

Sailing Instructions of the 2025 National Inland20 Scow Sailing Association Championship Regatta Chautauqua Lake Yacht Club

Lakewood, NY

The notation '[DP]' in a rule means at the discretion of the protest committee, the penalty for breaking this rule may be more or less than a single disqualification.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* and the <u>scantling rules</u> of the National Inland20 Scow Sailing Association. Crew and or number of crew can change from race to race.
- 1.2 Flotation panels as described in Scantling are to be used while racing.
- 1.3 Rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-turns Penalty is replaced by the One-turn Penalty.
- 1.4 The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply. If 6 or more races are completed there will be a throw out.
- 1.5 Appendix T applies as modified in SI 15.

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted no later than 0800 on the day it takes effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it takes effect.

3 NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official noticeboard located between the Race room and ladies locker room
- 3.2 Notices to competitors may also be posted on the event website page on RegattaNetwork.com, where time and wifi allow.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed by the race committee signal vessel when moored at the CLYC Dock and/or on the CLYC flagpole.
- 4.2 When code flag "AP" is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in the Race Signals AP.
- 4.3 Approximately one hour prior to the scheduled warning signal of the first race of the day, the race committee will fire a gun or make another sound signal.

5 COMPETITORS' BRIEFING MEETING AND SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 The competitors' briefing will be at approximately 1200 Friday. Harbor Gun or other audible signal ashore will be 1215.
- 5.2 Six races are scheduled, of which one must be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 5.3 Friday: The Warning Signal for the first race Friday, will be at 1:15pm. Except when races are sailed back-to-back, the approximate time of the warning signal for subsequent races will be posted and/or announced on the competitors' radio channel (VHF 73).
- 5.4 Saturday: Harbor Gun 9:45am with Race Warning signal 10:45am. Two races will be held back-to-back then lunch. A determination will be made before Harbor Gun if lunch will be eaten on the water or at shore. Racing will resume after lunch with the aim to complete three or four races by end of day.
- 5.5 Sunday: Harbor Gun 9am with first warning signal at 10am. No race will start after noon on Sunday.

6 CLASS FLAG

The class flag will be the I20 flag.

7 RACING AREA

The racing area will be the navigable waters of the Southern Basin of Chautauqua Lake. See Appendix #2 Race Location on Chautauqua Lake

8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 All courses will be Windward-Leeward courses. All windward marks will have an offset mark. Races may finish downwind. Leeward gates will be used.
- 8.2 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat will display the number of windward legs to be sailed. A windward finish will be indicated by the course "WA." A leeward finish will be indicated by the course "LA"
- 8.3 When there is a gate, boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark. If only one mark of the gate is present, it should be rounded, leaving it to port.
- 8.4 Courses may be shorter than the minimums required in class.

9 MARKS

- 9.1 Mars color and shape will be announced at the competitors meeting. The offset mark will be an orange ball and Start/Finish will be a yellow ball.
- 9.2 After the start, minor adjustments in a mark's location will not be signaled. This changes to RRS 33.

10 THE START

- 10.1 Races will be started by using RRS 26.
- 10.2 The starting line will be:
- 10.2.1 Between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal vessel and a yellow ball.
- 10.3 A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 10.4 Boats will start under RRS, 30.1, the I flag. At the discretion of the PRO, RRS 30.2, 30.3 or 30.4 may be used. If the flag Z, U or Black is displayed, it will be used as the Preparatory Signal. This changes Race Signals.
- 10.5 Following the display of Code Flag "X", every effort will be made, as quickly and clearly as possible, to hail by VHF radio or otherwise a complete list of boats identified on the course side at the start or needing to comply with RRS 30.1. A boat's actions after the start will not change this list (your number may be called,

even if you are already clear). This changes to RRS 41. Such announcements are a courtesy and failure by the RC to make the announcement, or of boats to hear and/or understand it, shall not constitute grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 11.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will either move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position, or the RC will lay a new mark and remove the original mark as soon as practicable.
- 11.2 The RC may adjust gate marks without further signaling to maintain the appropriate course configuration.
- 11.3 The course changes to less than 5 degrees and/or 10% leg length, made before any boat begins the leg, may not be signaled. This adds to RRS 33.

12 THE FINISH

- 12.1 The finish line will be between:
- 12.1.1 A staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee vessel and the course side of a nearby yellow tetrahedron mark or
- 12.1.2 A staff displaying a orange flag on a race committee vessel and a staff displaying a orange flag on another race committee vessel.
- 12.2 Flag "A" displayed on the race committee vessel with no sound while boats are finishing means 'No more racing today.'
- 12.3 Flag "H" displayed on the race committee vessel with no sound while boats are finishing means 'Racing will continue after a break either on shore.'
- 12.4 When neither Flag "A" nor Flag "H" is flying on the race committee vessel while boats are finishing, another race will follow.

13 PENALTIES

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

14 TIME LIMIT

- 14.1 The time limit will be 90 minutes for any race.
- 14.2 Boats still racing 25 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired), the position of the last boat that complies with RRS 28 to finish plus two without hearing. This changes to RRS 35, A4.2, and A10.
- 14.3 On Sunday, the last day of racing, no races will start after 12noon.

15 PROTEST AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 15.1 A boat intending to protest or request redress about an incident that occurs in the racing area is requested to notify the race committee finish vessel on station of her intention, including the sail number of any boat(s) being protested.
- 15.2 Hearing requests shall be filed on the notice board.
- 15.3 The protest time limit is one hour after the last boat finishes the last race of the day, or one hour after no more racing today is signaled, whichever is later.
- 15.4 Notices will be posted on the online notice board no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties. Hearings will be held at a location at Regatta Headquarters.
- 15.5 Notices of protests by the race committee, technical committee or protest committee will be posted to the online notice board within the protest time limit to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 15.6 Appendix T Arbitration applies. T1(b) Is changed to, Post-Race Penalty is a 30% Scoring Penalty calculated

as stated in rule 44.3(c) or 50% of the places between the boat's finishing position and the number of entries, whichever is less. However, rule 44.1(a) applies. This changes RRS T1(b).

16 SCORING

16.1 The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply. If 6 or more races are completed there will be a throw out.

17 SAFETY

- 17.1 Boats are required to always sail with masthead flotation panels while afloat. Failure to do so will result in being scored DSQ without hearing. This changes to RRS 63.1.
- 17.2 A boat that retires shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

18 EQUIPMENT & MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time in compliance with the class rules, notice of race and sailing instructions.

19 MEDIA RIGHTS

Competitors give absolute rights and permission for video footage or photographs of themselves, or their boat generated during the event to be published in any media for press, editorial or advertising purposes.

20 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 20.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not freely available to all boats or medically necessary. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 20.2 The Competitors' channel is VHF 73.


21 CODE OF CONDUCT

[DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from a race official.


22 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY
