1 Scope

- 1.1 This NOR applies to Sarasota Sailing Squadron Club Regattas and is posted to each event's Regatta Network site. Any amendments will be posted to an event's Regatta Network site.

2 Rules

- 2.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing and by US Sailing and the appropriate class rules except as noted and changed by the Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2 Appendix V1 "Alternative Penalties, Post Race Penalty at the Time of an Incident" is in effect.

3 Sailing Instructions

- 3.1 The sailing instructions will be posted to the Regatta Network website listed at the bottom of the NOR per the schedule below.

4 Communication

- 4.1 The online official notice board is the Regatta Network event site for each Regatta per the table:

- 4.2 The unofficial noticeboard is located at (SSS) board located near the office.
- 4.3 Every effort will be made to ensure all SIs and notices are posted on the unofficial noticeboard.

- 4.4 While racing, except in an emergency, competitors shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 4.5 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.

5 Eligibility and Entry

- 5.1 This event is open to Dinghy and PHRF boats including but not limited to:

- PHRF Course Classes
 - Multihull
 - E Scow
 - Monohull
 - ~~Viper~~
- Dinghy Course Classes
 - Sunfish
 - ILCA 4, 6 & 7
 - Melges 15
 - Flying Scott
 - ~~Viper~~
 - American 18
 - Hobie Waves
 - Boatshare Boats

- 5.2 See PHRF Specifics section for details related to PHRF Eligibility and Entry
- 5.3 E Scows will race on the PHRF Race Area
- 5.4 A minimum of 3 entries per class is required for a class to have a separate start
- 5.5 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees

6 Fees

- 6.1 Standard Registration: ~~\$15~~ \$10
- 6.2 Late Fee registration per schedule below: \$25
- 6.3 Please register early to help with course management
- 6.4 There will be no refunds

7 Schedule

- 7.1 For Day of Racing class specific schedules see the sections “Dinghy Classes Specifics” and “PHRF Classes Specifics”. E Scows are included in the PHRF Race Area and Schedule.
- 7.2 No warning signal will be made after 1530
- 7.3 Awards under the Pavilion during the post racing social. Information will be provided separate from this document. Invite your family and friends to join us for the social.

8 Registration

- 8.1 Registration opens when the Regatta Network site is live. The goal is to have all the event Regatta Network Sites live by September 30, 2025.
- 8.2 The following table outlines when the Standard Fee ends, and the Late Fee starts for each event.

9 Venue

- 9.1 Racing will be in Sarasota Bay north of the Sarasota Sailing Squadron

10 Series Scoring

- 10.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores
- 10.3 Trident and Spring Blossom Series Scoring
 - 10.3.1 The Trident Series is comprised of the Great Pumpkin, the Drumstick and the Commodores' Cup regattas.
 - 10.3.2 The Spring Blossom Series is comprised of the Snowbird, the Cherry Pie and the Pot O' Gold regattas.
 - 10.3.3 For a fleet to qualify for the series, there must be at least 3 boats registered from the fleet for each club regatta in the series. The 3-boat minimum is waived for the fleet which is responsible for running the regatta.
 - 10.3.4 Winner of the series for each qualifying fleet is determined by the low point scoring, totaling all of her scores, with no throw-outs. Only first place will be awarded.
 - 10.3.5 RC volunteers from the fleet responsible to run the regatta will be scored the average of all their other scores in the series for the races they serve on the RC.

11 Dinghy Course Classes Specifics

- 11.1 DINGHY - SAFETY

- 11.1.1 Except for the Flying Scot class, RRS 40.1 “Personal Flotation Device” shall apply at all times. Each competitor shall wear a personal flotation device except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices.

- 11.3.1 Dinghy Classes will race in their own race area.

12 PHRF Course Classes Specifics

12.1 PHRF - ELIGABILITY AND ENTRY

12.1.1 To be scored PHRF boats shall hold a current valid WFPHRF certificate

12.1.2 Cruiser & Pocket-Cruiser Class Spinnakers

12.1.2.1 Cruising Class vessels are permitted to employ cruising spinnakers resulting in a reduction in the non-spinnaker offset as noted in Appendix E – Cruising Class Rules. Your certificate must show your actual Cruising Spinnaker RLC rating. If your certificate states “Can’t Use” for Cruising Spinnaker, then you haven’t submitted the additional information to the West Florida PHRF rater and will not be able to use it.

12.1.2.2 The cruising spinnaker declaration must be made upon entry but may be amended per the schedule instructions below.

12.1.3 Non-Spinnaker & Spinnaker Classes

12.1.3.1 Competitors intending to fly spinnaker shall indicate that by registering with their WFPHRF Spinnaker rating. Registrations submitted without any rating specified will be scored with their WFPHRF Non-Spinnaker rating.

12.2 PHRF - THE START

12.2.1 The race for all PHRF fleets will be a fleet start.

12.2.2 OCS PHRF boats shall restart by rounding either end of the starting line – no dip restarts allowed.

12.2.3 The intent is to start the classes in the following order: Multihull, E Scow and Monohull

12.3 PHRF - CLASS SCHEDULE

12.3.1 The table reflects the timeline for the first start when multiple PHRF classes compete separately.

12.3.2 The PRO may start classes in combined starts with the first warning signal at 1250. Please pay attention to class flags on the RC boat for directions on which classes are starting when.

12.3.3 The intent is to start the classes in the following order: Multihull, E Scow, Monohull and Vipers

12.3.4 E Scow and Viper classes may have additional races.

PHRF - COURSES

- 12.3.5 Course Information shall be posted on a course board on the Starboard side of the Singal Boat
- 12.3.6 Courses may include the following marks: Sarasota Sailing Squadron compass-rose marks, Sarasota Bay government marks and/or inflatable marks. See Addendum A - Compass Rose
- 12.3.7 E Scows and Vipers may have a windward leeward course.

13 Risk Statement

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes**

- 14.1 Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 finishers for each class
