YACHT CLUB.

6. PRELIMINARY SCHEDULE (subject to change)

- 6.1. The schedule for the regatta is:

Friday, July 25

1200-2000 The Club will be open to allow unloading of boats.

Saturday, July 26

0800-0930 Breakfast Tacos

0800-0900 Check-in at the [Clubhouse]

0915 Competitors' Meeting at the [Clubhouse] (Attendance Mandatory)

1030 Warning Signal for the first race, additional races to follow

Between Races Lunch will be served [on the water/at the Clubhouse]

Sunday, July 27

0800-0900 Breakfast

1000 Warning Signal for the first race, additional races to follow

1330 Final warning for races

1400 Dinner Buffet open through awards ceremony

- 6.2. Ten (10) or more races are scheduled.
6.3. No initial warning signal for a race will be given after 1330 on Sunday.
6.4. Attendance at the Skippers' Meeting held at 0915 on Saturday of the regatta at the [Clubhouse] is mandatory.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1. A link to the event site for Sailing Instructions will be provided online at the Regatta Network registration site, the TSA Website (<http://www.tx sail.org/>) and posted on the Notice Board.

8. VENUE

- 8.1. Races will be conducted on the waters of Corpus Christi Bay and inside the outer breakwater of Corpus Christi Marina.

9. COURSES

- 9.1. Courses will be described in detail in the Sailing Instructions and may include windward/leeward, triangle, box, or Olympic-style courses.

10. SCORING

- 10.1. The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply with the following changes:
10.1.1. One (1) completed race is required to constitute a regatta.
10.1.2. When five (5) to nine (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
10.1.3. When ten (10) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two (2) worst scores.

11. SAFETY

- 11.1. [DP] RRS 40.1 is in effect so that each competitor shall wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved life jacket (PFD), in good condition, that is 100% dependent on foam for flotation (i.e., inherently buoyant) and the appropriate size for the sailor, at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while adding or removing clothing. A violation of this instruction may be protested by race officials or a competitor; however, an inadvertent and momentary breach of this instruction may receive a penalty less than disqualification at the discretion of the protest committee. A pinnie may be worn outside of the PFD.
11.2. Support Persons' boats (including coaches and parents) (support boats) shall have a working VHF radio and monitor the RC channel.
11.3. [DP] All Support Persons operating a boat must employ a safety kill-switch lanyard as required by Texas state law, especially when in the proximity of and approaching sailors in and on the water. If a Support Person's boat is required to use a kill switch and is not equipped with, or is not using, a kill switch, the Support Person may be subject to protest.

12. RISK STATEMENT, DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY, & PERSONAL CONDUCT

- 12.1. An adult (parent, guardian or designated adult) is responsible for the safety of their sailor. It is the responsibility of this adult to decide if the sailor should sail in the weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event. The adults supervising the competitors are ultimately responsible for the risks.
See RRS 3 (Decision to Race). The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or

- death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after this event.
- 12.2. The designated adult shall accept full responsibility for all actions of the competitor during any activity related to the event. This includes on-shore activities before, during, and after the regatta.

13. MISCONDUCT AND PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

- 13.1. All competitors and support persons (including coaches and parents) are expected to maintain the highest levels of conduct throughout the entire event until such time as they leave for home or the airport. Enforcement of discipline and conduct shall be conducted as per RRS 69 and/or the policies and procedures of US Sailing (Regulation 15.01).
- 13.2. Prohibited Substances
- 13.2.1. Per US Sailing Regulation 10.03 B and 10.03 C, for Junior and Youth events or for junior or youth competitors in any Texas Sailing Association Junior event, no participant or competitor shall use or possess, either on or off the water: 1. Marijuana or any other substance if possession is illegal under state or federal law; 2. Any alcoholic beverages. This regulation is in effect from date and time of arrival through date and time of departure from the locale.
- 13.2.2. An alleged breach of one of these regulations shall not be grounds for a protest. This changes RRS 60.1. If a competitor is found to have breached one of these elements, they shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practicable, be removed from the regatta venue and sent home. When a competitor withdraws from part of an event due to a violation of any section of NOR 13, the scores of all completed races shall stand for the purposes of determining the seeding or subsequent rounds or stages in the event. However, that competitor's boat/team will no longer be eligible to compete in the event, shall be removed from the final event scores, and each boat/team with a worse finishing place in the event shall be moved up one place.
- 13.3. Hearings related to NOR 13 will be held in accordance with the recommendations of Appendix M6 of the RRS. The officers for hearing a violation will consist of the Chief Judge, acting as chairman of the hearing, the Protest Committee and a Chairperson of the Texas Sailing Association Youth Circuit or his or her designee in the event he or she is not present. The regatta chair shall serve ex officio as a nonvoting member of the panel and will have an open right to express his or her views during the hearing process.

14. PRIZES

- 14.1. Trophy presentations will be held on Sunday afternoon approximately one hour after the last race or when protest hearing(s) are completed.
